One Love drafted like someone who had somewhere to be. The reach count alone tells the story: four major reaches, four minor reaches, zero steals, zero values, and ten chalk picks in between, which means the few times this roster broke from consensus it broke in the wrong direction. The headliner is Jeremiyah Love, pulled 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP to land at RB13, a fine player taken at a price that leaves no margin for disappointment. Fernando Mendoza, a QB27, was somehow prioritized at pick 10.04, roughly 2.5 rounds before anyone else wanted him. Skyler Bell, a WR103, got snatched 7.2 rounds early in what might be the single most confounding decision in the entire draft board. The projected starters have genuine upside, Drake Maye and Kenneth Walker III are real pieces, but this roster was built by consistently paying tomorrow's prices for today's uncertainty, and it now sits at the bottom of the Bowser division projections with a 2nd percentile tournament outlook to show for it.

There is no spin to put on what zachic22 built in the Bowser division. The draft chart tells the story with brutal clarity: zero steals, zero values, thirteen chalk picks, and three major reaches that managed to get progressively worse as the rounds went on. Reaching on Caleb Williams, a QB6, almost a full round early is forgivable in isolation, but then came Jaylin Noel at WR83 nearly four rounds before his ADP, and Tory Horton at WR93 three rounds early, two late-round fliers on receivers projected outside the top 80 who cost premium draft capital to acquire. The top of the roster, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Omarion Hampton at RB9, offers something to work with, but the rest of the lineup thins fast, and the weakest projected starter is Blake Corum at RB35, a player reached on as well. This team sits 11th in its division and in the 17th percentile of the field, projections that feel less like bad luck and more like a draft that earned exactly what it deserved.

TheRetroCoach enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Bowser Division and projecting at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the roster anatomy explains exactly why. The foundation is genuinely appealing: CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Chris Olave (WR11), and Zay Flowers (WR16) form a legitimate top end, and Jonathan Taylor (RB4) remains one of the more reliable weekly engines in the tournament. But the drop-off after those names is steep enough to make your stomach hurt. Michael Pittman projects as the weakest projected starter at WR44, and the quarterback situation, anchored by Matthew Stafford at QB14 and Baker Mayfield at QB18, is functional at best. Worse, the draft offered almost no room to feel clever about it: 17 chalk picks, zero steals, and a major reach on Chris Brazzell II at WR101, taken more than five rounds ahead of his market value. TheRetroCoach had the stars to build around and then built something ordinary around them. There is no hidden lever here, no undervalued stash quietly waiting to flip the picture.

RotoJeff is betting everything on correlation, and in the Scott Fish Bowl's Bowser division, that is either a genius play or a slow-motion disaster waiting to unfold. The architecture is clean: Josh Allen stacked with Dalton Kincaid, Joe Burrow stacked with Tee Higgins, two pairings designed to amplify each other when the games break right. The problem is that "when the games break right" is doing a lot of heavy lifting for a roster sitting at just the 38th tournament percentile. Burrow in particular is the kind of asset that makes you feel brilliant in March and nauseous by September. He is arguably the best fantasy quarterback in the league when healthy, but his injury history is not a footnote, it is the entire conversation, and a repeat of the grade-3 turf toe that wiped out most of his 2025 season would collapse this roster's ceiling in the first month. RotoJeff is not building toward a ceiling so much as constructing an elaborate trap door, one that looks like a masterpiece right up until it doesn't.

afleischer is the kind of team that wins a league by January and loses it by February, not because anything went wrong but because nothing went spectacularly right. The foundation is genuinely good: Brock Bowers at TE1 is a weekly advantage that compounds quietly over a long season, and the projected starting core of George Pickens (WR10), DeVonta Smith (WR14), and De'Von Achane (RB6) gives this roster a ceiling that most teams at the 53rd percentile cannot match. The problem is the margins. Nearly the entire draft was chalk, which means afleischer is betting on projections landing cleanly rather than on hidden value doing any heavy lifting. The Jordan Love/Christian Watson stack adds a correlation bonus, but Love sits at QB17 and Watson at WR28, so that pairing needs to outperform its projections, not just meet them. Eighth in the Bowser division is where teams like this tend to live, not because the roster is bad, but because being solidly fine is only enough when the breaks go your way.

getcraned is the kind of team that will win the weeks it is supposed to win and lose the ones it cannot afford to lose, and that 53rd-percentile projection feels less like an insult than an honest assessment. The core is genuinely good: Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster a ceiling most managers in the Bowser division would trade for, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 keeps the engine running. The problem is everything below that tier starts to thin out in ways that matter when injuries hit or matchups turn ugly. Kyle Monangai projects as the weakest projected starter at RB33, and a roster that went 18-18 last season with 59th-percentile scoring already knows what it feels like to be one bad week from the wrong side of average. The draft was almost entirely chalk, which is not damning on its own, but it does mean there is no hidden upside baked in. getcraned will not embarrass anyone. Whether that is enough in a format where the margins decide everything is the entire question.

garyhadow1 sits at 54th percentile heading into 2026, which is exactly as uncomfortable as it sounds: good enough to believe, not good enough to relax. The margins are real. Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and James Cook (RB5) give this roster genuine upside at the top, and Tyler Warren (TE4) and George Kittle (TE9) form a tight end pairing that most managers would trade a kidney for. But every ceiling has a floor, and that floor is named David Montgomery (RB23), who left Detroit's backfield hierarchy behind for Houston, where he now faces a competition with Woody Marks for carries he probably assumed were already his. The draft tells a similar story of a team living in the middle: twelve chalk picks, four values, and one major reach in Christian Kirk (WR100) taken nearly five rounds early, which is the kind of swing that wins you nothing if it misses. garyhadow1 went 61 percent in 2025

and is projected in the same neighborhood now. Somewhere in the margins between McCaffrey's brilliance and Kirk's optimism, this season gets decided.

JETSbyamillion didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They just kept coming out ahead on pick after pick, and the cumulative effect is a roster sitting at the 61st percentile with real upside baked in. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is the kind of foundational piece that makes everything else easier, and Colston Loveland at TE3 is genuinely elite at a position where most managers are scraping. The quarterback situation is where it gets interesting: Trevor Lawrence posted a career year last season, piling up 4,000 yards and nearly 30 passing scores while adding a career-high 9 rushing touchdowns, all without leaning on his presumed top weapons. That suggests Lawrence's production may be more durable and system-driven than his previous reputation implied, which makes him a useful QB10 flier behind the steadier Justin Herbert at QB8. Quentin Johnston came in as a good-value pick after falling more than a round past his ADP, so even the depth has upside attached. This roster didn't lunge for home runs. It just accumulated advantages, and in a long season, that tends to matter.

OneSpeedSteve didn't win any draft-room highlight reels, but this roster is exactly what a 63rd-percentile finish looks like when it's built the right way. The core tells the story: Jalen Hurts landed five rounds later than his QB9 projection warranted, Travis Etienne slipped nearly two rounds past his ADP before Steve scooped him at RB18, and Jake Ferguson fell almost two rounds to fill out a starting TE spot at TE12. None of those are lottery tickets, just consistent execution of the oldest draft principle in the game, let the board come to you. Stack the Hurts/Dallas Goedert connection on top and you have a lineup where the quarterback's production bleeds directly into the tight end's. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give the roster a genuine ceiling. The two major reaches at the back end of the draft are forgivable mistakes, the kind you make when the real work was already done in the middle rounds. This team belongs in the conversation in Bowser.

LARaider84 enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting third in the Bowser Division and at the 73rd percentile of the field, and the clearest explanation is a draft that simply kept winning the exchange rate. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a premier top end, and the supporting cast around them is where the real work shows. Kyren Williams, projected at RB15, slid a full round and a half past his ADP before LARaider84 scooped him, which is exactly the kind of patient accumulation that compounds over a full season. The Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds a connected upside layer, pairing a QB5 projection with a WR24 who was already worth the slight early investment. There are no dramatic swings on this sheet, just 16 chalk picks reinforced by two genuine values and zero major reaches. Coming off a 78 percent win rate and an 86th percentile

scoring season in 2025, LARaider84 looks less like a team riding a hot hand and more like one that keeps showing up to work.

eliotprops didn't win the draft with a single jaw-dropping moment. They won it the way a good poker player wins, by consistently getting slightly more than they paid for. Lamar Jackson landed half a round after his average draft position, Derrick Henry slid nearly a full round, and the two minor reaches on the board were just that, minor. The result is a starting corps that holds up: Jackson projects as QB3, Jahmyr Gibbs sits at RB1, and Saquon Barkley checks in at RB8. Then there's Tucker Kraft, the kind of late-developing asset that can quietly decide a season. Kraft was pacing toward 1,000 yards before a November ACL tear, came off the preseason PUP list before August, and returns to a Packers receiving corps that has lost more weapons than it has added, which means his opportunity should look very familiar to the one that briefly made him must-start. Sitting second in the Bowser division and 78th percentile tournament-wide, eliotprops built a contender by just being right more often than wrong.

Shneeze enters 2026 as the top seed in the Bowser Division and sitting at the 94th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: mostly chalk, but the deviations almost all broke the right way. Puka Nacua at WR1 slipped to pick 1.06 despite an ADP of 1.01, a small edge that compounds when the player is the top-ranked receiver in the format. Malik Nabers landed at WR12 nearly two rounds after his ADP suggested he would, giving Shneeze a projected starter who should have cost considerably more. Jaxson Dart fell a full two rounds past his ADP and arrives as QB11, unlocking two built-in stacks with both Nabers and Isaiah Likely that give Shneeze a structural edge on correlated scoring weeks. The one swing that cost something was Xavier Worthy, reached nearly three rounds early and projecting as the weakest projected starter at WR49. One blemish on an otherwise clean sheet. A 28-8 record last season confirmed this manager knows how to convert paper rosters into points, and the 2026 build gives them every reason to expect more of the same.
