There is a version of mickey1103 that finished in the 81st percentile last season and looked like a manager who had figured something out. The 2026 roster is asking you to forget that version existed. Sitting 12th in the GoldenEye 007 division and projected at just the 19th percentile, this is a team that drafted its way into a corner before the season even started, reaching 3.1 rounds early on Matthew Stafford (QB14) and another 1.3 rounds early on Jared Goff (QB16), burning premium capital on a position where both quarterbacks are projected outside the top 13. The receiver group around them is genuinely appealing, with A.J. Brown (WR8), Jameson Williams (WR21), and Davante Adams (WR25) all projecting as starters, and the Stafford-Adams and Goff-Williams stacks offer some upside. But Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1) is essentially doing the heavy lifting alone beyond that receiver core, and no amount of receiver depth rescues a roster when its foundational draft decisions already cashed the goodwill from a strong 2025 season.

Stop Getting Bond Wrong sits 11th in the GoldenEye 007 division and in the bottom 20th percentile of the field, and the draft record does not offer much reason for optimism. The one area that genuinely sparkles is the tight end group, where Trey McBride, Tyler Warren, Harold Fannin, and George Kittle all project as starters, but that brightness only makes the rest of the roster look dimmer by contrast. The manager leaned hard into that group, reaching 0.8 rounds early on Warren and nearly two full rounds early on Fannin, capital that could have shored up a receiver corps where Quentin Johnston, the projected weakest starter at WR41, is being asked to do real work. Meanwhile, Baker Mayfield grades out at QB18 and Kyler Murray at QB19, meaning this team is essentially starting two quarterbacks who cancel each other out rather than elevate the lineup. There is no obvious lever left to pull here. This roster feels less like a work in progress and more like a project that already ran out of time.

There is a version of this DolphinAbroad roster that looks survivable on paper, and then you squint at the 2025 record, a ghastly 1-35, and the illusion collapses. The foundation is real enough: Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3 and Omarion Hampton sits at RB9, a pair of genuine top-end assets that most bottom-of-the-division teams cannot claim. The problem is everything built around them. Hampton was already reached on by nearly a round, and then the draft devolved into a pattern of overpaying, four major reaches in total, including Jonathon Brooks at RB37 and Keenan Allen at WR99, the projected weakest starter and a receiver so far down the depth charts his rank barely registers. Brock Purdy offers some relief at QB13, but Sam Darnold and Aaron Rodgers behind him are not reassuring. At 29th percentile in the tournament field with no obvious trade chips to shake loose and a TE room that ranks among the tournament's thinnest, DolphinAbroad is not rebuilding. It is just hoping the good parts are good enough, and history suggests they probably are not.

RaiderMation sits ninth in the GoldenEye 007 division and at the 34th percentile of the field, and there is not a lot in the draft receipt to suggest a turnaround is coming. The most glaring decision was taking Patrick Mahomes at QB12 a full 1.7 rounds before his ADP, which is a steep price to pay for a quarterback who, in a positionless format, needs to genuinely carry his weight relative to what was available later. That early commitment squeezed the rest of the draft, and the results show: sixteen chalk picks, zero steals, and a supporting cast that grades out thin beyond the top names. The saving grace is a genuinely strong top tier, Jonathan Taylor at RB4, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, and a Kyle Pitts who finally looks like the player Atlanta always promised he would be, regardless of whatever quarterback situation unfolds around him. But below those names the floor drops quickly, with Michael Wilson projecting as the weakest starter at WR39. When your margin for error is this small, you cannot afford to have paid a premium to get there.

cfbfletch enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting eighth in the GoldenEye 007 division and projecting out at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft record does nothing to inspire confidence. The roster produced zero steals and zero values against ADP, and five major reaches litter the back half of the board, players like James Conner (RB56), Ja'Kobi Lane (WR89), and Elic Ayomanor (WR95) taken well before the market agreed they were worth selecting. The foundation is real enough: Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and James Cook (RB5) are genuine difference-makers, and Malik Nabers (WR12) gives the receiving corps a credible top option. But the trickle-down from those stars runs dry fast, and the projected starting lineup bottoms out at Dalton Schultz (TE22), a player who grades as the weakest starter on the team. Dalton Kincaid (TE11) was supposed to offset that concern, but the knee issue he has carried since late 2024 remains unresolved, with the Bills themselves unwilling to guarantee he arrives healthy. There is no obvious lever left to pull here.

Daz10 enters 2026 sitting seventh in the GoldenEye 007 division and in just the 38th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. The team logged zero steals, only two values, and racked up three major reaches, including Jake Tonges at TE34 taken three rounds early and Malik Washington at WR71 grabbed nearly three rounds before his number was called. Those are the kinds of draft-night decisions that compound quietly, eating into the depth that a bottom-tier roster can least afford to sacrifice. The bright spots are real: Caleb Williams projects as QB6, Amon-Ra St. Brown sits at WR4, and Colston Loveland checks in at TE3, giving the team a legitimate ceiling on any given week. But KC Concepcion, the projected weakest starter at WR50, represents the floor, and that floor is low. Williams and Brown can carry a good week, but this roster has almost no margin for error, and the draft left precious few backup plans when things go sideways.

Baileys Giants finished 20-16 a year ago, good enough for the 70th percentile in scoring, and the 2026 projection lands them at 40th percentile, fifth in the GoldenEye 007 division. That's not a collapse, but it's not a trajectory you brag about either. The case for optimism starts with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and runs deep through Nico Collins at WR9, Rashee Rice at WR13, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Garrett Wilson at WR17, a projected starting group that can genuinely hurt opponents on a given week. The case for concern is that the draft produced zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches, including Rice taken roughly a round and a quarter before his ADP and Chigoziem Okonkwo pulled a full two rounds early. Those aren't fatal swings, but they signal a manager paying premium prices to lock in comfort rather than finding edges. When your weakest projected starter is Wan'Dale Robinson at

WR47, the ceiling and the floor aren't far apart, and in a tournament decided by margins, that's exactly what makes this team nervewracking to root for.

OnHerMajestysSecretADP finished at 70th percentile in scoring last season and sits at 39th percentile heading into 2026, which is basically the working definition of a team that has to earn everything the hard way. The ceiling is real: Drake Maye projects as QB2, Justin Jefferson as WR6, and a starting group that includes Breece Hall, Josh Jacobs, and DeVonta Smith gives the manager genuine firepower at the top. The floor is where things get interesting. Rhamondre Stevenson projects as the weakest starter on the roster at RB31, and the depth beyond the top names leans on players like Tyreek Hill at WR77 and Cooper Kupp at WR88, the latter a four-round reach who needs a strong comeback just to justify his draft slot. Fourteen chalk picks and only one steal suggests a manager who trusted consensus rather than hunting edges, and in a positionless format where every fractional advantage compounds, that conservative approach leaves this roster right where it looks: good enough to win any given week, not quite built to string them together consistently.

Skolfall did not win this draft with one flashy pick. They won it by grinding out advantages across round after round, and the result is a roster that projects comfortably into the 74th percentile of the field. The foundation is undeniable: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 are both projected starters, and Achane arrived as genuine value, falling nearly a full round past his ADP. Then there is the quarterback shelf, where Trevor Lawrence, projected QB10, slipped all the way to pick 7.05 against an ADP of 4.11, a steal that looks even better when Cam Ward at QB23 landed two rounds late behind him. The major reaches on Quinshon Judkins and Mason Taylor are real, though Judkins at least arrives with momentum after a promising first year that ended on a fractured fibula, and reports out of Browns camp suggest he is on schedule to be fully healthy. No single moment defined this draft. It was just consistently, quietly correct.

The QB Spy Who Sacked Me enters 2026 sitting third in the GoldenEye 007 division and at the 78th percentile of the field, and the case for optimism is not built on one flashy swing but on a draft that repeatedly collected more than it gave up. The clearest examples sit at the extremes of the roster: Brock Bowers, projected TE1, was the one mild concession to impatience, taken a fraction early at 1.03, while Justin Herbert, a projected QB8, slipped a full round and a half before this team calmly picked him up at 5.03. That kind of arithmetic, quietly winning exchanges across nearly every round, is how you reach a starting lineup anchored by Bowers, Herbert, Jayden Daniels, Ashton Jeanty, and Tucker Kraft without a single major reach on the ledger. The receiver group projects weaker, with Christian Watson leading the way at WR28, but the top end of this roster is deep enough that it does not need a weak spot to announce itself. This team did not come to make a speech. It came to win rounds.

You Only Punt Twice lands at 80th percentile in the field and second in the GoldenEye 007 division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: not one moment of genius, just a consistent string of decisions that kept coming out ahead. The receiver group is the engine here, with Puka Nacua at WR1, Drake London at WR7, and Chris Olave at WR11 anchoring a starting corps that most managers would rebuild their entire roster to assemble. What makes the draft tick is how quietly the value accumulated. Marvin Harrison Jr. fell 1.3 rounds past his ADP and landed at WR33, a win on paper that compounds when you already have the top of the position locked down. Jakobi Meyers slid a full round past his number too, and even as the projected weakest starter he arrives with a cushion of upside beneath him. The 2025 campaign finished in the 38th percentile, so there is real ground to reclaim, but this roster was built the right way: patiently, methodically, and mostly right.

FromRussiaW/JeremiyahLove sits first in the GoldenEye 007 division and in the 91st percentile of the field, and the draft record explains why: no major reaches, no minor reaches, and three players who slid past their ADP and landed in this lineup. That kind of consistency is hard to manufacture and easy to overlook, which is exactly the point. The foundation is obvious enough, Josh Allen at QB1 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 giving the team a ceiling most managers would trade their whole bench for, but the craft shows up in the mid-rounds. Jaylen Waddle fell a full round and projects as a starter at WR23, and the Broncos context makes that even more appealing: Bo Nix threw more passes than anyone in the league last year, and Waddle steps into that volume after escaping one of the more dysfunctional passing offenses around. TreVeyon Henderson similarly slid more than a round before this team grabbed him at RB19. Draft days that quiet and that productive tend to produce playoff runs that are neither.
