Their wide receiver lineup, featuring talents such as Brian Thomas Jr. and A.J. Brown, could be a silver lining, yet the overreach on C.J. Stroud and the questionable selection of Tyler Shough have hampered the team's draft value and flexibility. Even with the stack bonus from having both Lamar Jackson and Mark Andrews, plus Zay Flowers,

safety120 appears poised for another challenging season. As they look to navigate the competitive landscape, optimism seems scarce, leaving fans bracing for what could be a long, frustrating campaign.

The 2025 season holds promise, but challenges remain as they aim to climb the ranks.
