McCarthy, who ranks as QB16, and Geno Smith at QB26, they'll likely continue to offer the kind of leadership that's more "quarterback sneak" than "stealthy advancement." With a receiver lineup that could have been handpicked from a fantasy league highlight reel—featuring stars like Ladd McConkey (WR10) and Travis Hunter (WR12)—one might expect a meteoric rise; however, even the most dazzling wideouts can't compensate for the gaping chasm at tight end or the curious choice of Bhayshul Tuten (RB45) as a starting running back. Meanwhile, Ashton Jeanty provides a bright spot at RB4, a beacon among the muddle. Perhaps management was busy admiring their reflection when they

prematurely snagged players like Michael Pittman and Demario Douglas far ahead of their ADPs, ensuring any potential value was left on the draft room floor. So, as TheAman bravely aim to soar from the basement of the Maryland Terrapins division, one can only wonder if this year's strategy is less about winning and more about redefining what it means to finish in the top (or bottom) 12 percent.



The wide receiver corps, a middling unit within the division, features standout Malik Nabers at WR4 supported by veteran presence Mike Evans, Courtland Sutton, and Jauan Jennings. Notably, Evans's connection with Mayfield could provide key scoring opportunities.

However, Gsuss11's draft strategy raised eyebrows with considerable reaches on players like Quentin Johnston and Roman Wilson, potentially impacting the depth and flexibility needed over a long season. Still, if their gambles pay off, particularly in the form of breakout performances or strategic adjustments, Gsuss11 might climb the ranks and surprise both competitors and analysts alike.
