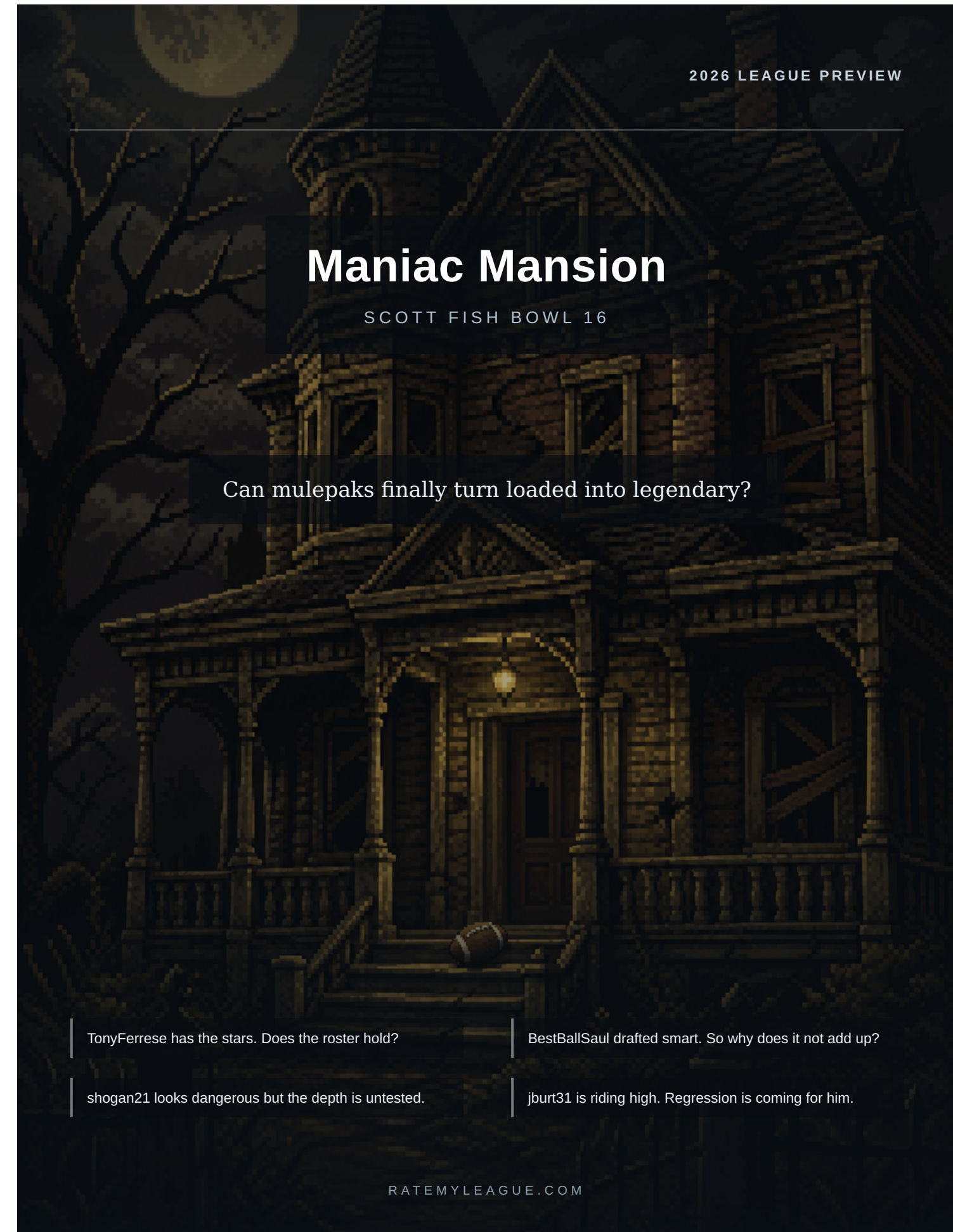

Dfens finished 16th percentile in scoring last year and somehow responded by drafting worse. The numbers here are damning: eight major reaches across the roster, zero steals, and a receiver group assembled like someone was panic-buying before a storm. Christian Kirk came off the board 13.7 rounds before his ADP. Keon Coleman and Tank Dell were each pulled roughly ten rounds early. These are not aggressive bets on upside, they are the draft equivalent of paying full retail on marked-up merchandise nobody else wanted. The two genuine bright spots, Josh Allen and Lamar Jackson, give the team a legitimate QB foundation, but in a positionless format your starters are only as good as the players behind them, and what follows Allen and Jackson is a receiver corps where the projected starters are DK Metcalf at WR36 and Chris Godwin at WR38, both reached, and the weakest projected starter on the entire roster is Marvin Mims, a player with no current ranking at all. DMICmedia drafted like someone who had a list, loved the list, and refused to look up from the list no matter what the board was telling them. Three major reaches define this roster and none of them are defensible: Chris Olave at WR11 pulled two rounds before his ADP, Sam LaPorta at TE8 taken nearly two rounds early, and Malachi Fields at WR90 hauled in four rounds ahead of schedule as if DMICmedia was the only team in the building who knew his name. The reach pattern is not a quirk, it is a philosophy, and the philosophy cost real draft capital on player after player who simply was not worth the pick at that spot. The predictable result is a roster that projects 11th in Maniac Mansion and lands in the 1st percentile of the entire field, which is a number so bleak it almost loops back around to impressive. Almost. Coming off a 33 percent win rate in 2025, DMICmedia had every reason to draft carefully. The evidence suggests they did not get that memo either.

Xndrcrewz is sitting at 6th percentile in the tournament field, which is less a projection than a confession. The draft tells the story cleanly: three major reaches, four minor reaches, zero steals, and a single value on the entire board. That value, Tucker Kraft at TE5, arrived because the market handed him over at 5.12, not because of any particular genius at the table. Meanwhile, Jaydon Blue was yanked off the board 6.5 rounds before the rest of the field thought he was worth touching, and Elijah Sarratt got the same treatment, taken 4.2 rounds early into a roster that already needed something better than WR98 depth. Joe Burrow at QB4 and Harold Fannin at TE6 give this team a real foundation, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack has genuine upside, but reaching on Burrow at 1.12 when the field valued him at 2.05 set the tone for everything that followed. When your weakest projected starter is Jalen Coker at WR55 and you spent your late capital on players the market had buried, Maniac Mansion may be a more fitting address than intended.

BestBallSaul drafted with the patience of someone who actually read the manual. Fourteen chalk picks, three genuine values, and a steal in Bryce Young at 15.03 when his ADP sat at 11.08 suggest a manager who let the board come to them and collected players at fair-to-friendly prices. The problem is that discipline in the draft room does not guarantee a roster that adds up, and sitting ninth in Maniac Mansion at the 39th percentile suggests this one does not. The wide receiver group looks strong on paper, with A.J. Brown at WR8 and George Pickens at WR10 projecting as legitimate starters, and the Drake Maye and Brown stack gives the team a ceiling worth respecting. But the projected starters thin out quickly after that, and the weakest projected starter is Jadarian Price at RB26, a player who was himself taken as a value. When a value pick is also your floor, the math is unforgiving.

BestBallSaul played the game correctly and still landed in the wrong place, which is the specific kind of outcome that makes this hobby maddening.

Last year jburt31 went 30-6 and scored in the 100th percentile, which is the kind of season that gets you a reputation you then have to live up to. The 2026 roster suggests that will be harder than the résumé implies. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, and Zay Flowers at WR16, all projected starters, and the depth behind them is real. But receivers alone do not win in a positionless format, and the supporting cast gives reason for pause. Sam Darnold checks in at QB21, Aaron Rodgers at QB29, and the most viable starter at tight end is George Kittle at TE9, a fine player propped up by a TE11 in Dalton Kincaid and a TE17 in Brenton Strange. That is a roster built wide rather than tall. The draft was almost entirely chalk, sixteen picks at or near ADP, with nothing to suggest the kind of market inefficiency that fuels a historic run. Sitting 8th in the division and at the 50th percentile in the field, jburt31 is a cautionary tale about how fast last year's ceiling becomes this year's baseline.

Gkritikos sits at 57th percentile and seventh in the division, which is exactly where a roster like this belongs: capable of beating anyone on a good week, unlikely to run through the bracket on pure talent. The foundation is real. Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and James Cook (RB5) give this team a ceiling that most managers here would take, and Chase Brown (RB11) was a genuine value at pick 4.05, falling nearly a full round past his ADP. That trio alone makes the scoring floor comfortable. The tension is at the other end of the lineup, where Jaylen Warren (RB27) projects as the weakest starter and the receiver group thins out fast after Malik Nabers (WR12). Bo Nix (QB15) is the kind of quarterback who keeps the lights on, but the path to a deep run probably requires him to take the step from reliable volume passer to something more efficient. Gkritikos went 67 percent last season. The margins were kind then. Whether they stay kind is the whole question.

41Swish didn't need a lottery ticket to build a contender in Maniac Mansion, just a draft that kept finding the right price. Trevor Lawrence at QB10 fell a full round past his ADP, and Fernando Mendoza slid even further, giving the roster a legitimate depth option without sacrificing real value elsewhere. Meanwhile, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Trey McBride at TE2 anchor the starting lineup with the kind of top-end talent that separates genuine threats from paper tigers, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 means the position stays dangerous even when McBride has a quiet week. The receiver group runs deep enough that Jayden Reed at WR48 is the projected weakest starter, which is a fine floor to build from. The Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack adds a connected ceiling piece, and reaching 0.8 rounds early for Egbuka at WR18 looks more like conviction than impatience. Sitting at 77th percentile overall, 41Swish isn't the loudest name in the room, but the draft was clean, disciplined, and quietly difficult to beat.

TonyFerrese did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to gamble. This roster reads like a masterclass in disciplined drafting: fifteen chalk picks, four values, one steal, and not a single reach anywhere on the board. The foundation is exactly what it should be, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Brock Bowers at TE1, two projected positional cornerstones anchoring a lineup that already has four other projected starters at receiver alone. The steal belongs to Brian Robinson, who fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and landed at RB45, which is the kind of quiet heist that wins tournaments in February. Then there is the Kyler Murray situation, which is genuinely interesting. Murray lands in Minnesota carrying a lisfranc that reportedly never healed right, nominally in a competition with JJ McCarthy, but the prevailing read is that it is Murray's job to lose, and TonyFerrese pairs him directly with Jefferson in a stack that could detonate on any given week. Fifth in the Maniac Mansion division and 79th percentile in the field, this team is built to run deep, and nothing in the construction gives you a reason to argue otherwise.

There are drafts that leave you hunting for something to criticize, and shogan21's 2026 board is one of them. The foundation is immovable: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Caleb Williams at QB6 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in this field would trade their whole bench to touch. From there, shogan21 simply kept adding value, landing seven picks at or better than market price, including Jeremiyah Love at RB13 a full round after his ADP suggested he'd be gone. The Luther Burden connection to Williams is where it gets genuinely exciting, because Burden isn't just a name to stack around, he's a player who closed 2025 averaging a 53 percent snap share over eight games and pacing toward 1,000 receiving yards, with Ben Johnson now publicly comparing him to Amon-Ra St. Brown. That kind of trajectory backed by a QB6 stack is not a gamble, it's infrastructure. At 87th percentile in the field and sitting fourth in Maniac Mansion, shogan21 has the kind of clean, disciplined build that doesn't need explaining. It speaks for itself.

OilersBO didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by being right over and over again. Breece Hall fell a full round and a half past his ADP before OilersBO scooped him up at RB14, and Bucky Irving slid similarly to land as a projected starter at RB21. Those aren't lottery tickets, they're the quiet compounding of a manager who recognized market inefficiencies and acted on them without flinching. At the top of the roster, Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2 and Kenneth Walker III comes in at RB10, the kind of anchors that make every downstream decision easier. The draft chart shows 14 chalk picks and only a single minor reach, which tells you OilersBO wasn't forcing anything or getting cute, just building steadily from a position of patience. The 2025 résumé backs up the approach: 92nd percentile in scoring, an 86 percent win rate, finishing second in Maniac Mansion and in the 90th percentile of the field heading into 2026. This is what a well-constructed roster looks like when nobody's trying to be a hero.

RyanCumm sits third in Maniac Mansion and in the top 10 percent of the field, and when you look at the draft that built this roster, neither number surprises you. The headline is Jayden Daniels, a QB5 projection snagged at pick 5.02 when his ADP sat at 2.12, a two-round freefall that borders on embarrassing for whoever passed on him. Paired with Justin Herbert, who gets a genuine schematic boost from incoming coordinator Mike McDaniel after a few years of watching his pass volume quietly erode under Harbaugh's ball-control identity, RyanCumm has real insurance at the position. Below that, Jahmyr Gibbs checks in as the RB1 projection, De'Von Achane came in slightly past his ADP at RB6, and Derrick Henry fell nearly a full round to land at RB12. The draft chart reads like a disciplined exercise in patience, with four values and one outright steal and not a single reach anywhere on the board. This roster was built correctly, and the results reflect it.

mulepaks sits atop Maniac Mansion and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built the way a good SFB draft should be built: disciplined, patient, and rewarded for it. Six values across the board, zero reaches, zero regrets. The headliners are obvious. Ashton Jeanty (RB7) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) give this team a thunderous top end, but the real craftsmanship shows up in the middle rounds, where mulepaks collected Jalen Hurts (QB9) a full round after his ADP and Kyren Williams (RB15) more than a round late. Dak Prescott (QB7) fell nearly a round and a half before this team happily scooped him. Puka Nacua (WR1) anchors the receiver group, and Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) arriving more than a round past his ADP is exactly the kind of late-round correction that separates clean drafts from lucky ones. The floor here is high, the ceiling is higher, and there is almost nothing to criticize. Sometimes a team just gets it right.
