

As the 2025 season dawns, Josh Smillie (@2wicky) and his merry band of fantasy contenders prepare to dazzle no one in particular. Coming off a performance last year that felt decidedly like a lukewarm cup of coffee—scoring in the 35th percentile and winning a tepid 57% of games—the team's aspirations seem as ambitious as a turtle on a treadmill. Ranked 10th in the LetterkennyShamrocks division and just barely above the quarter percentile mark overall, Josh Smillie's strategy appears to involve more wishful thinking than strategic genius. The quarterback duo of Josh Allen (QB2) and Jared Goff (QB17) might give fleeting glimpses of hope, like sunbeams through storm clouds, but the running backs look about as threatening as a spoon in a knife fight. Javonte Williams (RB35) is somehow a starter, perhaps because there wasn't a better option or maybe as an experiment in irony. At least the tight end cadre, featuring Sam LaPorta (TE4) and

Colston Loveland (TE11), seems poised to be the team's salvation in this TE Premium format, if salvation means finishing a game with your pride mostly intact. Wide receivers Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR6) and Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR13) offer a glimmer of potential, providing the team's strongest position by division rank, though Ricky Pearsall's value pick status at WR42 is about as impressive as a diet soda at an all-you-can-eat buffet. The draft strategy was a head-scratcher, with some players reaching for greatness—or at least higher ground—like Zack Moss, whose earlier-than-planned selection surely sent shockwaves through... nowhere, really. But at least there's a stack bonus with Goff and Amon-Ra St. Brown, which is a bit like getting a free side of fries with your burger—nice, but unlikely to change your life. So here they go, ready to face a season full of challenges and opportunities to learn from their mistakes—or, more likely, make new ones.


