Green Lantern finished 66th percentile last season and somehow managed to draft downward from there. The headline problem is not the players themselves, several of whom are genuinely good, but what the manager paid to get them. Jaydon Blue, projected RB70, was taken nearly seven full rounds before his ADP. J.K. Dobbins, projected RB36, cost a pick more than four rounds early. Jonathon Brooks came off the board three-plus rounds ahead of schedule. In a draft where every round of overpayment is a round you cannot spend on someone else, Green Lantern burned those rounds on players who, at their projections, do not crack the top ten starters on this very roster. The result is a team that lands dead last in the division and in the first percentile of the entire field, which is not bad luck or a condensed positional market, it is the ledger of a manager who fell in love with players

and ignored what they cost. When your weakest projected starter is Blake Corum at RB35, the floor was always going to be low. Paying to dig it deeper is the part that stings.

Puka Shells won 72 percent of their matchups last year and scored in the 95th percentile, which makes their current projection, sitting 11th in the division and around the 30th percentile of the field, feel less like a regression and more like a different team wearing the same jersey. The core pieces that survive from that era, Puka Nacua as a projected WR1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, are legitimate, but the draft that built around them leaned heavily on reaches, including Rashee Rice taken 1.3 rounds before his ADP and D'Andre Swift pulled nearly a round and a half early, suggesting the manager was chasing last year's confidence rather than this year's value. The back end of the roster compounds the concern: the weakest projected starter is RJ Harvey at RB28, and the depth behind him includes Alvin Kamara at RB50 and Kimani Vidal at RB60, the latter a three-round reach. Nacua and Barkley are real. Everything built around them reads like a tribute to a season that no longer exists.

Super Power Playmakers did almost everything right on draft day. Fifteen chalk picks, a steal in Denzel Boston at WR58 who tumbled nearly three and a half rounds past his ADP, two clean stacks pairing Dak Prescott with George Pickens and Jared Goff with Jameson Williams, and barely a reach in sight. The process was disciplined. The result still lands them 10th in the Super Mario Bros. 3 division and in the 34th percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes you stare at a draft board for a long time looking for the crime you committed and finding nothing. The top of the roster is real, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Pickens at WR10 give this team a legitimate ceiling, but projected starters like Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 quietly drag the floor down to a level the draft-day discipline cannot fully cover. After a strong 2025 at the 81st percentile in scoring, this team built a careful, sensible roster and still came up short on paper.

Cools Kart Crew drafted with discipline and still landed in a bad neighborhood, sitting ninth in the Super Mario Bros. 3 division and projected at just the 40th percentile of the field. The process was genuinely sound: fourteen chalk picks, two legitimate steals, and not a single major reach across the entire board. Caleb Williams fell two full rounds past his ADP and landed at pick 5.07, a clean win. CeeDee Lamb and Nico Collins arrived slightly ahead of schedule but well within reason. And yet here we are. The top of this roster is real, Lamb at WR5 and Collins at WR9 give this team a legitimate ceiling, but the depth fades fast and C.J. Stroud, projected as a QB22, is the weakest projected starter on the sheet. You can do almost everything right in a draft and still build a machine that only runs on days when the stars align. For Cools Kart Crew, the stars had better align often.

McBrideacus Giganticus finished in the 85th percentile last season, and whoever is running this team in 2026 is clearly betting that lightning strikes the same place twice. It won't. The gap between last year's scoring floor and this year's projection is sitting at the 50th percentile, a drop steep enough to suggest this roster was rebuilt more by habit than by plan. The tight end group is genuinely elite, anchored by Trey McBride at TE2 and Colston Loveland at TE3, but the draft capital spent locking in that depth tells the real story: Darnell Washington and Michael Mayer were both taken more than four rounds ahead of their respective ADPs, burning late-round equity on players ranked TE38 and TE39. Meanwhile, the quarterback situation tops out at Baker Mayfield as QB18, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 is doing a lot of heavy lifting as the clearest non-tight-end weapon on the roster. Division rank of eighth is where the projection lands, and this team's 2025 reputation is not going to negotiate its way out of that.

The 1-UP's finished 2026 in the 53rd percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of a perfectly average cup of coffee: it does the job, nobody talks about it. The receiver corps is legitimately dangerous, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) anchoring a group that also includes Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Zay Flowers (WR16), and that firepower is exactly why this team is not a pushover. The problem is that the margins cut both ways. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) and Patrick Mahomes (QB12) give the manager real flexibility at the position, but the supporting cast thins out quickly, and the weakest projected starter, Chuba Hubbard (RB29), was taken at a discount for a reason. The draft was overwhelmingly chalk, 15 of those picks arriving right on schedule, which means there is not much hidden upside baked into this roster waiting to emerge. What you see is largely what you get, and what you get lands this team seventh in the Super Mario Bros. 3 division. Close games, decided late, will define the season.

WoRP Whistle finished in the 98th percentile last season and enters 2026 sitting at 53rd, which is the fantasy equivalent of a band that used to sell out arenas now playing respectable mid-sized venues. The margins really do decide this one. Brock Bowers at TE1 and James Cook at RB5 give the roster a genuine top-end anchor, and if Garrett Wilson and Davante Adams hit their WR17 and WR25 projections, this lineup can hang with anyone on a given week. The problem is the edges. Kyler Murray, projected QB19, arrives in Minnesota carrying a lisfranc that reportedly never fully healed, clinging to a starting job that is "his to lose" against JJ McCarthy, which is a sentence that should make any manager nervous. Two major reaches, MarShawn Lloyd and Keenan Allen, represent draft capital spent on hope rather than production. WoRP Whistle is not a bottom-feeder and not a contender. It is exactly the kind of team that goes 8-8 and spends September watching injury news with white knuckles.

Last year's CMC Hammer Suit finished in the bottom 10 percent of the field in scoring, a number that stings no matter how you dress it up. The 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. Christian McCaffrey anchors the whole operation at RB3, and Ashton Jeanty slots in beside him at RB7, giving this team a ground game that can carry a week on its own. Drake Maye projects as a QB2 and was grabbed past his ADP, one of five values the manager extracted from this draft, which is the kind of quiet draft-room discipline that separates rebound seasons from repeat disasters. The wild card is Malik Nabers, who dropped as low as WR21 in July after a concerning offseason following his torn ACL, then showed up to training camp looking like himself again. If Nabers returns to his WR12 projection and stays healthy, this roster climbs well above its current 66th-percentile standing. The pieces for a genuine turnaround are here. Now they just have to hold together.

Bed Bath and Bijan didn't chase fireworks in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft, and the roster is better for it. The headliner is Bijan Robinson at RB2, a legitimate anchor, but the more telling story is how consistently this team came out ahead on value. Jalen Hurts slipped nearly three full rounds past his ADP before manager grabbed him at pick 6.11, and a QB9 at that price is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafts from great ones. Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Bucky Irving at RB21 give the backfield real depth behind Robinson, and Tyler Warren landing at TE4 as a minor reach at 2.11 still looks like a fine price for a top-five tight end. The WR group projects as the thinnest part of the roster, with Tee Higgins leading the way at WR19, but in a positionless format the strength elsewhere absorbs that. Third in the division and 68th percentile in the field, this team isn't built on one flashy swing. It's built on a draft that kept winning small.

kaseypoker did not build this roster on a single lottery ticket. The approach was quieter and more reliable than that, a steady accumulation of edges that compounded across 18 rounds. The clearest example sits at QB: Lamar Jackson, projected QB3, slipped nearly a full round past his ADP, and Matthew Stafford, projected QB14, fell almost three full rounds before kaseypoker scooped him in round nine. That is not luck, that is patience paying off twice at the same position. The running back group anchors everything, with Jahmyr Gibbs projected as the RB1 and Javonte Williams right behind him at RB17, the latter a reach but one kaseypoker made with conviction. A.J. Brown ties the receiving corps together as a projected WR8 now paired with Drake Maye in New England, a combination that gives Brown a genuine shot at recapturing his best work if he can stay healthy. Sitting 68th percentile in the field and fourth in the Super Mario Bros. 3 division, this team did not make headlines on draft day. It just kept winning small.

There are drafts that make you wince and drafts that make you nod, and mjsocha's 2026 build is firmly in the second category. The foundation is obvious: Joe Burrow at QB4 paired with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the kind of stack that skews a whole roster's ceiling upward, and the rest of the board was filled with the quiet discipline that separates good managers from lucky ones. Justin Herbert at QB8 was taken nearly a full round after his ADP. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 and Josh Downs at WR46 each slipped past their marks by over a round. Oronde Gadsden at TE16 arrived late too. Five values landed without a single major reach, and the two minor ones, Jonah Coleman and Nicholas Singleton, were modest early bets on upside rather than panic picks. The 2025 résumé, a 100th-percentile scoring finish, suggests this is not a fluke operator. Sitting second in the Super Mario Bros. 3 division and in the 80th percentile of the field, mjsocha came in with a plan and executed it almost flawlessly.

guyzies enters 2026 sitting first in the Super Mario Bros. 3 division and in the 94th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains why: five values, one outright steal, and only two major reaches across the entire board. That is not a team built on one flashy gamble paying off. The foundation starts with Josh Allen, a QB1 projection who somehow slipped to pick 1.09 despite an ADP of 1.05, and Jayden Daniels, a QB5 who fell nearly a full round to 3.09. Pair those with Tucker Kraft landing at 6.04 when his ADP sat closer to the fourth round, and guyzies was consistently collecting players at prices below market rate. The reaches at the backend, Kaytron Allen and Tory Horton, come late enough in the draft that the downside is minimal while the upside is real. Xavier Worthy projects as the weakest starter at WR49, but when your QB room looks like that and your values are stacked this deep, Worthy is a luxury problem. This roster did not get lucky once. It just kept winning the negotiation.
