FantasyGoodeSports enters 2026 sitting 12th in the Korok division and in just the 11th percentile of the field, and the draft did not offer much reason for optimism. The manager burned three major reaches on quarterbacks, spending premium capital on Shedeur Sanders (QB32), Deshaun Watson (QB34), and Justin Fields (QB38), three players who grade out as low-end starters at best. That is a lot of draft equity chasing a position that produced almost nothing, while the rest of the roster leans on a handful of starters who are solid but not spectacular. De'Von Achane (RB6) and Derrick Henry (RB12) give the team a genuine backfield foundation, and Lamar Jackson (QB3) is a real anchor if he stays healthy, but after that the ceiling drops fast, with Deshaun Watson and Fields offering little more than depth filler. The 2025 campaign finished in the 15th percentile of scoring, and this roster, as currently constructed, does not project to climb far from that floor. Sometimes a team just runs out of exits, and FantasyGoodeSports may already be staring at the wall.

richardscott84 sits 11th in the Korok division and down in the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it easy to understand why. The foundation looks promising enough, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are legitimate cornerstones, but the structure built around them creaks under its own weight. Jared Goff was the most glaring draft decision, taken 2.1 rounds before his ADP to land a QB16, and with Baker Mayfield right behind him at QB18, the team burned early capital on a position where the returns simply do not justify the investment. The one ray of light is Marvin Harrison Jr., though even that flickers: two seasons without a 900-yard campaign, a messy injury history, and now Jacoby Brissett at quarterback in Arizona makes Harrison feel less like a breakout candidate and more like a waiting room with no magazines. The values richardscott84 did find, Emeka Egbuka and Isiah Pacheco falling past their ADPs, are real but modest, not the kind of course correction that moves a team out of the basement.

Jcork117 sits 10th in the Korok division and in the bottom fifth of the entire field, and the draft record does not offer much hope for a turnaround. Three major reaches, zero steals, and twelve chalk picks tell the story of a manager who paid full price for most of the roster and overpaid for the rest. The headliners are real: Joe Burrow at QB4 and Brock Bowers at TE1 give this team a legitimate foundation at two positions, and Bowers was actually the one moment where the draft rewarded patience, sliding nearly half a round past his ADP. But the middle of this roster is where the season will be won or lost, and that is a problem. Patrick Mahomes, projected as QB12, cost third-round capital thanks to a reach of nearly two rounds, which is the kind of surplus spending that quietly poisons a draft. Xavier Worthy projects as the weakest projected starter at WR49, and there is no obvious upgrade waiting in the wings. The ceiling exists, but the floor is closer to where this team spends most of its time.

There is not much to get excited about in the Korok Division when you are sitting ninth and projecting out at just the 24th percentile of the field, and russmana's 2026 roster does not offer many reasons to revise that pessimism upward. The brightest light here is Ja'Marr Chase, a WR2 projection that any manager would take, and Malik Nabers alongside him carries genuine upside, though his ACL recovery remains a live concern after last year's early exit. Nabers avoided the PUP list and looked sharp in camp, but whether he is a full go for Week 1 and how he meshes with Jaxson Dart are questions that still linger like a weather delay nobody can time out. Beyond those two, the dropoff is steep. The draft did not help matters, producing zero steals and one major reach in Fernando Mendoza, a QB27 projection taken more than six rounds ahead of his market price. Coming off a 2025 season that landed in the 18th percentile of scoring, russmana needed a transformative offseason. This was not it.

JorgeAF is sitting at 25th percentile entering 2026, and the draft offers little reason for optimism. The foundation is real enough: Josh Allen at QB1 is a genuine anchor, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 gives the lineup a reliable weapon at a position where most of the field is scrambling. But after that, the roster grades out as a collection of averages stacked on top of question marks, and the draft process compounded things. JorgeAF reached two full rounds early on Sean Tucker, a projected RB65 who is essentially a best-case-scenario dart throw, and burned another late pick getting ahead of the market on Elijah Sarratt, a WR98 whose value at pick 18.07 is close to wishful thinking. Zero steals in a draft where two major reaches were also logged is a punishing combination. Romeo Doubs, projected WR53, is the weakest projected starter, and that alone tells you where this team's ceiling sits. Allen is doing the heavy lifting here, and one player's greatness has its limits.

The name is #AllBiteNoBark, and after a close look at this roster, the bark is doing a lot of heavy lifting. Sitting 7th in the Korok division and projecting at just the 28th percentile of the field, this team is in genuine trouble at the top, where it matters most. Jahmyr Gibbs checks in as the RB1 and is the clear anchor, but beyond him, the elite-tier support evaporates fast. Trevor Lawrence and Brock Purdy project as QB10 and QB13 respectively, Dallas Goedert sits at TE15, and George Pickens, the best receiver on the board, lands at WR10. That is a lot of average starters being asked to carry a contender's ambitions. What makes the outlook bleaker is the draft offered no help. Zero steals, zero values, eighteen chalk picks, and the two moments the manager deviated from consensus, pulling Parker Washington and Jaylin Noel slightly early, were minor reaches on players projecting outside the top 30 at their position. There was no bold swing, no late-round lottery ticket cashed in. The margin for error here is thin, and the roster does not inspire confidence that luck will close it.

Fernando Kallas drafted like a patient poker player, waiting for the market to come to him, and he landed real value across the board: Jayden Daniels at QB5 a full round after his ADP, Tyler Warren at TE4 more than a round late, and Juwan Johnson at TE20 well past where he was going elsewhere. The problem is that patience at the back end of the draft produced a receiver group so thin that Jayden Reed, projected WR48, is the weakest projected starter on the entire team. That is not a depth issue, it is a ceiling issue, because in a positionless format your stars carry you and Kallas does not have enough of them above the line that matters. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 is elite. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 cost him a full round of overpay at pick 2.05. And the quarterback room leans heavily on Bo Nix, a high-volume floor play who has yet to crack the true elite tier. Kallas did the draft homework correctly. The roster just graded him on a curve and still handed him a C.

Nike87 sits in that uncomfortable middle ground where the roster is good enough to feel like a contender but not quite polished enough to actually be one. The engine here is a genuine backfield headlined by James Cook at RB5 and Travis Etienne at RB18, both projected starters, giving this team a reliable floor that most managers at the 39th percentile would envy. The passing game is serviceable rather than electric, with Drake Maye projected at QB2 and Chris Olave holding down WR11, but Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Chris Godwin at WR38 were both acquired past their ADPs, small advantages that compound over a long season. Where the margins start working against Nike87 is at the roster's edges. Trey Benson was the most aggressive swing of the draft, taken 3.3 rounds ahead of consensus, and Chuba Hubbard projects as the weakest expected starter at RB29. Neither kill a season on their own, but in a tournament decided by thin edges, paying a steep price for upside that may never arrive is exactly the kind of inefficiency that separates 5th place from the playoff line.

PeterRandall did not come here to gamble. Fifteen chalk picks, four values, and one outright steal tells you everything about the philosophy at work: trust the board, take what the board gives you, and do not get cute. The steal was Tre Tucker, pulled at 18.06 against an ADP of 15.03, a player who falls into your lap that late and you simply take him and say thank you. But the real centerpiece of this draft is the receiver corps, headlined by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5), two legitimate top-five talents anchoring a group that also includes Tee Higgins (WR19), Luther Burden (WR22), and Terry McLaurin (WR24) as projected starters. Lamb himself was a value, slipping 0.6 rounds past his ADP at pick 2.06. Matthew Stafford adds a fascinating subplot, a 37-year-old coming off a career-high touchdown season and an MVP award, now playing what might be a final chapter with a heir apparent already on the roster in Los Angeles. PeterRandall sits fourth in the Korok division and 76th percentile overall. Clean sheet. Very little to argue with here.

jlee300 didn't need a heist to build this roster. The 2026 squad lands at 83rd percentile in the tournament and third in the Korok division on the back of something quieter and arguably harder to pull off: a draft that just kept winning the exchange. The receiving corps alone makes a case, with Drake London (WR7), Zay Flowers (WR16), Garrett Wilson (WR17), and Davante Adams (WR25) all projecting as starters, and London arriving at a slight discount against his ADP to boot. Bijan Robinson anchors the backfield as a projected RB2, which is the kind of foundational piece that lets everything else breathe. The one genuine question mark is at quarterback, where Dak Prescott projects as a QB7 but carries injury history worth watching. Travis Kelce and Dalton Kincaid both project as starters at tight end, giving the lineup real optionality at a position that breaks rosters when it goes wrong. After a rough 2025, jlee300 rebuilt the right way, pick by pick, without needing a single lightning bolt moment to get there.

PlaidBastards didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it on volume and consistency, round after round coming out slightly ahead of the board. The clearest example is Kyle Pitts, who slid to TE7 by draft day and fell another round and a half before PlaidBastards scooped him at 7.02, pairing him with Colston Loveland (TE3) and Sam LaPorta (TE8) to build a starter group that most managers would envy on its own. Omarion Hampton came at 2.11, a touch ahead of his ADP, but when a player is projected TE3, you pay a modest premium. Then Jerry Jeudy arrived at 16.11, more than a round after consensus said he'd be gone, a quiet bonus at the back end of the draft. Fourteen chalk picks and only two minor reaches across the whole board tells you this was a disciplined room with no panic and no gambling. Landing at 90th percentile in the field and second in the Korok division, PlaidBastards look exactly like what they are: a team built right.

mamaxmax sits alone atop the Korok division and at the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: not a single reach on the board, six good values, and one outright steal. That steal is Trey McBride, a projected TE2 who fell a full round past his ADP and landed in this lineup like a gift left on the table by everyone else in the room. Harold Fannin at TE6 fell similarly, and the result is a pair of tight ends most managers would mortgage their middle rounds to acquire. The receiver group is where this roster truly gleams, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Nico Collins at WR9, and Rashee Rice at WR13 headlining a starting core that could carry a team through a brutal stretch of the schedule. Rice's off-field situation and knee procedure deserve honest acknowledgment, but the projection is WR13 for a reason, and mamaxmax drafted the upside, not the obituary. Disciplined, deep, and dangerous.
