There is not much mystery to the Maye Day Missles' 2026 outlook, and that is precisely the problem. The roster grades out at the 11th percentile of the field and sits 12th in the Mario Division, and the draft did almost nothing to change that trajectory, producing zero steals and a nearly all-chalk board that offered little upside. Drake Maye and Joe Burrow give the team a genuinely strong quarterback picture, and Chris Olave at WR11 and Zay Flowers at WR16 provide a credible top-end skill group, but below that tier the roster gets thin in a hurry. The projected starters beyond that core cluster around replacement-level range, and the weakest projected starter, Chigoziem Okonkwo at TE19, is the lone real value find on the board. Coming off a 39 percent win rate in 2025, this team needed a draft that swung for fences. Instead, it played it safe and came home with chalk dust on its hands and a roster that projects to finish exactly where it looks: near the bottom.

There is no sugarcoating what smac3138 is walking into. Sitting 11th in the Mario Division and in just the 23rd percentile of the field, this roster grades out as one of the tournament's quieter disasters, and the draft decisions that built it offer little comfort. The most glaring problem is Brock Purdy, taken nearly two rounds before his ADP and projecting as QB13, a reach that cost real capital without buying elite upside. Kyle Monangai is a similar story, grabbed 2.2 rounds early and projecting as RB33, the weakest projected starter on the roster. Against those missteps, the good news is real but limited: Jonathan Taylor projects as RB4 and is a legitimate anchor, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 arrived as a genuine value. The problem is that a 2025 campaign that produced a 6-30 record and fifth-percentile scoring demands more than two bright spots. Taylor and Walker are a foundation, not a rescue plan, and right now smac3138 is building on sand.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes from watching a team coast on a reputation it no longer quite deserves. RyAnF3514 finished in the 95th percentile last season, went 26-10, and scored 5122 points, and none of that matters now because the 2026 roster is sitting at the 25th percentile and ranked 10th in the Mario Division. The backfield is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a legitimate foundation, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 and Bucky Irving at RB21 add genuine depth behind them. But the receiving corps is where last year's version of this team and this year's part ways quietly and painfully. Davante Adams at WR25 is the top option, followed by Courtland Sutton at WR37, and then the names get thin fast. Two major reaches in the draft, Jared Goff pulled four rounds before his ADP and Keenan Allen taken nearly four and a half rounds early, suggest a manager who felt the gap and tried to paper over it rather than solve it.

Griddy Gang enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Mario Division and in just the 36th tournament percentile, and the draft did not exactly light a path out of the basement. The roster carries three major reaches, including Trevor Lawrence pulled 1.3 rounds early at QB10, and the back end of the depth chart is littered with dart throws on Malachi Fields and Elijah Sarratt that cost a combined ten rounds of draft capital beyond their consensus value. The bright spots are real, Trey McBride at TE2 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this team a legitimate top shelf, but the projected starters drop off fast enough to make that ceiling feel decorative. Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter, just crossed 1,000 yards for the first time in his career and relocated to Tennessee, where he now competes for targets with a Titans offense that burned the fourth overall pick on Carnell Tate. When your floor depends on a receiver fighting for his job in a crowded new offense, there is no obvious lever left to pull.

P86 drafted with patience and discipline, waiting for the market to come to them, and they still landed in the 41st percentile of the field. That is the kind of outcome that makes you question the whole exercise. The values were real: Zach Charbonnet fell more than two rounds past his ADP, Rachaad White slipped more than a round, T.J. Hockenson came cheap. Every one of those picks was correct in isolation. The problem is that Charbonnet projects as RB42, White as RB39, and Hockenson as TE23, and being right about process does not pay the bills when the players themselves are merely serviceable. The foundation is genuinely strong, Brock Bowers at TE1, Saquon Barkley at RB8, Jayden Daniels at QB5, and the Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds a meaningful bonus. But the roster thins out quickly after that top tier, and with a division rank of eighth and a field percentile of 41st, the projections are already delivering their verdict. P86 did the homework and got a C anyway.

rrugs drafted with discipline. Three values, fourteen chalk picks, zero major reaches, which is the kind of draft sheet that earns a nod from the analytics crowd. And yet the team sits 7th in the Mario Division and checks in at just the 42nd percentile, which is the cruel math of getting the process right and the outcomes wrong anyway. The top of the roster is real: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team a genuine foundation, and Drake London at WR7 means the projected starters are not asking for charity. The problem is that the depth required to actually compete fades fast, and KC Concepcion at WR50 is the weakest projected starter, a player whose upside depends heavily on whether Cleveland ever solves quarterback, which has historically been a losing bet. rrugs found value where it existed and still wound up here, one round short of a coherent thing, which is somehow worse than just drafting badly.

derekevan18 sits at 42nd percentile and sixth in the Mario Division, which is basically the dictionary definition of "not yet eliminated, not yet dangerous." The pillars are real: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this roster a legitimate ceiling, and the Patrick Mahomes / Travis Kelce stack layers in the kind of correlated upside that can steal a week. But this is a team where the margins bite back. Kyler Murray, projected QB19, arrives in Minnesota carrying a lisfranc injury that cost him most of last season, now fighting for a starting job he's expected to win but hasn't secured, which means derekevan18 is banking on a quarterback whose health question mark hasn't fully dissolved. Meanwhile, the draft leaned heavily on chalk, produced just one steal in RJ Harvey late in round 12, and burned a pick on C.J. Stroud nearly three rounds early. The core is good enough to win this division. Whether the supporting cast holds its end of the deal is the whole season.

FFMonsters finished 25-11 last season and enters 2026 sitting fifth in the Mario Division, which is the kind of result that makes a manager either humble or dangerous. Based on this draft, the answer is clearly dangerous. The board shows three major reaches and two minor ones, zero steals, zero values, thirteen chalk picks, and yet the roster that came out the other side projects as genuinely good. Caleb Williams lands as QB6, taken almost a full round early, and he is already stacked with Luther Burden in what should be a productive pairing. Puka Nacua checks in as WR1, Jeremiyah Love as RB13, and the projected starters hold up throughout. The one thread worth watching is Jalen Hurts, a QB9 projection who lost AJ Brown to New England this offseason and now faces real questions about whether his passing can carry the load if the Eagles offense sputters. Five straight top-10 fantasy finishes buy a lot of goodwill, but goodwill does not score points. For FFMonsters, the draft worked. The season is where the conviction gets tested.

FantasyDerek built this roster the way a good poker player wins pots, not by chasing the big bluff but by consistently getting slightly the better of every exchange. The draft logged three values against just two minor reaches and zero major ones, a quiet efficiency that adds up over 20 rounds. Lamar Jackson at QB3 anchors the whole operation, and the Lamar Jackson / Mark Andrews stack gives Derek a built-in multiplier on big Baltimore passing days. Andrews himself was a value, slipping past his ADP by more than a round before Derek scooped him at TE14. Up top, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 give the starting lineup genuine upside without any magical thinking required. The 2025 campaign, a 56 percent win rate and 60th-percentile scoring, suggests a team that grinds, and the 2026 roster looks like the same philosophy executed a notch sharper. Fourth in the Mario Division is not where this roster deserves to finish.

stathole landed in the top quarter of the Scott Fish Bowl field, sitting third in the Mario Division, and the roster genuinely earns that standing. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, James Cook at RB5, and Chase Brown at RB11 form a backfield foundation that most managers would sign for without blinking. The argument starts when you look at how stathole built around it. Three major reaches dot this draft sheet, and two of them are quarterbacks nobody else was racing to the podium for: Tua Tagovailoa at QB31 and Deshaun Watson at QB34, each taken roughly three and a half rounds before the market agreed. Blake Corum, projected as the weakest starter on the roster at RB35, was grabbed three rounds early as well. None of it fits the profile of a disciplined drafter working the board. All of it produced a roster that plays. That is the uncomfortable truth stathole has to live with this season, the kind of truth that looks like genius until the moment it looks like something else entirely.

ahofener didn't build this roster on one flashy swing. He built it by winning the margins, and the margins add up. The anchor is Bijan Robinson at RB2, a genuinely elite projection that sets the floor for the whole team, and surrounding him are a series of plays that just kept coming out right. D'Andre Swift landed at RB24 a full round after his ADP suggested he would, and Tyrone Tracy fell more than two rounds past expectations at RB43. Neither one is a lottery ticket, they're just good players who were available later than they should have been. The receiving corps tells a similar story: A.J. Brown at WR8 and George Pickens at WR10 are both projected starters doing real work, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 adds a third name worth rostering without apology. The quarterback situation is the one honest caveat, with Matthew Stafford projecting as QB14 and nothing behind him that inspires confidence, but in a positionless format you field your best ten, and ahofener's best ten are very good. Second in the division and 80th percentile overall is the projection. It feels right.

AndrewSF didn't win the Mario Division with a single splashy move. This roster was built pick by pick, advantage by advantage, and it shows. The clearest example is the top of the board: Josh Allen landed at 1.09 despite an ADP of 1.05, and Justin Jefferson slid to 2.04 despite going off the board closer to 1.12 in most rooms. That's two of the most valuable assets in the format secured at a collective discount, which is roughly the equivalent of finding a fifty-dollar bill in a coat you forgot you owned. From there, AndrewSF stacked the roster with projected starters like Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), Jameson Williams (WR21), Carnell Tate (WR29), and Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31), building the kind of depth where the weakest projected starter is Quentin Johnston at WR41. Late reaches on Ray Davis and Sean Tucker are the one wrinkle worth watching, but they barely register against a 94th-percentile projection and a division title already in hand. This team looks like last year's 99th-percentile scorer for a reason.
