There is no flattering angle here. Hammer95 sits in the bottom 10 percent of the field heading into 2026, and the draft chart does not offer much comfort: two major reaches, zero steals, and a roster that grades out near the bottom of the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division. The foundation is real, Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give this team a legitimate top-end advantage at the position, and Jeremiyah Love, Javonte Williams, and Bucky Irving all project as starters. But the dart-board stuff at the back end is hard to ignore. Brandon Aiyuk projects at WR81 after being reached for nearly three rounds early, and Michael Pittman, the weakest projected starter on the board, is now asked to produce alongside DK Metcalf on a Pittsburgh offense still searching for an identity behind a 43-year-old Aaron Rodgers. That is not a depth chart that inspires confidence. Jackson and Burrow can carry a lineup on any given week, but in a field this deep, carrying the lineup every week is the only math that works for Hammer95, and there is no obvious lever left to pull if they cannot.

Kahoku's Squad went into the Scott Fish Bowl draft and somehow turned a gift into a grievance. The top of the roster is genuinely good, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, A.J. Brown at WR8, Chris Olave at WR11, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 forming a projected starting core that most managers would envy. But the draft log tells a damning story: zero steals, zero values, twelve picks at chalk, and three major reaches that read like a manager bidding against themselves at an empty auction. Brown himself was pulled at 2.01 with an ADP of 2.10, a reach of nearly a full round for a player who was coming to you anyway. Then the late rounds compounded the damage, Antonio Williams at WR64 grabbed nearly three rounds early, Ja'Kobi Lane at WR89 taken almost four rounds before consensus had him going. The floor never got built because the ceiling was paid for twice. A 31 percent win rate

and 13th percentile scoring in 2025 suggest this is a franchise pattern, not a fluke, and nothing about this draft argues the pattern is broken.

There is no charitable read available for RotoLounge, and the draft board confirms it. Five major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and it is a losing one. The most damning is Deshaun Watson at QB34, taken a full four rounds ahead of his ADP, a player so far down the quarterback rankings that he barely registers as a speculative hold, let alone a draft-day investment. Meanwhile, Bo Nix, a QB15 who led the league in pass attempts in 2025 and added Jaylen Waddle to his receiver room in Denver, was sitting there and RotoLounge still reached nearly two rounds early to get him, apparently unable to help themselves. The team lands at the 18th percentile in the tournament, 10th in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division, and the roster shape explains both numbers. Christian McCaffrey is real and the foundation is not worthless, but when Blake Corum is your weakest projected starter and you burned premium capital to get him there, the ceiling is already visible from the ground floor.

The 2026 Scott Fish Bowl is going to be a long autumn for daviGNR11. Sitting ninth in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division and projected at just the 24th percentile of the field, this roster is the product of a draft that went sideways early and never recovered. The damage starts with Ryan Flournoy, a WR69 taken nearly four full rounds before his ADP, the kind of move that either looks prescient in October or haunts a manager forever, and right now it looks like the latter. Jaylen Warren at RB27 came off the board 2.3 rounds ahead of schedule, and Kenneth Gainwell, the projected weakest starter on this roster, was grabbed 2.2 rounds early for the privilege of being a liability. Yes, Justin Jefferson and Amon-Ra St. Brown are legitimate, and the Murray-Jefferson stack gives this team a pulse, but five major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a pattern. daviGNR11 built a beautiful frame around a foundation of overpaid role players, and the structure is already leaning.

Solus Solution sits eighth in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division and right at the tournament median, which is a polite way of saying the roster is not bad enough to rebuild around and not good enough to scare anyone. The draft tells a quiet story: fourteen chalk picks, three minor reaches, and one major reach in Pat Bryant, taken three full rounds before his WR86 projection suggests he deserved to go. That kind of aggressive move on a fringe contributor is the sort of decision that can define a season negatively, not because Bryant alone sinks anything, but because it signals the manager was stretching to find upside that simply was not there. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a legitimate building block, and James Cook at RB5 gives the team a real foundation, but the drop-off from those two anchors to projected starters like Jayden Reed at WR48 is steep and obvious. There is no late-round heist on the ledger, no hidden value waiting to break out. What you see is what you get, and what you get grades out as below average.

Cmdr Shepards Favorite sits at 58th percentile, which is exactly as comfortable as it sounds: good enough to stay relevant, not good enough to feel safe. The engine here is Bijan Robinson (RB2) and George Pickens (WR10), two projected starters who give this roster genuine upside, and the Dak Prescott and Pickens stack adds the kind of correlation that can turn a decent week into a great one. But the margins are thin everywhere else. Zay Flowers (WR16) and Harold Fannin (TE6) round out a starting core that projects as quietly solid, and then the floor drops. Parker Washington (WR35) and Courtland Sutton (WR37) are contributors, not difference-makers, and Juwan Johnson (TE20) is the projected weakest starter on the roster. The draft offered little separation: 17 chalk picks, one major reach in Dontayvion Wicks (WR96), and only two genuine values. Last season this team finished at 62nd percentile scoring, and nothing here suggests a dramatic departure from that neighborhood. Robinson needs to be Robinson, and the stack needs to hit. When both happen, this team wins. When neither does, it quietly fades.

Showoff didn't reinvent anything in the draft room, just kept making the right call. The foundation is genuinely strong: Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, Jayden Daniels sits at QB5, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 gives this roster a top-end that holds up against anyone in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division. The question with Barkley is real, the Eagles have been talking about protecting him from the workloads that made him great, and at 29 coming off a statistical step back, his ceiling isn't what it was in 2024. But Daniels at QB5 helps offset that concern considerably, and the Jalen Hurts pickup as a projected QB9 at pick 4.08 when his ADP was 3.12 is exactly the kind of quiet win that separates good drafts from forgettable ones. The Fernando Mendoza reach at nearly four rounds early is the one moment worth raising an eyebrow at, but one overpay in a draft this consistent is a footnote, not a flaw. This team lands in the 65th percentile, and that feels about right, maybe a touch modest.

Spectres Spike! did not build this roster with one splashy move. They built it by winning exchange after exchange on draft day, and the cumulative effect is a team that sits at the 71st percentile of the field without a single moment you can point to as the turning point. The anchor is Jahmyr Gibbs, a projected RB1 who was taken at chalk and priced accordingly, but the surrounding work is where this team separated itself. Caleb Williams dropped a full round and a half past his ADP before Spectres Spike! scooped him at 4.11, pairing a QB6 projection with two of his own pass-catchers in Luther Burden and Rome Odunze. De'Von Achane, projected RB6, also slid past his number. The one blemish is Isaiah Likely, grabbed two rounds early relative to his ADP for a player projecting as TE13, a price that was probably too steep. But one overpay on a reasonable target does not unwind a draft built on discipline. This team got ahead quietly and stayed there.

After a 2025 season that left EliasHM mired in the bottom fifth of the field with just 4,059 points and a 12-24 record, this roster looks like a genuine reset rather than a reshuffling. The receiver corps alone tells the comeback story: Drake London at WR7, DeVonta Smith at WR14, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 form a top line that most managers in this tournament would envy, and Wilson arrived as a value, falling a full round past his ADP. Josh Allen anchors the quarterback spot as a consensus QB1, giving EliasHM the kind of weekly ceiling that kept last year's team from ever threatening. The draft was disciplined throughout, logging six value picks against zero major reaches, and patience in the middle rounds landed Travis Etienne at RB18 a round later than expected. The pieces that hurt EliasHM last year, thin overall talent and no consistent upside, are simply gone. This looks like a legitimate bounce-back, and the 73rd-percentile projection says the rest of the field notices it too.

MR FTBL didn't need a miracle pick to build something worth watching in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division. The foundation is Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Trey McBride at TE2, both projected starters who give this roster a level of reliability that most managers have to cross their fingers for. From there, the draft quietly did its work: Emeka Egbuka slid a full round past his ADP into a stack with Baker Mayfield, and Rashee Rice pairs with Patrick Mahomes for a second stack that hums with upside. Mayfield is the one variable worth watching, coming off a 2025 stumble and now without Mike Evans in Tampa, but Egbuka and Chris Godwin still give him real weapons to work with, and consensus may be underselling what he can do. Four values against three reaches is not a perfect scorecard, but it reflects a manager who came out ahead more often than not, and at the 73rd percentile in the field, this roster has earned its spot in the conversation.

Thanix Cannons land at 80th percentile in the field and second in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division, and the draft log tells you exactly why: this team simply kept winning the exchange. Six values, eleven chalk, and only one significant overpay is a draft defined by patience and positioning rather than any single flashy moment. The receiver group alone makes the case, with Puka Nacua (WR1), Nico Collins (WR9), Malik Nabers (WR12), Tee Higgins (WR19), and Jameson Williams (WR21) all projecting as starters and all landed at or near their price. Trevor Lawrence arrived nearly two full rounds late at QB10, a quiet win in a round where most managers were already pivoting elsewhere. Brian Robinson and Tyler Allgeier each slipped past their ADPs by more than a round in the late teens, turning depth into surplus. The C.J. Stroud reach at 2.3 rounds early is the one moment the board got away from them, but when your mistakes are a QB22, Thanix Cannons built a roster worth respecting.

Valanthro came to the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl with a plan and executed it almost flawlessly, finishing first in the Mass Effect Legendary Edition division and in the 87th percentile of the entire field. The foundation is elite: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 are the kind of cornerstones you build around, and Valanthro surrounded them with depth that was mostly earned at fair price or better. Justin Herbert fell 1.2 rounds past his ADP, a quiet reward for patience at a position where managers often panic, and while his ceiling carries a legitimate question mark under Mike McDaniel if the Chargers keep winning ball-control games, Herbert at QB8 is still a quality asset at the cost of a QB8-plus. Jadarian Price dropping to 12.12 against an ADP of 9.09 is the kind of late-round patience that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. One minor reach on Bowers at 1.01 is not a blemish, it is a manager knowing exactly what he wanted and taking it. This roster is clean.
