Big Mommy Drix drafted like someone who confused urgency with wisdom, and the board has the receipts. George Pickens at WR10 sounds fine until you notice he was taken 1.2 rounds before anyone else was even thinking about him, and Brock Purdy, a QB13, somehow consumed a third-round pick, nearly two full rounds ahead of his ADP. That is not value hunting, that is panic buying. The reach count tells the full story: seven major reaches against zero steals, a draft profile that reads less like a strategy and more like a series of anxious overcorrections. Nico Collins projects as a strong WR9 and Rashee Rice as a WR13, so there is real talent here, but the cost of acquiring it was so inflated that the roster around them is populated by the likes of Rico Dowdle, the projected weakest starter, and Malik Willis, a QB24 who somehow cost a sixth-round pick. Last year's 31 percent win rate apparently taught nothing. The King Boo division ranking of 12th feels less like a prediction and more like a verdict.

Washutiger did almost everything right on draft day. Thirteen chalk picks, three values, one outright steal in RJ Harvey sliding to pick 12.11 despite projecting as RB28, and the discipline to let Kenyon Sadiq and Eli Stowers fall past their ADPs rather than chase them. The problem is that drafting correctly and drafting well are not the same thing, and this roster is proof. The two major reaches, Chris Olave at WR11 and Brenton Strange at TE17, consumed real draft capital before it was necessary, and Olave in particular was taken nearly a full round early at pick 2.11, a price that assumes upside this projection does not reward. Wan'Dale Robinson adds depth, but his move to Tennessee puts him in a target battle with a fourth overall pick in Carnell Tate and under a new offensive identity, which is a lot of uncertainty for a WR47. The result is a team sitting 11th in King Boo division and in the bottom 10 percent of the field, disciplined enough to know the rules and unlucky enough to lose anyway.

There is no charitable read available for MChapeton in 2026, and the draft sheet confirms it. The 1.01 pick went to Jaxon Smith-Njigba, a WR3 projection that is defensible on paper, but the board started bleeding out immediately after. Zay Flowers, a WR16, was pulled at 3.01 against an ADP of 4.06, an early reach that would be forgivable if the surrounding picks showed restraint. They did not. Six minor reaches and two major ones litter this roster, including the genuinely baffling selection of Jaylin Noel, a WR83 projection taken more than four rounds ahead of schedule. The result is a team sitting 10th in the King Boo division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, propped up by Smith-Njigba at the top and not a great deal else worth trusting below him. MChapeton came into this draft with the first overall pick and an open runway, and somehow managed to make it feel like a punishment.

The King Boo division is not going to be kind to jockitch16 in 2026, and the roster sitting at 32nd percentile in the field tells you most of what you need to know. The stars are real: CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) give this team a ceiling that few managers can match, and Tyler Warren (TE4) adds genuine upside at a position where most of the field is scraping. But below that tier, the floor drops fast. Rhamondre Stevenson projects as the weakest projected starter at RB31, and the quarterback situation offers little comfort. Bo Nix grades out as QB15, and Jordan Love, for all his real-life polish, has never cracked the top 10 in fantasy scoring the last two years and plays behind a receiving room that still lacks an alpha. The draft did not create much cushion either, with five minor reaches and a major reach on Darnell Washington working against the kind of value accumulation a team in this position desperately needs. Lamb and Jefferson can carry a lot, but they cannot carry everything.

CraigMachine77 drafted with real discipline, waiting out the board and collecting value almost everywhere. Javonte Williams at RB17 fell a full round past his ADP. Jake Ferguson at TE12 slipped similarly. Zach Charbonnet at RB42 tumbled more than three rounds before this team grabbed him. By conventional draft-grade logic, this is a well-constructed roster. And yet the projected finish sits at 43rd percentile and eighth in King Boo division, which is the part where the discipline stops feeling like a virtue. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, A.J. Brown at WR8, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 all projected starters. That is a real asset. But value only matters if the players you acquired at a discount are actually good, and a running back corps where Williams leads the group at RB17 is not carrying anyone anywhere. CraigMachine77 won every small negotiation with the draft board and still built a team projected to finish below average, which is less a draft failure than a sobering reminder that a good deal on a mediocre product is still a mediocre product.

The Devastaters sit at 46th percentile and seventh in the King Boo division, which is exactly where a roster like this belongs: talented enough to beat anyone on a given week, thin enough at the margins to lose to almost anyone too. The top end is genuinely good. Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Breece Hall at RB14 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in this field would envy, and Lamar Jackson at QB3 is the kind of anchor that quietly wins weeks. But the margins are where seasons like this one get decided, and the margins here are shaky. Jakobi Meyers projects as the weakest projected starter at WR45, and the Chimere Dike reach, taken 5.2 rounds before his ADP, is the draft's most glaring gamble. If Dike delivers, the Devastaters have a functional back end. If he does not, the stars have to outscore the gap every single week. That is a tiring way to make a playoff run.

Last year kylwarren finished in the 11th percentile in scoring, a genuinely rough campaign that demanded a serious roster overhaul, and the 2026 draft looks like exactly that. The foundation is legitimately strong: Josh Allen at QB1 anchors everything, and the Allen to D.J. Moore stack means the two most important names on this roster are working in concert every week Moore finds the end zone. Drake London projects as WR7, Tetairoa McMillan as WR15, and George Kittle at TE9 rounds out a starting group that could carry kylwarren from the basement to the middle of the field and beyond. The tournament percentile projection sits at 56th, which feels modest given the top-end talent here but still represents a massive swing from 11th a year ago. The draft was heavy on chalk, which sometimes signals a manager playing it safe, but when your safe choices include Allen and London, safe looks pretty smart. Chase Brown fell to kylwarren four rounds past his ADP, adding RB11 value at a discount. The rebound is real.

MinnyMe finished last year at the 77th percentile and comes back in 2026 looking like a team that simply outworked the draft board. There were no lottery-ticket swings here, just a consistent pattern of coming out ahead: Puka Nacua at WR1 slid four spots past his ADP in the first round, James Cook at RB5 fell into the second round, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 came more than a round late. Four values, zero major reaches, and thirteen chalk picks add up to a roster built on execution rather than gambling. The one subplot worth watching is Kyler Murray, taken a round early at QB19, who landed in Minnesota after a lisfranc injury cost him most of last season in Arizona. The Vikings say the quarterback competition with JJ McCarthy is real, but most observers think the job is Murray's to lose, which means that mild reach could quietly look like one of the sharper calls on the board. Sitting fifth in the King Boo division at the 73rd percentile, MinnyMe has the foundation to climb.

andrewrettler didn't need a single transcendent moment in this draft, just a steady accumulation of good decisions, and that is exactly what happened. Four values across the roster tell the story: Caleb Williams fell a full round past his ADP into the QB6 slot, Colston Loveland landed nearly a round late at TE3, and both fit neatly into a Caleb Williams and Loveland stack that gives this team a built-in points multiplier on nights when that connection clicks. Meanwhile, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 form a pair of projected starters at the top of the position that most managers would trade their entire middle rounds to own. The draft finished with 13 chalk picks and zero major reaches, which sounds boring until you realize that boring drafts built on real value tend to hold up when the season gets weird. Sitting at the 86th percentile of the field after the draft is done, andrewrettler enters King Boo Division play not as a gamble but as a roster that simply did the work.

EvanDecker didn't stumble into correlation, he engineered it. The centerpiece is obvious: Joe Burrow (QB4) and Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) are stacked together, meaning when that offense catches fire, EvanDecker cashes in twice. That's not a nice-to-have, that's the entire architecture. But what makes this roster genuinely dangerous is how the supporting cast amplifies the ceiling rather than just filling seats. Luther Burden (WR22) is the most intriguing piece beyond the stack, a player whose snap share exploded in the back half of 2025 and who enters 2026 with Ben Johnson publicly drawing comparisons to Amon-Ra St. Brown. If Burden delivers on that hype, EvanDecker has a second live wire in his lineup on weeks when Burrow and Chase are already humming. De'Von Achane (RB6) and Kenneth Walker III (RB10) provide a dependable floor underneath all of it, and Walker arriving as a major value at pick 4.09 only sweetens the deal. This team sits third in the division but ranks in the top 10 percent of the field, and that gap between the two numbers tells you everything about the ceiling this correlation-first build is chasing.

There was no lottery ticket moment in ajthegreat's draft, no gambling on a fallen star or swinging for the fences on an injury comeback. Just a steady, methodical accumulation of value that quietly built one of the stronger rosters in the field. The foundation starts at tight end, where Brock Bowers at TE1 and Trey McBride at TE2 were both sitting past their ADPs when ajthegreat made the picks, turning the first two rounds into a quiet double victory before anyone noticed. Saquon Barkley at RB8 fell nearly a full round before being scooped up in the third. None of these were heists exactly, but that is the point: the draft did not need a heist. Four values, fourteen chalk picks, and just one minor reach across the entire board adds up to a roster that consistently got fair or better than fair prices. Sitting at 94th percentile in the tournament and second in King Boo division, ajthegreat did not outthink the room so much as simply not get outthought.

edsfootball did not win the draft on one dramatic pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session, picking up small edges hand after hand until the pile in front of them tells the story. Malik Nabers fell a full round and a third past his ADP before edsfootball snapped him up at WR12. Drake Maye slipped nearly a round past his number and landed as a QB2 anchor. Jaylen Warren and David Montgomery each came a round late, quietly padding a backfield that already had Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 projected among the starters. Four good values and a steal, against a single reach in Dontayvion Wicks deep in the 18th round where the cost of being wrong is almost nothing. The result is a roster sitting first in the King Boo division and in the 95th percentile of the field, built not on one swing that happened to connect but on a draft that simply kept coming out ahead at pick after pick.
