There is no kind way to frame what BroncoNix did in this draft, so let's not try. Seven major reaches across 20 rounds is not bad luck, it is a decision-making crisis, and the results show it. The most damning exhibit is Bo Nix, drafted at 3.12 as though he were a QB5, only to project as QB15, a full two rounds of value vaporized on a quarterback who does not crack the top 14 at his own position. Hunter Henry went in the eighth as though someone had mistaken him for a top-five tight end, and he projects as TE18. Meanwhile, the one genuine asset on the roster, Tyler Warren at TE4, fell to BroncoNix at 4.01, meaning the board was practically handing out answers and this team still found a way to get most of them wrong. With Romeo Doubs, a projected WR53, penciled in as a starter, and a division rank of last, BroncoNix is not a work in progress. It is the finished product, and that is the problem.

TheElksHerd sits 11th in Division E and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how it got there: zero steals, zero values worth bragging about, and three major reaches scattered across the board like evidence at a crime scene. The most damaging of those reaches is Josh Jacobs, grabbed RB16 a full 2.2 rounds before the market agreed with that valuation, and that was before an offseason arrest complicated his availability entirely. Even setting aside the legal cloud, overpaying for Jacobs at pick 3.10 would have been questionable on a clean roster. Then there is Mac Jones, a QB39 taken five full rounds early, which is not scouting ahead of the curve so much as it is drafting from a different sport. The one genuine find on this board, Juwan Johnson at TE20, amounts to a single bright tile in a mosaic that is mostly broken pieces. Lamar Jackson anchors the squad and the Jackson-Mark Andrews stack provides a floor, but the rest of this roster reads like a draft day that got away from its manager and never looked back.

DJ Daniel Daniels sits 10th in Division E and in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is real, a genuine anchor, but beyond that top-line talent the board tells a story of a manager who kept reaching and kept missing. Daniel Jones, a QB25, was pulled three rounds early. James Conner, a RB56, came off the board three rounds before his time. Tory Horton, a WR93, got the same treatment, three rounds of draft capital evaporating on a player who projects as a deep-bench afterthought. Zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches across a 20-round draft is not bad luck, it is a pattern. The projected starter group leans on Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 to prop up what Chase cannot carry alone, while Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47 sits as the weakest projected starter, which is a quiet indictment of how thin the upside gets once you scroll past the top names. Chase deserved a better owner this year.

GBallerz18 sits at 21st percentile heading into 2026, and the draft board offers little reason for optimism. The roster is not without names worth respecting, Josh Allen and Omarion Hampton project as genuine assets, but the draft process behind them was largely chalk with almost no value generation across 18 picks. Zero steals. Zero values. When the margin for error is that thin, you need the picks you did make to land cleanly, and GBallerz18 repeatedly paid a premium for players who did not require one. Travis Etienne, taken 1.4 rounds early, is a RB18 projection. J.K. Dobbins, the projected weakest starter on this roster, was reached for 1.7 rounds ahead of his ADP. Colby Parkinson, a TE31, was pulled 2.7 rounds early in what stands as the draft's most puzzling moment. There is no late-round sleeper quietly holding this thing together, no stolen value waiting to announce itself. GBallerz18 paid market price for an average roster and above-market price for the parts that weren't.

DoinItTheElway enters 2026 sitting eighth in the division and projected at just the 35th tournament percentile, and the roster does not hide why. Justin Jefferson is a genuine WR6 anchor and Trey McBride checks in as TE2, so there are real pieces here, but the margin for error evaporates quickly after those two. Jalen Hurts grades out as the QB9, which is fine, but his backup option is C.J. Stroud at QB22, the team's single weakest projected starter. The draft did not generate much cushion either: fifteen chalk picks, two major reaches, and only one steal across the whole board. Parker Washington was yanked 2.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Keenan Allen was taken nearly five rounds early, meaning this manager paid premium prices for WR35 and WR99 production. Jefferson and McBride can carry a lineup on their best weeks, but when the supporting cast is asking them to do that every single week, that is less a strategy and more a prayer.

AlyV sits at the 55th percentile and seventh in the division, which tells you almost everything: this is a team built to compete, not to dominate. The engine is real. De'Von Achane at RB6, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Kyren Williams at RB15 give the lineup genuine week-to-week floor, and Puka Nacua landing as WR1 while slipping to pick 1.05 was the kind of quiet fortune that shapes seasons. Patrick Mahomes at QB12 and Jared Goff at QB16 were both taken well past their ADP, adding depth without cost. But the margins are thin precisely where they matter most. The receiver group beyond Nacua fades quickly, with Michael Wilson at WR39 as the next reliable name before the rankings fall off sharply. Tony Pollard projects as the weakest projected starter at RB30, and Mason Taylor at TE35 contributes almost nothing. AlyV will not lose to a bad roster. The question is whether this one is good enough when the schedule stops cooperating.

Bowlguy didn't swing for the fences on one transformative pick, but pick by pick this roster quietly won the room. The clearest evidence is in the receiver group, where Jameson Williams came off the board nearly two rounds after his ADP and Rashee Rice slipped past a full round late, gifting Bowlguy a projected WR21 and WR13 at a collective discount that would make a coupon-clipper blush. Those aren't consolation prizes either, both are projected starters. Jahmyr Gibbs lands as the projected RB1 and anchors what is genuinely one of the better top-end backfields in the field. Yes, Jaxson Dart was taken 2.4 rounds ahead of his ADP at the third pick, and Chuba Hubbard cost two rounds of premium as well, so this roster isn't without its inefficiencies. But the overall draft math still leans in Bowlguy's favor, and landing at the 67th percentile with a group this competitive at the top suggests the foundation is real. Division E should take notice.

PK17 sits at 68th percentile in the field, which is a decent outcome, but the more interesting story is how they got there. The draft log shows two major reaches and two minor ones, zero steals, and just one genuine value across the entire board. That is not the profile of a manager who let the draft come to them. Fernando Mendoza, taken 3.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Trey Benson, pulled 4.9 rounds early, are the kinds of moves that get you roasted in draft reviews. And yet here is the roster: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Saquon Barkley at RB8, Joe Burrow at QB4 stacking cleanly with Tee Higgins at WR19, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 sitting in the lineup as a legitimate starter. Those are real players. The reaches at Mendoza and Benson may never pay off, but the top of this roster was built with conviction on names that mattered, and the standings will reflect that a lot more than the ADP spreadsheet will.

scoobuar didn't build this roster on one flashy move. The draft reads like a series of quiet, correct decisions made over and over again. The tight end group is the clearest example: Colston Loveland (TE3), Sam LaPorta (TE8), and George Kittle (TE9) are all projected starters, and scoobuar landed Chigoziem Okonkwo (TE19) as the fourth piece, taken just slightly ahead of his ADP in a move that looks more like discipline than desperation. Meanwhile, the quarterback situation quietly punches above its weight. Caleb Williams (QB6) was the one reach on this board, taken about two-thirds of a round early, but Justin Herbert (QB8) came back as a genuine value, slipping nearly a round and a half past his ADP at 5.03. Those two alone give scoobuar real options at the position. The Williams-Loveland stack adds a bonus layer of connectivity. Sitting at 77th percentile tournament-wide and fourth in Division E, this roster isn't chasing upside on prayers. It just keeps being right.

JSN Messenger lands at 78th percentile and third in the division, and the draft sheet is almost embarrassingly clean: zero reaches, three steals, four values, and a floor of discipline that most SFB managers would trade their top pick for. The foundation starts with Christian McCaffrey and James Cook, a projected RB3 and RB5 who give this roster as high a ceiling at those slots as anyone in the field. From there, the value picks do the quiet work. Nico Collins slipped nearly a full round past his ADP and lands as a projected WR9 starter. Luther Burden fell over a round to give JSN a projected WR22. Jordyn Tyson dropped more than two full rounds and still projects as a WR34 starter. That is not luck at three separate points in the draft, that is a manager reading the board and staying patient while others panicked. The weakest projected starter is Jaylen Warren at RB27, which is the kind of complaint that tells you everything about how well this roster was constructed.

Da Browns sit at 86th percentile in the field and second in Division E, and the draft record explains exactly why: four genuine values, one outright steal, and a roster built on consistently winning the moment rather than one lucky swing. The headline is the receiver group, where Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), A.J. Brown (WR8), and George Pickens (WR10) form a top end that most managers would trade their entire roster to own, and Pickens arriving a full round past his ADP makes that trio even sweeter. Tucker Kraft (TE5) adds another quiet win, sliding more than a round past his price after his ACL recovery, and the scouting picture around his return to Green Bay is genuinely encouraging given how few weapons the Packers retained at receiver. The Dak Prescott and Pickens stack layers in correlated upside on top of an already deep roster. The one blemish is Jalen Tolbert landing nearly seven rounds early, but at pick 17.09 that kind of optimism costs almost nothing. This team did not get lucky once. It just kept showing up ahead.

Calvins Johnson sits first in Division E and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, and the draft board tells you exactly why: no home-run swings, just round after round of coming out ahead. Trevor Lawrence landed at QB10 a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he would be gone. DeVonta Smith fell similarly, arriving as WR14 more than a round late. Marvin Harrison Jr. came in at WR33 nearly two rounds after the market said he should. None of those are lottery tickets, they are dependable starters acquired at a consistent discount, which is how you build a team that holds up over a long tournament rather than one that peaks and collapses. Brock Bowers as TE1 anchors the whole operation with the kind of positional advantage that quietly separates contenders from pretenders. Jadarian Price as the weakest projected starter at RB26 is not a flaw worth losing sleep over. When your floor looks like that, the ceiling takes care of itself.
