Tommy Want Winny sits dead last in the Luigi Division and in the first percentile of the entire tournament, which means the draft went about as well as you might expect from a team that treated ADP like a suggestion it disagreed with on principle. The reaches here are not the "I see something the market doesn't" variety, they are the panicked, tunnel-vision kind: Oronde Gadsden went 3.7 rounds early, Juwan Johnson went 2.8 rounds early, and Mark Andrews went 2.8 rounds early, so three of the team's five major reaches were at the same position, which is a remarkable way to stockpile projected TE14, TE16, and TE20 when the rest of the roster was still begging for attention. Zay Flowers checks in at WR16 as the top receiver, and Stefon Diggs at WR56 is the next option after a 2.7-round overpay to get him there. Lamar Jackson anchors everything and the stacks with Flowers and Andrews give this team a pulse, but a ceiling built on one quarterback's big days and a floor propped up by Diggs is a narrow ledge to stand on in a field this competitive.

Green Machine drafted like someone who showed up to a charity auction and overbid on everything with a green label. The centerpiece is Joe Burrow at QB4, which sounds fine until you learn this team reached nearly a full round early to get him in round one, then doubled down by grabbing Jaxson Dart nearly two rounds ahead of his ADP in round three. Dart is the kind of quarterback who generates genuine highlight-reel excitement and genuine concern in equal measure, a player whose passing volume has been inconsistent and whose durability has been genuinely questionable. Burning two early picks on quarterbacks in a positionless format where you cannot start both simultaneously is the kind of draft capital mismanagement that compounds across a roster. The rest of the board reflects the same pattern: three major reaches and four minor reaches against zero steals. Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 qualifies as good value, but one bright spot cannot undo a draft this systematically overconfident. Green Machine sits 11th in the Luigi Division and in the 11th percentile of the field, and nothing here suggests those projections are unfair.

Alta'd States Moose sit 10th in the Luigi Division and in just the 12th percentile of the field, and the roster gives precious little reason for optimism. The brightest light here is Puka Nacua, a WR1 projection who was a genuine value at 1.05, but the supporting cast dims quickly after him. The draft strategy that built this roster is hard to defend: Jalen Hurts and Bo Nix were the two most notable early investments, pulled in a combined 4.1 rounds ahead of their ADPs, and both are merely serviceable projections at QB9 and QB15. That is a steep price for quarterbacks who are not difference-makers in a positionless format where those picks could have reinforced the top of the lineup. Parker Washington projects as a starter at WR35, which sounds tolerable until you remember that his 2025 breakout came in circumstances the Jaguars may not be eager to replicate, with Travis Hunter now fully in the picture. Nacua is real. Everything else feels like a team hoping the bottom holds rather than a team with a plan.

There is no polite way to frame what happened to itsjustEgo in 2025, a 7-29 record and a finish in the 8th percentile of scoring, and the 2026 draft did not deliver the reset this roster desperately needed. The draft board tells the story plainly: five major reaches, mostly concentrated on backs like Braelon Allen, taken more than four rounds ahead of his ADP, and TreVeyon Henderson, grabbed nearly two and a half rounds early. Reaches at that volume tend to mean a manager chasing a vision the market had already priced out, and what itsjustEgo got for the trouble is a collection of RBs clustered in the RB19-to-RB69 range with no clear standout. The saving grace, and it is a real one, is the receiver group anchored by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and supported by Jameson Williams and Davante Adams as projected starters. But even Chase at the top of the position board cannot carry a roster sitting 9th in the Luigi Division and projecting at just the 28th percentile of the field. The lever itsjustEgo needed this offseason was not pulled, and the climb from last year looks every bit as steep as it did before the draft started.

jtobin93 sits eighth in the Luigi Division and at the 38th percentile of the field, which is a polite way of saying the roster is closer to the drain than the trophy. The draft did not help matters: two major reaches, three minor reaches, zero steals, and one value across the board. Reaching six-plus rounds early on Sean Tucker, a projected RB65, is the kind of swing that needs to pay off spectacularly to be forgiven, and the odds are not in anyone's favor there. The legitimate weapons are real but limited: Josh Allen anchors the squad, and a quartet of tight ends led by Tucker Kraft, George Kittle, Travis Kelce, and Dallas Goedert gives the lineup some genuine teeth at a position where Goedert in particular has shown he can deliver when it matters, as Eagles fans painfully remember from last fantasy postseason. But Nico Collins and Tyreek Hill project as WR9 and WR77 respectively, meaning if Collins stumbles, the receiving corps collapses fast. After a 9-27 campaign in 2025, jtobin93 needed a draft that opened doors. This one mostly closed them.

Charlie Buckets sits at 57th percentile and seventh in the Luigi Division, which is exactly as comfortable as it sounds: not safe, not doomed, just perpetually one bounce away from either outcome. The foundation is genuinely good. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Trey McBride at TE2 are the kind of projected starters that keep a manager sane in a long season, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 gives this roster real depth at the top. But the margins cut both ways here, and Malik Nabers is the sharpest edge. A torn ACL that his own coach called "not simple," a summer of uncertainty, and then a training camp that reminded everyone why his redraft value once sat in the top ten at receiver: Nabers is the season in miniature, high upside wrapped in genuine risk. If he is a full-go early and builds chemistry with Jaxson Dart, this roster climbs. If he stalls, Charlie Buckets is left grinding on a middling WR corps with no obvious savior waiting behind him. The ceiling exists. The floor is closer than anyone wants to admit.

Laughing Lizard Luigi didn't swing for fences and miss, didn't load up on upside at the cost of the present, just drafted with steady, accumulating competence that left the roster in genuinely good shape. The backbone is a loaded backfield anchored by Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7, with Jeremiyah Love (RB13) and Breece Hall (RB14) pushing the depth into territory most managers can't match. That foundation alone would carry a lot of teams, but what separates this roster is how the receiving corps was built on the margins. Terry McLaurin fell 1.3 rounds past his ADP and lands as a projected WR24 starter, while Brian Thomas Jr. slid 1.7 rounds and comes in at WR31. Thomas is a buy-low with real prove-it energy after a 2025 that raised questions about his fit with Trevor Lawrence, meaning the value is real but so is the bet. The result is a team sitting 60th percentile in the field, fifth in the division, and positioned to outperform both numbers if those late-round receivers find their footing.

Fantasy Plumber didn't swing for the fences in the Scott Fish Bowl draft, and that restraint is exactly what makes this roster worth watching. The foundation is legitimately elite: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team two of the best players in the entire field, and Achane arriving at the board a little past his ADP of 2.07 is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a full season. Colston Loveland at TE3 rounds out a starting core that most managers in the Luigi division would envy. The draft wasn't flashy, logging four values and mostly chalk, but the chalk was well-chosen, and Chris Olave slipping a full round past his ADP to land at WR11 is exactly the kind of thing that separates good drafts from forgettable ones. Quinshon Judkins sits at RB22 and, if he's healthy for training camp after last year's fractured fibula, he's the kind of upside piece that turns a good team into a great one. Sitting 60th percentile in the field, this team has the ceiling to climb considerably.

The Green Empire didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't load up on one position and pray. They just kept winning exchanges. Emeka Egbuka fell a full round and a half past his ADP and landed as a projected WR18 starter. Isaiah Likely slipped similarly and gives them a TE13 at the back of the tenth round. Makai Lemon was the headliner of the value column, dropping more than two full rounds before the Green Empire snapped him up. And then there's Luther Burden, projected WR22, who arrives in 2026 with Ben Johnson publicly comparing him to Amon-Ra St. Brown after a late-season run that suggested the hype is grounded in something real. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 anchors the whole operation. The reaches exist, and Mac Jones at the back end of the roster is the one that stings a little, but the floor here is sturdy. At 62nd percentile and fourth in the Luigi Division, this team is positioned to climb if even two or three of those value picks pay off.

Rolamiral is not the loudest name in the Luigi Division, but at 89th percentile and third in the division, this roster earns its reputation through craft rather than chaos. The foundation is almost unfairly clean: Justin Jefferson at WR6, George Pickens at WR10, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 form a projected starting core that most managers would mortgage future picks to assemble, and Rolamiral got all three with favorable draft positioning. Jefferson fell nearly a full round past his ADP, Pickens slipped eight spots, and then Marvin Harrison Jr. tumbled two-plus rounds to land at WR33, turning a mid-draft pick into a steal that would have had other draft rooms muttering into their coffee. Anchor the receiving group with Brock Bowers at TE1 and Kyle Pitts at TE7, and you have a roster built on compounding value, not luck. Five good values, one major steal, and zero major reaches across the whole board. That is not a fortunate draft. That is a disciplined one.

Hey! Thats-a Pretty Good is not a team you poke holes in, because there are almost no holes to find. Sitting at the 95th percentile of the entire field, this roster was built with the kind of quiet precision that makes other managers feel bad about their own drafts. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 form a foundation that most teams would mortgage their middle rounds to acquire, and this manager didn't stop there. Garrett Wilson landed at WR17 more than a round after his ADP, Carnell Tate slipped a round past where he should have been taken, and Josh Downs fell nearly two full rounds before this team scooped him up at pick 12.01. Six values across the roster, zero major reaches, thirteen chalk selections that landed exactly where they should. The one blemish, Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, comes with real upside in Tennessee under Brian Daboll, even if target competition will keep the ceiling honest. This is a clean draft. Full stop.

Bang bang! sits at the top of the Luigi Division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft tells you exactly why. This roster is clean in the way that matters most: seven values, zero reaches, and a receiving corps that reads like someone hacked the draft board. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Rashee Rice at WR13 are all projected starters, and Brown and Rice both slipped past their ADPs by more than a round before this manager pounced. Harold Fannin, the TE6, came off the board a full round late as well, which means the tight end slot didn't cost anything extra. Dak Prescott landing at QB7 rounds out a core that has real upside from top to bottom. The floor is high, the process was disciplined, and the weakest projected starter is Quentin Johnston at WR41, which is simply not a problem most managers have. After a 2025 that landed in the 37th percentile, Bang bang! has the roster to be a completely different story.
