The clearest summary of what Luvdisc Hurts did in this draft is that they burned a fourth-round pick on Jordan Love, a QB17 projection, when Love's consensus price was closer to the seventh round. That is not a timing quirk or a calculated gamble on upside. That is a manager who wanted Love badly enough to overpay by two and a half rounds and then had to spend the rest of the draft patching the damage. The patches are visible everywhere: Matthew Golden pulled at WR52 projection in round eight when the field was leaving him until round twelve, Dontayvion Wicks taken nearly seven rounds ahead of his WR96 projection. The receiver group has genuine anchors in Puka Nacua at WR1 and DeVonta Smith at WR14, and the Hurts-Smith and Love-Christian Watson stacks give the team real ceiling. But Luvdisc Hurts sits 12th in the division and in the fourth percentile of the field,

and at some point the ceiling stops mattering when the floor was built on misread draft boards and impulsive early commitments.

Dustin_Ludke sits at 6th percentile in a field where everyone is trying, which tells you almost everything you need to know about how this draft unfolded. The reaches are where this thing falls apart: Patrick Mahomes comes off the board at 3.12 despite projecting as a QB12, meaning Dustin_Ludke spent a third-round pick on a quarterback who may not even start, then doubled down by taking T.J. Hockenson at 9.12 and Michael Pittman at 8.01, two more reaches that consumed mid-draft capital on players projecting at TE23 and WR44 respectively. That is three prime rounds essentially lit on fire while managers nearby were filling their rosters with starter-quality options at fair prices. The bright spots, Jayden Daniels at QB5 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5, are real, and the 2025 record of 56 percent wins suggests Dustin_Ludke can manage a team once it is built. The problem is this one was not built so much as assembled in a panic, and the standings board already knows it.

Vikings Live In Minnesota drafted like a manager who saw a fire sale and panicked, reaching on four players across the board while landing zero steals and just one value in an entire draft, and the results are about as grim as last year's 3rd-percentile scoring finish suggests they should be. The most damning entry in the ledger is Jordan James at RB67, hauled in 6.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, followed closely by Kaelon Black at RB71, plucked 8.1 rounds early, two players whose projections confirm what the draft capital screamed in real time: this manager paid premium prices for bargain-bin outcomes. Meanwhile, Kyler Murray checks in at QB19, Bryce Young at QB26, and the rest of the quarterback shelf gets worse from there, leaving a roster that leans heavily on Christian McCaffrey and Justin Jefferson to paper over decisions that cannot be papered over. Sitting 10th in the Pokmon

division and projected in the 12th percentile of the field, Vikings Live In Minnesota does not need a miracle so much as it needs a different draft entirely.

There is a particular exhaustion that comes from staring at a roster and realizing the ceiling is already visible from the floor. CentiDortch sits ninth in the Pokmon division and checks in at the 23rd percentile of the field, and nothing in the draft history suggests a hidden path to relevance. The real wound is at the top of the draft: Saquon Barkley, the anchor of this whole operation, was taken 1.9 rounds before his ADP, meaning this team paid first-round prices for an RB8 projection. That kind of overpayment compresses every pick that follows, and sure enough the receiver group grades out weak, with Alec Pierce, DK Metcalf, and Makai Lemon as the projected starters. There is genuine upside at quarterback, where Drake Maye and Joe Burrow both came at real value, and Kyle Pitts, fresh off a legitimate top-five finish at the position, gives the manager something to believe in regardless of who lines up under center in Atlanta. But belief only goes so far when the scoring floor already bottomed out at 31st percentile last season, and nothing here suggests the math changes much.

cwilliams26 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Pokmon division and in just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. Not a single steal or value pick on the board, fifteen chalk selections, and two major reaches that stand out as particularly damaging: MarShawn Lloyd, a projected RB66, taken nearly eight rounds early, and Emanuel Wilson, a projected RB69, grabbed more than six rounds ahead of his ADP. Those two picks consumed late real estate that could have added upside and instead delivered depth-chart speculation. The floor here is propped up by Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Trey McBride at TE2, and a Caleb Williams and Rome Odunze stack gives the team a plausible ceiling if Chicago clicks. But Williams projects as QB6, Odunze as WR30, and the projected starters below them thin out quickly, with Jayden Reed sitting at WR48 as the weakest projected starter. After a 33-percent win rate in 2025, this roster needed a bold, creative draft. It did not get one.

Team Rocket sits at exactly the 50th percentile, and that number tells the whole story: this is a roster built to be decided by the margins, not the marquee. The top end is genuinely good. Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4, Colston Loveland slots in as TE3, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 gives the team a legitimate anchor the manager grabbed a full round after his ADP. That is a real foundation. The trouble is that the supporting cast thins out fast, and the weakest projected starter is Cam Ward, who sits at QB23. There is reason for cautious optimism there: Tennessee surrounded Ward with upgraded weapons, including a new top receiving threat in Carnell Tate and Wan'Dale Robinson in free agency, so the tools exist for a step forward. But cautious optimism is not a scoreboard. This team finishes seventh in the Pokmon division right now, one good week from contention and one bad one from irrelevance, which is exactly where you land when the margins are all you have to argue about.

Exebuka is a team that will win the weeks it should win and lose the weeks it should lose, which is exactly the kind of profile that makes a 54th-percentile finish feel inevitable rather than disappointing. The foundation is genuinely strong: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give this roster a backfield core that most managers in the Pokmon division would trade for without blinking, and the draft board rewarded patience with Cam Skattebo falling a full round and a half to RB20. The problem is that the margins separating Exebuka from the teams just above it are thin enough to feel maddening. The quarterback situation sits at average on its best day, with Trevor Lawrence projecting as a QB10 and Daniel Jones, a minor reach who cost nearly two rounds of draft capital early, checking in at QB25. Last season's 39 percent win rate was not a fluke of variance, it was a roster that played to its ceiling and landed just outside contention. This year looks like more of the same, and in a tournament where the middle of the field is the most crowded and competitive place to be, "more of the same" rarely moves the needle.

Gengardner Minshew has not assembled a roster so much as engineered a series of bets, and the through line is correlation. The architecture is unmistakable: Dak Prescott paired with George Pickens and Jake Ferguson, Jaxson Dart paired with Isaiah Likely, a manager who clearly believes the fastest path to a ceiling week is riding a quarterback and his weapons into the same scoring explosion. Pickens at WR10 is a legitimate alpha, Ferguson at TE12 was drafted a full round past his ADP, and Likely arrives in New York with John Harbaugh and a light tight end room that could turn him into something real. Brock Bowers at TE1 anchors the floor. The honest question is what happens when the stacks go cold, because the running back group tops out at Jaylen Warren at RB27 and offers little margin for error below him. This is a roster built like a trebuchet, aiming at the top of the field, fully aware that the mechanism either launches or it doesn't.

Bijanbasaur didn't need a lottery ticket to build a contender, just a willingness to show up and execute round after round. The foundation is Bijan Robinson at RB2, and the structure around him is what makes this roster genuinely dangerous at the 88th percentile of the field. Ashton Jeanty at RB7, Jeremiyah Love at RB13, and D'Andre Swift at RB24 were all drafted as starters, and Swift arrived a full round after his ADP suggested he would, which means Bijanbasaur got legitimate production at a discount. Baker Mayfield, taken more than a round after his ADP, adds a QB18 projection without the draft capital that usually buys one. The roster carries fourteen chalk picks, and in a format where most managers are hunting the clever angle, chalk that holds up is its own kind of discipline. A 2025 campaign that landed at 49th percentile in scoring gives this team something to prove, and the pieces are there to prove it.

There are no heists on this roster, no moments where jlee3485 outsmarted the room by a mile, and that is precisely the point. This is a draft built on discipline, five values spread quietly across the board and zero major reaches, the kind of card-playing that wins over a long season rather than a single lucky hand. De'Von Achane fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at RB6, a discount on a player who projects as a genuine difference-maker. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the receiving corps, and Tyler Warren, pulled a modest half-round early at TE4, pairs with Tucker Kraft to form a tight end tandem that most managers would envy. Kraft's preseason PUP stint raised eyebrows, but he cleared it before August and returns to a Packers offense where the receiver room thinned out, not thickened, creating the same conditions that had him ascending before his November injury. Third in the Pokmon division and sitting in the top 10 percent of the field, jlee3485 did not need a single flashy moment to build something worth watching.

HitMonAchane didn't win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a single audacious swing. They won it pick by pick, round by round, quietly building the kind of roster that sits in the 93rd percentile of the field. The foundation is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Nico Collins at WR9, and Malik Nabers at WR12, a trio of projected starters who give this team a ceiling most managers are drafting toward and never reaching. Lamar Jackson at QB3 sits atop a position group that also includes Jared Goff, who arrived a full round after his ADP and brings the kind of steady, weekly production that quietly wins matchups even if he'll never be anyone's league-winning lottery ticket. The value theme extends to David Njoku, secured a round and a half after his ADP, and Hunter Henry, each adding depth at a position where the field routinely overpays. Division-leading and projecting as the 23rd percentile team from a year ago, HitMonAchane looks like the team that did the boring thing brilliantly.

ALLENkazam arrives in the Pokmon division carrying what looks like an unfair concentration of talent at the positions that win fantasy tournaments. Josh Allen is simply QB1, the single most valuable player in the format, and he connects directly with Dalton Kincaid, a projected TE11 starter, giving this roster a stack that compounds both players' ceilings. From there, the receiver corps reads like a shopping list of legitimate starters: Drake London at WR7, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, Luther Burden at WR22, and Carnell Tate at WR29, four players who would headline most rosters in this field, all on the same one. Harold Fannin slots in as a TE6 who came at a mild discount, and the drafting throughout was disciplined, fourteen picks at chalk with no major reaches anywhere on the board. The 2025 season was a rough one at 33 percent wins, but this roster bears almost no resemblance to that version. At 93rd percentile in the tournament and second in the division, ALLENkazam is built on a simple premise: when your best players are this good, everything else is noise.
