Last year DorsalFlex finished in the 97th percentile, and the ghost of that season is doing a lot of heavy lifting right now. The 2026 version sits in the bottom tenth of the field and ranks twelfth in the Yoshi division, and the roster explains why: the top of it is real, but the foundation has quietly eroded. CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Tyler Warren at TE4 are genuine difference-makers, and Chris Olave at WR11 gives this lineup a top-four group that most managers would take. The problem is everything below that tier, and especially the quarterback situation, where Cam Ward projects as QB23 and Malik Willis as QB24. In a positionless format, a manager can paper over a weak position by simply outscoring it elsewhere, but that only works if the depth holds. Here, the draft produced fourteen chalk picks and not a single steal, meaning there is no hidden upside waiting to emerge. DorsalFlex is trading on a reputation that last year's roster earned and this year's roster has not yet shown any sign of deserving.

Scott Gerhardt enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Yoshi division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The backbone of his team is real: Josh Allen is a QB1, George Pickens projects as WR10, and Travis Kelce, who quietly returned for another season still hoping to push back into the top-12 conversation at TE, was a major reach at two full rounds early. That kind of aggressive investment in aging upside is the sort of bet that needs to pay off clean, and there is not enough depth behind it to absorb a miss. The rest of the projected starters grade out as WR16 in Zay Flowers, TE7 in Kyle Pitts, and TE18 in Hunter Henry, which is a starting lineup that requires nearly everything to break right. Gerhardt finished in the 59th percentile last season, so he knows how to compete, but looking at this roster honestly, the margin for error in 2026 feels like it has already been spent.

Mad63Mac lands in the 14th percentile of the field heading into 2026, and the honest reality is that the roster doesn't have many places to hide. The running back group is the clearest strength, with James Cook projecting as RB5 and Chase Brown right behind him at RB11, but beyond those two the depth grades out as replacement-level rather than competitive. The passing game support is where things get genuinely uncomfortable: Brock Purdy, taken a full round and a half early at pick 4.04, projects only as QB13, meaning Mad63Mac paid a premium for a quarterback who grades out as merely average. The Purdy-Mike Evans stack and the Jared Goff-Amon-Ra St. Brown pairing offer some weekly upside, but St. Brown at WR4 is the lone elite weapon in the pass-catching corps, and the supporting cast of Courtland Sutton and Michael Pittman projects squarely in the middle of the field. This team went 64 percent in 2025 and finished in the 54th percentile in scoring, so the baseline is not catastrophic, but the 2026 projection suggests the ceiling has quietly lowered and the floor hasn't risen to meet it.

DaddyJeb's enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Yoshi division and at just the 41st tournament percentile, and the roster doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The draft is the most telling story: three major reaches against just one steal, including the first-overall pick spent on Jeremiyah Love at RB13, a player taken 3.3 rounds ahead of consensus. That's the kind of swing that can define a season before Week 1 arrives, and not in a flattering way. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give the team a legitimate upper tier, but after them the roster grades out quietly, with Jadarian Price projected as the weakest starter at RB26 and a tight end group where the best option is Kenyon Sadiq at TE21. The 2025 season, a 3-33 record with scoring at the fourth percentile, suggests this isn't a team on the rise. Jameson Williams falling to WR21 is a genuine win, but one value pick rarely patches a foundation this shaky.

LexaPower did not come here to spread the wealth. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Breece Hall at RB14, Tucker Kraft at TE5, Isaiah Likely at TE13, and Drake Maye sitting at QB2 is not a roster built for balance, it is a roster built for dominance at the positions that actually decide weeks. In a positionless format where a manager simply fields the best players available, stacking elite talent at running back, tight end, and quarterback is not a quirk of roster construction, it is the entire strategy. The receiver group is thin by comparison, with Davante Adams at WR25 as the lone projected starter worth trusting, but that barely registers as a complaint when the rest of the lineup looks like this. LexaPower sits 8th in the Yoshi division and at the 47th percentile in the field right now, which feels almost deliberately ungrateful toward a roster carrying this much upside. McCaffrey, Kraft, and Maye alone could drag a mediocre team to a winning record. This is not a mediocre team.

fatsalad sits at the 49th percentile, which is about as perfectly median as a team can get without someone engineering it that way. The margins are real, and they cut in both directions. On the upside, Lamar Jackson at QB3 is a genuine difference-maker, and landing him at 2.11 when his ADP was 2.03 is the kind of quiet efficiency that compounds over a long tournament. Puka Nacua at WR1 gives the roster a weekly ceiling that most teams at this percentile simply do not have. The concern is that the supporting cast is built on a lot of chalk, with Javonte Williams at RB17 and Travis Etienne at RB18 projecting as competent but not explosive pieces. The tight end group is the one place projections offer little comfort, with Greg Dulcich at TE25 leading a unit that does not project to add points. In a format decided by small edges, fatsalad has enough firepower at the top to climb but not enough separation in the middle to feel safe.

soxfan64 enters 2026 as the Yoshi division's most frustrating puzzle: talented enough to beat anyone on a given week, ordinary enough that no one is losing sleep over the matchup. The foundation is real. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster a thunderous top end, and Nico Collins at WR9, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and Tee Higgins at WR19 form a receiving group that holds its own against most of the field. What makes this season genuinely hard to call is what surrounds that core. The QB room leans on Bo Nix at QB15 and Tyler Shough at QB20, and Shough is the interesting variable: polished enough in year one, but at 27, the ceiling questions are legitimate, even with Chris Olave and Jordyn Tyson creating opportunities around him in New Orleans. Sixth in the division and 54th percentile overall are numbers that neither demand respect nor invite dismissal. In a field this competitive, soxfan64 needs the margins to break right, and right now, that is genuinely uncertain.

Hallllerjono didn't manufacture this roster through a single splashy moment. They built it the way good drafters actually build things, by consistently getting more than they paid for. Kenneth Walker III landed at RB10 when the board slid him nearly a full round past his ADP. Ladd McConkey came in at WR20 when the market had him priced a round and a half earlier. Trey McBride at TE2 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give this roster a level of positional advantage that compounds week after week, the kind that quietly separates winning managers from the ones who are always scrambling. Yes, there are reaches baked in, Sam LaPorta going almost two and a half rounds early being the most notable, but the five good values on this sheet absorb that cost without blinking. The 61st percentile standing and fifth in the Yoshi division feel like a modest home for a team that outscored nearly the entire field a year ago. Cautious optimism is appropriate. The draft did its job.

Korbdub did not stumble into a stack and call it a strategy. The Burrow-Chase pairing is the architecture of this entire roster, the load-bearing wall everything else leans against. Joe Burrow arrives as QB4 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP, and Ja'Marr Chase checks in as WR2, meaning korbdub is riding two players who rank among the best at their respective positions and who make each other better every time Cincinnati decides to air it out. Patrick Mahomes, snagged nearly two rounds after his projected value, provides a legitimate contingency at quarterback rather than a panic option, which matters in a format where you field your best players regardless of position. The ceiling here is genuinely stratospheric, the kind of number that wins tournaments outright, but it is not diversified. If Burrow has an off week or Chase draws a shadow corner and disappears, this roster does not quietly absorb the damage. It feels it everywhere. Sitting 79th percentile in the field and fourth in the Yoshi division, korbdub has built something with real upside, provided the pairings hit.

camaro1313 didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster, just a steady hand and enough patience to let the board come to them. The headliner is Brock Bowers, a TE1 who gives this team an advantage at the position on nearly every matchup, and pairing him with Jayden Daniels, a QB5 grabbed at 3.10 when his ADP sat closer to 2.12, is the kind of quiet one-two that defines a well-constructed squad. Omarion Hampton fell a full round past his ADP before camaro1313 scooped him at RB9, and Jonathan Taylor anchors the backfield at RB4, meaning the top of this roster is genuinely difficult to beat. The WR group projects as the thinnest layer, with Christian Watson leading a group of starters none ranked higher than WR28, but in a positionless format the strength above compensates. A 2025 finish at the 52nd percentile in scoring suggests this roster has real room to climb, and landing in the 82nd tournament percentile in 2026 looks less like optimism than arithmetic.

SomeGuyFF didn't build this roster on one big swing. They built it the way good drafts actually get built: by winning small battles over and over until the advantages compound. Justin Jefferson at WR6 is the centerpiece, and the context around him matters. Jefferson's 2025 struggles traced back to a quarterback who couldn't find him, and with Kyler Murray now in Minnesota and widely projected as the Week 1 starter, the floor under Jefferson looks a lot higher than his recent numbers suggest. Pair Jefferson with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and the top of this roster is genuinely hard to argue with. The value thread runs deeper, too. Jake Ferguson fell more than a round past his ADP, Jauan Jennings and Isaac TeSlaa were both sitting there late when they had no business being available, and Sam Darnold came in more than a round after his ADP. Five values across the roster, no major structural compromises in the projected starters, and a team sitting at 85th percentile in the field. SomeGuyFF earned that.

Sitting atop the Yoshi division and landing in the 89th percentile of the field, garrettlerner built this roster the quiet way, round after round of coming out ahead on value without ever needing a single miraculous swing. The headline is Caleb Williams, a projected QB6 who fell a full two rounds past his ADP before garrettlerner scooped him at pick 5.06, which is the kind of market inefficiency that changes a draft's entire complexion. Pair that with Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchoring the top of the lineup, Drake London projecting as WR7, and Rashee Rice right behind him at WR13, and you have a team whose starters would look impressive even if the value finds elsewhere meant nothing. But they did mean something: Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 came 1.5 rounds late, and Quentin Johnston slid a full round. This team did not get lucky in one big moment. It just kept winning small negotiations, and at the end of 20 rounds, the ledger looked very much in garrettlerner's favor.
