EdiTrain arrives in the Toad Division ranked third in the division and sitting in the third percentile of the field, which is the kind of symmetry nobody wanted. The draft tells the whole story: zero steals, zero values, and four major reaches on a board that apparently demanded panic. Josh Downs at WR46, Matthew Golden at WR52, and Jayden Higgins at WR54 were all taken two-plus rounds early, which means EdiTrain spent premium capital collecting a tier of receivers that the field was perfectly content to leave on the board longer. The roster does have genuine anchors, Justin Jefferson projects as WR6 and Colston Loveland comes in at TE3, but surrounding them with a collection of over-drafted depth options is like building a house around a beautiful front door and then running out of lumber. Sam LaPorta was grabbed nearly two rounds ahead of his ADP too, so even the good decisions came at a price. This team did not just miss on value, it actively paid extra to do so.

D1mebagger went 31-5 last season and scored in the 96th percentile, which is the kind of resume that makes opponents in the Toad division nervous before the bell even rings. The 2026 roster, however, does not look like a team that earned that reputation. The receiving corps is legitimately elite, with CeeDee Lamb, Malik Nabers, and DeVonta Smith all projected as starters at WR5, WR12, and WR14 respectively, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 providing genuine depth behind them. But the tournament projection tells a colder story: 11th in the division and 7th percentile in the field, a ranking that suggests this roster is coasting on a name while the points have quietly left the building. The draft offers no obvious explanation for the fall, with no steals and 17 chalk picks, meaning D1mebagger drafted exactly what the consensus expected and got exactly the consensus result. Travis Kelce, reached nearly a round and a half early, is a TE10 playing like he still commands TE1 draft capital. Last year was real. This year's number is also real.

There is no painless way to say this: tchmyz is projected 10th in the Toad division and sits in just the 13th percentile of the field, and the roster mostly explains why. The receiving corps is genuinely impressive on paper, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, and Zay Flowers at WR16 give this team a real ceiling, but the draft work surrounding those pillars tells a quieter, grimmer story. Two major reaches, Deebo Samuel and Tyquan Thornton, burned late capital on players projected WR70 and WR97, and only one pick across the entire board graded out as a true value. The result is a roster where the top is propped up by strong projections and the bottom is propped up by wishful thinking. tchmyz managed a respectable 56 percent win rate in 2025, so the bones of a competitive manager are here, but a season built around hoping Samuel rediscovers himself while Thornton justifies a four-round reach is a season already asking too much from too little.

Rydstein drafted like someone who had a plan and then abandoned it somewhere around round four. The clearest evidence is at tight end, where Dallas Goedert, Juwan Johnson, and Colby Parkinson were all taken two to three rounds ahead of their respective ADPs, a compulsive hoarding of a single position that bled cost into every surrounding pick. That resource drain shows up everywhere you look: five major reaches across the board, zero steals, zero values, and a roster that lands in the 17th percentile of the field. Justin Herbert at QB8 is serviceable, but pulling him nearly a full round early in round two meant the rest of the draft was played on tilt, chasing comfort instead of value. The projected starter pool has some legitimate pieces, George Pickens and Tee Higgins chief among them, but the depth behind them is a parade of WR90s and WR95s who exist mainly to remind you how many late picks were spent getting there. This is what a draft without a functioning compass looks like.

Jormond drafted like someone who read every cheat sheet and followed every rule, and the roster they built still lands at 43rd percentile and eighth in the Toad division, which is the kind of outcome that should come with a formal apology from the process itself. The discipline shows on paper: three values, twelve chalk picks, zero major reaches, and a draft board that mostly behaved. But discipline without upside is just obedience. Trey McBride at TE2 is genuinely excellent, A.J. Brown at WR8 gives the lineup a real anchor despite being taken a half-round early, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 is a usable pillar. The problem is that after those names, the projections go soft in a hurry, and Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter at WR47, is where the floor actually lives. Jormond found value where the market left it and arrived at a roster that projects to lose more weeks than it wins. Sometimes the draft gods take your patience and hand you nothing back.

London Calling sits at 59th percentile, division rank seven, the kind of team that makes opponents check the matchup, shrug, and move on. The ceiling here is real: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give this roster a top end that can genuinely win any given week. Caleb Williams at QB6 keeps the floor from caving in. But the margins the team lives and dies by are exactly where things get uncomfortable. D'Andre Swift landed as good value at RB24, yet he's the pillar holding up a backfield group that thins out fast below him. Jakobi Meyers projects as the weakest starter at WR45, and in a format where every point counts, the bottom of the lineup is where seasons quietly bleed out. The draft was almost entirely chalk, which means there's no hidden upside baked in, no forgotten steal waiting to emerge. If Smith-Njigba and Williams perform to projection and the role players hold, this team competes. If anything slips, the margin for recovery is thin.

LVRaiders20 didn't build this roster on one flashy swing, they built it pick by pick, and the cumulative advantage is real. Puka Nacua at WR1 was the centerpiece, taken fifth overall at a slight discount to his ADP, and the production around him didn't fall off a cliff the way it does on less disciplined rosters. Rashee Rice projects as WR13 and Carnell Tate as WR29, both projected starters, meaning the strength at the top of this lineup runs several layers deep. Then the draft hit its stride in the middle and late rounds, where Fernando Mendoza, Rico Dowdle, and Kyle Monangai all fell past their ADPs and landed at prices that look smart in hindsight. Five good-value picks and zero major reaches across the entire roster is a quiet brag, the kind of draft where no single moment stands out because almost every moment worked. Sitting 65th percentile in the field and sixth in the Toad Division, this team has the profile of a squad that sneaks into the conversation and stays there.

sugarfreemocha didn't build this roster with one flashy lottery ticket, they built it by consistently beating the market, and the cumulative effect is a lineup that quietly belongs in the Scott Fish Bowl conversation. Chase Brown at RB11 slipped nearly a full round past his ADP, Tony Pollard fell over a round, and Tyler Allgeier tumbled three full rounds to become the kind of late steal that separates sharp drafts from lucky ones. Layer that value-hunting onto a foundation that includes Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 and you have a team that didn't have to gamble because it was already winning. Bo Nix adds a compelling secondary option at QB15, a volume monster who led the league in pass attempts in 2025 and now gets Jaylen Waddle added to Denver's offense, meaning his floor stays safe even if the efficiency ceiling is still the open question. The team finished at the 67th percentile last season and projects similarly this year, which undersells just how well-constructed this roster actually is.

POWERSURGE24 finished 2025 below the median and came into this draft with something to prove, and the board suggests they spent most of their picks proving it in the most nerve-wracking way possible. Thirteen chalk picks surrounded by five reaches, zero steals, and two values is not a profile that inspires confidence on paper. Then you look at the roster. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 anchor a starting group that would make most managers in this field quietly jealous, and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 gives this team a weekly ceiling that the draft board never had to manufacture. The reaches are real, Troy Franklin taken nearly four rounds before his ADP and Demond Claiborne nearly four rounds before his, and both are long shots to return that investment. But POWERSURGE24 did not need them to. The top of this roster is legitimate enough that the

aggressive late-round swings look less like recklessness and more like a manager who knew exactly where the floor already was, and built upward from there.

TheConsigliere sits at third in the Toad Division and the 88th percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: not a gambler's haul, just a manager who kept coming out ahead. The foundation is as good as it gets, with Jahmyr Gibbs projecting as RB1 and Jonathan Taylor as RB4, the latter slipping nearly a full round past his ADP for what qualifies as the biggest bargain on the board. From there the value kept coming in quieter ways, Bucky Irving at RB21 and Rachaad White at RB39 each arriving a round and a half late. Harold Fannin adds a genuine edge at TE6, a player whose production already outran his situation last year and whose value bumps further now that the veteran ahead of him is gone. The two wide receiver reaches are the honest counterweight, Travis Hunter and Elijah Sarratt each drafted well before the market agreed, but in a positionless format the rest of this roster has the depth to absorb that. TheConsigliere did not swing for the fences. It just kept getting the better of the deal.

Last year, jorgemartin17 finished in the bottom 9 percent of the entire field, a 5-31 record that reads less like a fantasy season and more like a public humiliation. The 2026 roster reads like a direct and deliberate response to that misery. The foundation is staggering: Josh Allen at QB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the Toad Division simply cannot match, and James Cook at RB5 means the firepower does not thin out after the first name. The draft work made it better. Travis Etienne, projected RB18, slid two full rounds past his ADP before jorgemartin17 scooped him up, and Bhayshul Tuten and Jaylen Warren followed as additional values late. This is not a roster hoping to crawl back to respectability, it is a roster constructed to dominate. The 89th percentile tournament projection and a division rank of second say the same thing the numbers do: the rebound is not coming, it has already arrived.

The Williams Bros. sit first in the Toad Division and in the 96th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: mostly chalk, but with the kind of targeted patience that turns a good draft into a great one. Kyren Williams fell nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP before the Williams Bros. scooped him up at 8.02, landing a projected RB15 starter at a steep discount. Quinshon Judkins did almost the same thing, slipping to 10.02 despite an RB22 projection. Neither pick required a bold, swing-for-the-fences gamble, just a manager willing to let the draft come to them. Bookend that with Brock Bowers going off the board as the TE1 and Tyler Warren projecting as TE4, and you have a roster that punishes opponents at multiple levels. The weakest projected starter is Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31, which tells you everything about the floor this team is operating from. After a 33rd-percentile scoring finish in 2025, the Williams Bros. look like a team that finally built the roster to match their ambitions.
