steaminbeaman22 drafted like someone who fell in love with a position and refused to stop, piling up Harold Fannin, Sam LaPorta, Travis Kelce, Brenton Strange, and Chigoziem Okonkwo while the rest of the board dried up around them. Fannin was taken 1.4 rounds early, LaPorta nearly two rounds early, and none of it translates into a competitive edge in a positionless format where you can only start what you start. The receiver corps tells the real story: Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 is the top option, and projected starter Jayden Reed at WR48 is the weakest projected starter on the entire roster. Zero steals, zero values, and five major reaches summarize a draft that had no margin for error and used every bit of it badly. A 56th percentile scoring season in 2025 suggested a team that was fine, not good, and this draft did nothing to close that gap. The division rank of third and a tournament percentile in the bottom five percent confirm it. There is no spin available here.

Renee28 enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Mario Division and in the 12th percentile of the field, which is roughly where the math says they belong. The core problem is simple: the receiver group is a mess. Mike Evans checks in at WR27, Chris Godwin at WR38, and Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, a trio that would struggle to carry a contender even on their best days, and Renee28 reached 2.4 rounds early to get Robinson in the first place. Cooper Kupp, taken nearly four rounds before his ADP, slots in at WR88, meaning the draft capital spent chasing receiver help bought almost nothing. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Derrick Henry at RB12 are genuinely good, and Drake Maye projects as QB2, so the roster is not without life. But this is a team that came in 23rd percentile in scoring in 2025, posted a 42 percent win rate, and made no obvious corrections on draft day. The lever Renee28 needed to pull was receiver quality. They pulled it and the handle came off in their hand.

ElJefe1977 lands at 30th percentile and dead last in the Mario Division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headline is a pair of strong tight ends in Trey McBride and Tyler Warren, which sounds like an asset until you look at everything surrounding them and realize it was not a plan but a symptom. McBride was a minor reach at 1.02, Warren was a minor reach at 2.11, and those early investments left ElJefe1977 scrambling for quarterback value that never materialized. Bo Nix projects as a QB15, Jacoby Brissett as a QB28, and Carson Beck, pulled a staggering 7.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, sits at QB40, which means the most aggressive quarterback move on the board produced the worst projected quarterback on the roster. The receiver group is deep enough on paper, but the projected weakest starter is Romeo Doubs at WR53, and with zero steals and three major reaches scattered across this draft, ElJefe1977 paid a premium for a floor, not a ceiling.

JSorrentino enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Mario Division and at just the 35th tournament percentile, which is less a starting point and more a verdict. The roster's clearest strength, Jalen Hurts, is also its clearest anxiety: Hurts projects as QB9, a genuinely useful asset in a positionless format, but the offseason departure of A.J. Brown to New England puts his passing game under a microscope it has never really faced before, and if Philadelphia's offense sputters, the rushing touchdowns that have propped up five consecutive top-10 fantasy finishes could evaporate too. That's a lot of weight sitting on one uncertain foundation. Beyond Hurts, the draft offered little relief: two major reaches, zero steals, and a receiver group headlined by Jaylen Waddle (WR23), Davante Adams (WR25), and D.J. Moore (WR26) that sounds impressive until you notice three projected starters bunched between WR23 and WR26 with limited separation from the field below them. JSorrentino came in at 44 percent wins last season and nothing on this sheet suggests the math changes much in 2026.

TheFantasyGirl played the draft about as well as you can play it without actually winning anything. Christian McCaffrey fell to 2.01 while his ADP sat at 1.09, a genuine gift. Zay Flowers projects as WR16, Malik Nabers as WR12, and CeeDee Lamb as WR5, all projected starters built on a foundation of patience and reasonable timing. The problem is that none of it quite coheres into a dangerous team. The roster lands at 39th percentile in the tournament and eighth in the Mario Division, which is the kind of outcome that makes a drafter feel like they followed every rule and still lost the argument. Jake Ferguson was reached for nearly two and a half rounds early at pick 5.12, which is the one moment the discipline cracked, and it matters because Ferguson projects as TE12 while Kyle Pitts and George Kittle are both already projected starters ahead of him. TheFantasyGirl did the work. The draft rewarded it correctly on paper. The standings just do not know that yet, and may not bother finding out.

Suit1995 finished 2026 in 17th percentile territory last year and the 2026 roster, slotting in at seventh in the Mario Division and just the 41st percentile of the field, does not scream "turnaround." The clearest problem is at receiver, where the group grades out as weak and the projected top starter is Jakobi Meyers at WR45, which is a polite way of saying the passing game support is held together with tape and optimism. Josh Allen and Joe Burrow sitting at QB1 and QB4 respectively is legitimately elite, but in a positionless format, elite quarterback play only carries you so far when the surrounding cast is this thin at the skill positions. The one lottery ticket worth scratching is Bhayshul Tuten, now the presumptive lead back in Jacksonville after Travis Etienne departed for New Orleans, but even that upside comes wrapped in "cautious optimism" rather than certainty. Two major reaches in the draft on Kimani Vidal and Kaytron Allen, neither of whom grades above RB60, suggests Suit1995 swung for depth and missed. There is no obvious lever left to pull here.

Last year, LuukGx finished in the bottom 13 percent of the field in scoring, a season best forgotten. The 2026 roster reads like a direct answer to that misery. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give this team a pair of bonafide top-tier anchors, the kind of names that show up in deep playoff runs. Chris Olave at WR11 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 push the upside further, while Jeremiyah Love at RB13 looks like genuine draft value, taken a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he would go. The overall draft was heavy on chalk, which is not a crime when the chalk is this good. At 58th percentile in projected scoring, LuukGx is not a championship favorite, but sitting sixth in the Mario Division represents a clean break from the floor that collapsed beneath them in 2025. The ceiling is real. Whether the floor holds is the only honest question left to ask.

GirlFantasyFB didn't make headlines on draft day, and that might be exactly the point. This is a roster built on consistent execution, the kind where you scroll through the picks and keep nodding. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and A.J. Brown at WR8 anchor the whole operation, and Brown's situation in New England is genuinely worth getting excited about: Drake Maye coming off an MVP runner-up season, a receiver of Brown's caliber as the clear first option, and the only real caveat being his durability history. When he's on the field, the ceiling is real. Tucker Kraft at TE5 adds another projected starter who fell nearly two rounds past his ADP, a quiet win that compounds nicely with an already strong top end. The draft leaned chalk, which isn't a knock when the chalk includes a WR3 and a WR8 anchoring your lineup. Sitting at 65th percentile and fourth in the Mario Division, GirlFantasyFB has the kind of roster that doesn't need to get lucky. It just needs to stay healthy.

MustangSal2006 landed at the 65th percentile this year, and the honest question is whether the draft was brilliant or just stubborn enough to work out. The board shows four major reaches, which is not a small number, yet the roster that resulted has Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchoring a genuinely strong backfield, Nico Collins at WR9 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 giving the receiving corps real teeth, and a projected starter group that holds up when you look at it plainly. The reach that deserves the most scrutiny is Juwan Johnson, taken nearly two full rounds early to land a TE20, which is a thin return on that kind of draft capital. Michael Pittman is the wild card, a new system with Aaron Rodgers at 43 alongside DK Metcalf on an offense still figuring out who it is, and Pittman's ceiling depends entirely on that identity question getting answered. What MustangSal2006 has built

is a roster that punches above its draft behavior, which is either vindication or a very fortunate accident, and only October will settle that argument.

andrewtodd98 didn't build this roster with one splashy move. They built it by being right, repeatedly, across 18 rounds. Five players landed as good value, meaning they fell past their ADP and andrewtodd98 was simply there to scoop them up, against zero major reaches and just one minor one. The results are hard to argue with: Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and De'Von Achane (RB6) anchor the lineup as genuine top-tier fantasy assets, while Justin Herbert (QB8) arriving in the fourth round when his ADP said third is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season. Isaiah Likely (TE13) is another example, taken nearly two rounds after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, and the situation around him in New York is genuinely interesting, following John Harbaugh to a tight end room with real opportunity. George Pickens (WR10) rounds out a starting core that would make most managers envious. Third in the division and 70th percentile tournament-wide, this team earned its standing the honest way.

Luke Renton built this roster the way a good chef seasons food: nothing flashy, just everything tasting right by the time it hits the table. The draft ledger reads 17 chalk picks against zero reaches, and the two players who did fall past their ADP happen to be Justin Jefferson and Keaton Mitchell, which is the kind of quiet fortune that compounds. Jefferson at WR6 is the engine, and with A.J. Brown now gone to New England, DeVonta Smith finally gets to answer the question everyone has been asking since he came into the league: can he be a true alpha receiver? If the answer is yes, Renton gets to watch that breakout happen from a front-row seat with Smith projected as a WR14 starter. Anchor those two to Brock Bowers at TE1 and a running back group that starts with Chase Brown at RB11 and Kyren Williams at RB15, and you have a roster that never needed one spectacular moment to come together. It just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick, and that is why Renton sits second in the Mario Division and in the 87th percentile of the field.

NFLDFSPICKS sits atop the Mario Division and checks in at the 95th percentile of the field, and neither number came from one lucky swing. It came from a draft that kept finding market inefficiencies, round after round. Puka Nacua, the WR1 in the field, came off the board at 1.05 when his ADP was 1.01, a slim gap that still counts as value at that price. James Cook landed at 2.08 despite an ADP of 2.04, and Rashee Rice fell more than a full round to land at 5.05. The draft really shined later, though, with Bucky Irving tumbling more than two rounds past his ADP to arrive at 9.05 as the RB21. On top of all that, the Matthew Stafford and Nacua stack gives this team a connected scoring engine when things click. Trevor Lawrence, projected QB10, adds a complementary option after a career year that proved he can carry a passing game even when the supporting cast around him stays murky. This roster earned its ranking, one quiet, correct pick at a time.
