snagging Javonte Williams at a relative bargain, baffling early picks like Jared Goff and C.J. Stroud cast long shadows over the team's prospects. In a division where they've sunk to the depths of the standings, pinning their hopes on unlikely heroics from Isaiah Likely at tight end, VanderCat3 trudges into the season with a weary sense of déjà vu, yearning for a renaissance that seems just beyond reach.




