McCarthy and Kendre Miller, taken earlier than their typical selections. As the season progresses, much of MyNickers' fate will hinge on whether their calculated risks pay off and if they can rise above the fatigue of mediocrity that has plagued them.

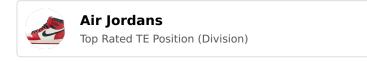

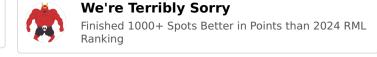
