wibadgersbucky enters 2026 sitting 12th in the Link Division and in just the 8th percentile of the field, and there is not much in the draft log to suggest a turnaround is coming. The most glaring self-inflicted wound is Bo Nix, taken 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as a QB15, which is the kind of reach that haunts a team when the cost is a mid-round pick that could have landed a difference-maker. The receiver room looks flashier than it is: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Malik Nabers (WR12) are genuine top-end contributors, but Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) arrives carrying real uncertainty after a 2025 season derailed by injuries and a troubling disconnect with Trevor Lawrence, the sort of player who looks like depth insurance until you actually need him to produce. With a last-season record of 18-18 and a 56th-percentile scoring output that was already middling, wibadgersbucky needed an aggressive, creative offseason. Instead, the draft delivered 12 chalk picks, zero steals, and a QB reach in round four. The lever does not exist.

There is no comfortable spin available for Maksimus heading into 2026, and the numbers make that brutally clear. Sitting 11th in the Link Division and in just the 18th percentile of the entire field, this roster grades out as one the tournament would rather not talk about. The saving grace is a genuinely impressive receiving corps anchored by CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Drake London (WR7), and Chris Olave (WR11), three legitimate difference-makers who give the lineup a real ceiling on good weeks. The problem is that everything feeding into those weapons is shaky. Tyler Shough checks in at QB20, a tenuous foundation even in a positionless format, and the backfield is led by Chuba Hubbard at RB29, the projected weakest starter on the roster. Compounding the concern, the draft offered no steals and no values across 17 chalk selections, plus two major reaches on Tyler Warren and Brenton Strange, meaning Maksimus paid premium prices to solve depth rather than upgrade the top. Last season's 42 percent win rate feels less like a bad year and more like a baseline.

The 2026 Scott Fish Bowl is a brutal place to find out your drafting instincts are broken, and mbwoellert is about to find out. Five major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a pattern, and the pattern here screams panic and positional fixation. Dalton Kincaid, a TE11, was yanked off the board nearly three rounds early in round five, which is a jarring price for a player who is merely decent. Then mbwoellert apparently decided one early tight end reach deserved company, reaching on Theo Johnson and Darnell Washington a combined eight rounds ahead of consensus in the late rounds, essentially burning three picks on a position group that projects as replacement level below Kincaid. C.J. Stroud, a QB22, cost a round seven pick despite being a fringe starter at best. The roster does have Bijan Robinson and Nico Collins to paper over some of the damage, but a team sitting at the 20th percentile of the field with zero steals and five major reaches earned that position honestly.

RedJimmy finished in the 82nd percentile last year, and the roster he is bringing into 2026 does not look like a team trying to repeat that. The projections tell the story plainly: a 32nd percentile tournament forecast and a ninth-place division ranking. The headliner is Puka Nacua at WR1, a genuinely elite projection, and A.J. Brown at WR8 gives that top end real weight. But once you move past that pair, the depth drops fast, with the likes of Omar Cooper Jr. at WR60 and Calvin Ridley at WR78 anchoring the back of the roster. The most alarming single decision is Matthew Stafford, taken in round four when his WR14 projection suggested he should have been available in round six. RedJimmy burned real draft capital to land a quarterback who projects as barely a starter at the position, and that misallocation ripples through the whole board. Nacua and Brown can carry a team, but only if everything around them holds up, and right now the gap between last year's reputation and this year's projection is wider than the résumé suggests it should be.

Nny enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting eighth in the Link Division and projected at just the 40th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The draft tells much of the story: four major reaches against zero steals, which is the kind of ledger that tends to follow a manager all season. Jaxson Dart cost a third-round pick for a QB11 projection, Omarion Hampton was drafted nearly a full round early and grades out at RB9, and Emanuel Wilson was taken a staggering 5.6 rounds before his ADP to land as a projected RB69. Those early investments are locked in now, and there is no surplus capital left to course-correct. Meanwhile, projected starter Wan'Dale Robinson profiles as a WR47 after moving to Tennessee, where the Titans spent a fourth overall pick on Carnell Tate to compete for the same targets Robinson just worked to earn. When your swing pieces are underperforming their cost and your depth is already absorbing new competition, the margin for error disappears entirely.

MasTecate drafted with the discipline of a manager who has read every ADP article twice and dog-eared the good parts. Josh Allen fell nearly a full round past his average draft position, Isiah Pacheco slipped a round and a half, and across the board almost every pick landed at chalk or better. Seventeen chalk selections, two genuine values, zero major reaches. The process was clean. The problem is that clean process and a projected 41st percentile finish can coexist, and here they do. The receiver group is the culprit: Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Mike Evans at WR27 are respectable starters, but Isaac TeSlaa at WR68 is the kind of third option that makes managers stare at their lineup on Sunday morning hoping for a miracle. Meanwhile, Sam LaPorta checks in at TE8, which is fine, but fine does not move the needle when the top of the roster is merely solid rather than dangerous. MasTecate did not beat the market and still came up short, which is less a draft failure than a reminder that value is relative to the players available, and the players available this year simply did not have a ceiling.

Kirbskol sits at the 51st percentile and sixth in the division, which means every game this season gets decided in the margins, and the margins here cut both ways. The tight end group anchored by Colston Loveland (TE3) and Tucker Kraft (TE5) is genuinely elite, and the Jordan Love / Kraft stack adds a layer of ceiling that could carry a week when everything else is merely fine. The concern is that Kraft is coming off a torn ACL and spent time on the preseason PUP list, so projecting him as TE5 assumes he recaptures the form that had him briefly ascending to a starring role in Green Bay before November ended his season. That assumption is doing heavy lifting. Meanwhile, Xavier Worthy (WR49) projects as the weakest starter on the roster, and at the 51st percentile you cannot afford soft spots in the lineup on bad weeks. Justin Jefferson (WR6) and Loveland can win any given matchup outright. The question Kirbskol cannot answer until the season starts is whether Kraft returns as the player they drafted or a slightly diminished version of him, because that difference is exactly the size of the margin between contending and watching from the outside.

lanezim didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't get cute chasing upside, just built a roster that keeps rewarding the more you look at it. The foundation is legitimate: Ashton Jeanty (RB7), Jeremiyah Love (RB13), and Breece Hall (RB14) form a backfield core that most managers would trade their third-round pick to own, and Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) is the kind of anchor that makes every decision downstream easier. Jalen Hurts (QB9) carries real questions after the AJ Brown trade, and if Philadelphia's passing game stumbles, his rushing touchdown floor starts to erode too, but a QB9 projection means the market is already pricing in some skepticism. The value hunting was modest but steady, with Jakobi Meyers arriving as a WR45 two and a half rounds after his price tag suggested he would, and Jordyn Tyson (WR34) sliding a round past where he was expected to go. Nothing flashy, no lottery tickets cashed. Just a draft that quietly won more exchanges than it lost, which is exactly how contenders get built.

boppco0212 didn't need a miracle pick to build this roster, just a draft that quietly kept winning the exchange. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 anchor a backfield that would headline most rosters in the Link Division, and Drake Maye at QB2 gives the team a ceiling most managers here would envy. The rest of the board filled in the same way: Cam Skattebo at RB20, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Jameson Williams at WR21 all project as starters, and the Jared Goff and Williams stack adds a correlation bonus that can spike a week when it matters. Goff himself came in as the QB16 projection, which is solid depth behind Maye. The draft logged just one genuine value, Geno Smith falling more than two rounds past his ADP, but that tidiness is actually the point. Fifteen chalk picks sounds boring until you notice the chalk was consistently better than what the field was targeting at the same spots. Sitting at 62nd percentile after a rough 2025, this team looks rebuilt the right way.

DynastyHoser went into this draft swinging with conviction and came out with something that looks genuinely difficult to beat. The centerpiece tells the story: Brock Bowers at TE1, taken half a round early, a minor reach by the board's accounting and an obvious anchor by anyone else's. Then Greg Dulcich at TE25 and Pat Freiermuth at TE30, each grabbed two-plus rounds ahead of consensus, moves that looked aggressive in the moment and look prescient now given what surrounds them. The skeptic's case is that three major reaches in a single draft is a lot of conviction to spend. The believer's case is Joe Burrow at QB4, Terry McLaurin at WR24, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, all of them falling past their ADPs and landing here anyway, a collective windfall that suggests DynastyHoser was simply drafting a plan rather than panicking. A 76th-percentile roster built on six values and three major reaches is either very smart or very lucky, and after a 72-percent win rate in 2025, this team has earned the benefit of the doubt.

miroufinho didn't need a heist to build a winner, just a draft that kept cashing in. The foundation is legitimate: De'Von Achane at RB6 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this team elite-level production at positions where the gap between the top and the rest of the field is enormous. Layer in a Dak Prescott and George Pickens stack, with Prescott landing at QB7 nearly a full round after his ADP suggested he would, and you have a manager who let the board come to them rather than forcing anything. Jaylen Waddle, snagged a round late at WR23, and George Pickens at WR10 round out a starting group that projects as one of the better collections in the field. The minor reach on James Conner barely registers against a draft that otherwise leaned chalk or better. The result is a team sitting second in the Link Division and in the top ten percent of the tournament, built not on one flashy gamble but on a steady accumulation of edges that compounds over a full season.

Team Problem Child did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to audition. Sitting first in the Link Division and in the 96th percentile of the entire field, this roster arrived already dressed for the occasion. The foundation is immaculate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give the team a top of roster that most managers would mortgage their middle rounds to acquire, and Lamar Jackson at QB3 was collected at 2.09 when the board had him priced at 2.03, a quiet discount on a quarterback this good that compounds across a long season. The discipline extends into the later rounds, where Bucky Irving fell a full round and a half before this team claimed him at RB21, and Tre Harris slid two full rounds before landing at 18.09. Six values, zero reaches, zero regrets. If the weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, the concern level here is approximately zero. This is a draft executed with a steady hand and a very clear plan.
