There is no spin available for Notsuredude, and there is no reason to look for one. The defining move of this draft came in the first round, when Joe Burrow landed at 1.07, nearly a full round before his QB4 projection warranted. That might have been forgiven as aggressive conviction, except Jalen Hurts followed in the second round, a pick reached 1.5 rounds early on a player projected QB9. Burning two of your first three picks on quarterbacks in a positionless format is not a strategy, it is a confession that something went wrong at the board. The downstream damage shows up in the receiver group, where Tee Higgins at WR19 is the only starter with a credible projection and the depth dissolves quickly into Romeo Doubs, Deebo Samuel, and Keon Coleman. A 2025 campaign that finished in the 49th percentile of scoring offered this manager a chance to recalibrate. The 2026 draft suggests the lesson did not take. Sitting last in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, Notsuredude looks less like a contender than a cautionary tale.

The name 2000 FLUSHES turned out to be prophetic. Drafting from the 10th seat in Mike Tyson's Punch Out, this team landed in the 5th percentile of the tournament and sits 11th in the division, and the draft sheet explains exactly how it got there. Five major reaches litter this roster, and four of them are receivers, Makai Lemon taken 4.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, Jalen Coker yanked off the board 7.4 rounds early, Ja'Kobi Lane grabbed 6.6 rounds before his time. The manager was clearly chasing a receiver corps and panicked into paying tomorrow's prices today for players projected WR40, WR55, and WR89. Meanwhile, David Montgomery, now in Houston competing with Woody Marks for a backfield that wasn't exactly anyone's dream destination, sits as a projected starter despite a career-low 158 carries in his final Detroit season. Lamar Jackson at QB3 is real, and the Mahomes-Rice and Mahomes-Kelce stacks add some floor, but the supporting cast around them was assembled like someone bid on every item at an auction just to avoid going home empty-handed.

Jesus Lover arrives in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division sitting 10th in divisional rank and in just the 22nd percentile of the field, and the roster construction does not offer much reason for optimism. The receiver group is genuinely strong, anchored by Justin Jefferson (WR6), George Pickens (WR10), and DeVonta Smith (WR14), but the draft as a whole leaned heavily on hope over value, logging three major reaches including Chris Brazzell II (WR101) taken nearly six rounds ahead of his ADP and Gunnar Helm (TE26) grabbed over three rounds early. Those gambles eat into the equity a manager needs to build a contender from the back end of the draft. Then there is the quarterback situation, where Jared Goff (QB16) and Kyler Murray (QB19) project as the best available options, a ceiling that ranks this team below most realistic title threats before a game is played. Last season's 75th percentile finish feels like a distant memory. The lever-pulling is done, and the levers mostly pulled back.

Chosen Ones played the value game about as well as a manager can without landing a single outright steal, and the roster still sits 9th in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in the 41st percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether drafting exists as a skill or just as a way to feel productive. The foundation is legitimate: Brock Bowers at TE1 is a genuine advantage, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 was taken slightly past his ADP, and the receiver group has enough projected starters to fill a lineup without stress. But the math keeps not mattering. The team's single major reach, Mike Gesicki at TE33 spent more than three rounds of draft capital to back up a TE1, which is the equivalent of buying a warranty on a car you plan to use as a planter. That capital, recycled into literally any of the mid-round wide receivers sitting on the board, might have moved the needle. Instead, Chosen Ones bought value at almost every position and still built a team the projections cannot quite believe in.

Trey Smack dat drafted with genuine discipline, collecting Christian McCaffrey at 2.01 when his ADP sat at 1.09, landing Kenneth Walker III nearly a full round late, and finding Jordan Love as a certified steal more than two rounds past his ADP. On paper, that is a patient, process-sound draft. In practice, it produced a roster sitting eighth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and hovering around the 48th percentile of the field, which is the fantasy equivalent of cooking every dish correctly and still sending out a mediocre meal. The problem is that value only matters when the players you collected are actually good, and Love ranks QB17 while Josh Downs, the projected weakest starter, comes in at WR46. The stacks built around Love and Watson and Love and Tucker Kraft are thoughtful construction on top of a shaky foundation. McCaffrey is real, Walker is real, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 is real, but this roster needed those late-round bargains to hit harder than they project to, and right now they are not hitting hard enough.

Whats my name again? sits at the 58th percentile with a 2025 record of 15-21 to haunt them, and nothing about this roster screams that the math changes dramatically. The clearest strength is at tight end, where Trey McBride, Tyler Warren, Harold Fannin, and Kyle Pitts give this team a genuinely deep group of starters, though the draft reveals some impatience: Warren came off the board nearly a round early and Fannin almost two, which means this manager paid a premium to secure that depth rather than let value come to them. At quarterback, Jaxson Dart is the interesting variable. He has the mobility and the ceiling that makes fantasy managers excited, but he also has a documented habit of absorbing punishment and missing time, and he crossed 250 passing yards in a game exactly once last season. If Dart stays healthy and takes a step, this team competes. If he cycles through the medical tent again, the margin between 58th percentile and something worse gets thin in a hurry. The middle of the field tends to reward the teams that get lucky breaks. This one needs a few.

lx2 didn't need a signature moment to build something worth watching in Mike Tyson's Punch Out. This roster was assembled pick by pick, with the draft consistently finding players later than their price tag suggested. Nico Collins landing at WR9 a full round after his ADP is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season, and pairing him with CeeDee Lamb at WR5 gives lx2 two projected starters who can carry a week on their own. Tony Pollard fell three full rounds to RB30, which is simply a gift. Drake Maye projects as a QB2 and Justin Herbert as a QB8, meaning the position is covered from multiple angles without lx2 having paid a premium for it. The one soft spot worth watching is Wan'Dale Robinson, now in Tennessee and competing for targets after the Titans used a top-five pick on Carnell Tate. Robinson had a breakout 2025 but the target share in that offense is genuinely unsettled. Sitting at 67th percentile entering the season, there is real upside here if the chalk holds and a couple of those late values hit.

Mr. Dream Vanilla Ice didn't reshuffle their roster with one bold swing, they just kept winning the small battles, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 69th percentile with a very real path to doing more damage than that. The foundation is legitimate: Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Ashton Jeanty (RB7) are as good a top-end pairing as you'll find anywhere in this field, and Breece Hall (RB14) gives the roster a third projected starter who would headline plenty of other teams. The draft craft shows up in the margins too. Dallas Goedert (TE15) fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and lands as a projected starter after quietly ripping off four touchdowns in three weeks during last season's fantasy playoffs, the kind of player who looks like a bargain in February and a genius pick by November. Sam Darnold (QB21) is the soft spot, but this roster has enough top-end punch that the quarterback position rarely needs to be the reason you win. Coming off a 61 percent win rate in 2025, Mr. Dream Vanilla Ice looks like a team that knows exactly what it is.

Jordyn Tysons Punch-Out finished 2025 at the 63rd percentile and returns in 2026 looking like a team that learned something from it. The draft board will tell you this manager reached three times at a magnitude worth calling major, including Jadarian Price grabbed more than two rounds early and Carson Beck taken nearly six rounds before consensus said to bother. And yet the roster that emerged projects Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Jayden Daniels at QB5, a top-end collection that does not care how uncomfortable the process looked. The counter-argument to the whole thing is Price, projected as the weakest expected starter at RB26, a position where the reach was most visible and the payoff least certain. But Matthew Stafford arriving nearly three rounds past his ADP and pairing cleanly with Davante Adams is the kind of blind-squirrel return that keeps managers honest about dismissing gut calls. This is a 72nd-percentile roster built on conviction, or on luck dressed well enough that the difference may not matter until the losses pile up.

Mbifulco94 lands at third in the division and the 75th percentile of the field, which undersells how cleanly this roster was built. The foundational move came at the top: Josh Allen at RB1 in a format where positional labels barely matter is already a win, but grabbing him at pick 1.10 when his ADP sat at 1.05 is the kind of small efficiency that compounds. Then the draft got genuinely interesting. James Cook, projected RB5, fell a full 1.5 rounds past his ADP before Mbifulco94 scooped him at 3.10. C.J. Stroud, projected QB22, slipped nearly three rounds and landed at 12.03. Geno Smith followed at 17.10, nearly four rounds past where the field valued him. Against 13 chalk picks, those three steals give this roster a cushion most teams in this tournament simply don't have. The 2025 line, 27 wins and 5,174 points at the 96th percentile in scoring, tells you this manager knows how to turn a good draft into a good season. The pieces are here to do it again.

KennyDavidson didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't mortgage the middle rounds chasing upside, just drafted a roster that quietly beat the board over and over. The foundation is legitimately elite: Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give this team two projected top-ten backs, and Puka Nacua at WR1 is the kind of anchor that makes every other decision easier. Then the values started stacking. Chris Olave fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at WR11, and Brock Purdy slipped a round to give KennyDavidson a QB13 who also happens to stack with George Kittle at TE9, one of the cleaner built-in connections in the tournament. Four values across the draft, zero steals required, ten picks at or near chalk, and the team still landed in the 88th percentile of the field. That's not luck finding KennyDavidson. That's a manager who understood what the draft was offering and took it, almost every single time.

The Hoodie Man sits first in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in the 96th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains why: four values, one steal, and only one major reach across the whole board. That kind of consistency compounds. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the receiving corps, but the picks around him are where the draft really won. Drake London fell to the back of round two despite projecting as WR7, and Sam LaPorta slid a full round past his ADP to become a projected starter at TE8. Dak Prescott at QB7 was similarly acquired at a discount, landing in round five when his price tag had been third-round money earlier in the summer. The one real blemish is Rashod Bateman, taken more than three rounds before his ADP, though a WR92 projection keeps him out of the starting conversation regardless. There is no single heist to point to here, just a manager who consistently got more than he paid for and built a roster that reflects it.
