There is no charitable read on what KellonMB built in 2026, and the draft sheet confirms it at nearly every turn. The headline is A.J. Brown, taken a full round early at the first pick of the tenth slot, with Nico Collins following just seven picks later at another reach, and the pair of them eating into the kind of early capital that was supposed to set this roster's floor. Reaching for Brown is understandable in the abstract, but when you compound it with a minor reach on Jameson Williams in round three and another on Alec Pierce in round six, you have spent most of your high-upside picks on receivers ranked WR8, WR9, WR21, and WR32 while your quarterback room landed at QB16, QB24, and QB25 with zero of those guys projecting as anything more than serviceable. The weakest projected starter is Malik Willis at QB24, and the backup plan is Daniel Jones at QB25. This is a team that drafted like the WR position is the only one that matters, discovered too late that there is a cost for that conviction, and

now sits at the seventh percentile of the field with a 2025 record of 39 percent wins that suggests the lesson has not yet been learned.

RedDevilPax enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Master Chief division and in just the 28th percentile of the field, and the roster grades offer very little reason for optimism. The top of the lineup is real: CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) are legitimate difference-makers, and Jayden Daniels (QB5) gives the team a high-end signal-caller, even if reaching for him at 2.04 when his ADP sat at 2.12 signals the kind of aggressive maneuvering that rarely pays dividends at the bottom of a draft. The problem is that the floor drops off quickly. Jakobi Meyers (WR45) projects as the weakest starter, and the one genuine value on the board, TreVeyon Henderson (RB19), was a pleasant surprise rather than a foundation-builder. The draft produced zero steals and one value against eighteen chalk selections, meaning RedDevilPax had almost no luck finding upgrades on the margins. When your best argument for optimism is that the stars showed up and everything else broke even, you are already tired before the season even starts.

There are rosters built for a deep run, and then there is adamq72's 2026 situation, sitting 10th in the Master Chief division and hovering around the 30th percentile of the field with nowhere obvious to climb. The foundation is real enough: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 give this team a legitimate ceiling, and Carnell Tate landing in Tennessee alongside Cam Ward is the kind of upside pairing that could surprise. But the draft told a quieter story, with 13 chalk picks, five minor reaches, and one major one in Justin Fields at QB38, a player taken 5.7 rounds ahead of his ADP who projects as the clear weak link on this roster. After a genuinely strong 2025 at the 76th percentile in scoring, the regression to the 30th feels abrupt, and the draft left almost no margin to correct it. Bowers either goes nuclear, Tate and Ward click immediately, or adamq72 is watching the bracket thin out without him.

There is no sugarcoating the math here. otownbucs grades out at the 34th percentile of the field and sits ninth in the Master Chief division, and the roster does not have an obvious rescue plan buried inside it. The good news is real: Drake Maye projects as QB2, and with AJ Brown now in New England, the ceiling on that investment looks higher than it did a year ago. Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tyler Warren at TE4 were both drafted after their ADPs, meaning the manager got genuine value where the production is legitimate. The trouble is that the rest of the projected lineup thins out fast. The receiver group tops out at Terry McLaurin at WR24, and Kenneth Gainwell, projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB34, is the kind of name you hope never appears in a must-win week. Two major reaches, including Christian Kirk coming off the board nearly six rounds early, did not help the cause. Maye and the tight end duo give this team a pulse, but a pulse is not a playoff seed.

BGuida sits eighth in the Master Chief division and around the 40th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason to expect a climb. Of the 20 picks, 15 landed exactly at chalk, four were reaches of varying severity, and the lone genuine value was Ashton Jeanty, who slid nearly a full round past his ADP and represents about the best thing that happened all draft. The rest of the board tells a quieter, grimmer story. Trevor Lawrence and Patrick Mahomes project as QB10 and QB12, respectively, good enough to not embarrass anyone but nowhere near a differentiator. The receiver depth looks busy on paper but thins out fast in quality, with Stefon Diggs projecting as WR56 and locking in as the weakest projected starter. Reaching 2.3 rounds early for a WR56 is the kind of draft math that compounds poorly over a long season. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is real, and Jeanty gives this team a genuine one-two punch at the position, but asking those two to drag the rest of the roster to a top-half finish is a significant burden to place on anyone.

IanMcGuinness sits at 48th percentile and 7th in the Master Chief division, which is exactly the kind of standing that demands you win the close ones because you're not going to blow anyone out. The foundation is genuinely good: Josh Allen at QB1 anchors the roster, and the Joe Burrow and Tee Higgins stack gives this team a ceiling that can spike on any given week. The problem is that nearly everything else requires things to go right. Thirteen chalk picks and five reaches in the draft suggest a manager who drafted to a plan but rarely found the market napping, and that Deshaun Watson reach at QB34 burns three late-round picks' worth of capital on a quarterback who probably never sees a meaningful snap. George Pickens at WR10 and Tee Higgins at WR19 keep the floor respectable, but Jayden Reed as the projected weakest starter at WR48 is the kind of player who wins you weeks when he's hot and costs you weeks when he's not. This roster goes as far as the margins allow, and the margins are genuinely tight.

lososos enters 2026 sitting at the 51st percentile and sixth in the Master Chief division, which is about as middle-of-the-road as it gets. The good news is the receiver group is genuinely elite at the top: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Justin Jefferson (WR6), and Malik Nabers (WR12) are the kind of names that anchor championship rosters, and the depth behind them, Ladd McConkey (WR20) and Luther Burden (WR22), keeps quality flowing into the lineup. Jefferson also connects as a stack with Kyler Murray (QB19), which adds a little ceiling insurance when the stars align. The problem is that everything outside that receiver group projects as replacement-level or worse. Murray is a QB19, Chigoziem Okonkwo projects as the weakest projected starter at TE19, and the backfield leans on Quinshon Judkins (RB22) and Jonathon Brooks (RB37) with real uncertainty behind them. A 64 percent win rate in 2025 shows this team can compete, but in 2026 the margins are unforgiving: when St. Brown, Jefferson, and Nabers are clicking, lososos beats you; when they go quiet, there is not much underneath to bail them out.

Dannyh's draft looks like a series of mistakes until you actually look at the roster, and that tension is what makes this team interesting. The most eyebrow-raising move was taking Justin Herbert at pick 2.11, nearly a full round ahead of his ADP, which is a bold commitment to a QB8 projection in a format where you can start anyone. Then Rhamondre Stevenson came off the board at 9.02, more than two rounds early, for a player projected RB31. On paper, those are the kinds of swings that leave a manager explaining themselves in the group chat. But here is the thing: the roster that emerged from all that reaching actually holds up. Chase Brown projects as RB11, Jeremiah Love sits at RB13, and Javonte Williams comes in at RB17, all projected starters built into a deep, genuinely threatening group. Dannyh landed those players because the early reaches opened up late-round equity, pulling RJ Harvey at 12.11 despite an ADP of 10.05. The 2025 record of 39 percent wins gives you reason for skepticism. The 2026 roster gives you reason to wonder if Dannyh knew exactly what they were doing.

Last year elmurpho finished in the 13th percentile in scoring, a genuine disaster, but the 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. The foundation is built on Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Breece Hall at RB14, two projected starters who give this team a reliable scoring floor that simply did not exist a year ago. Lamar Jackson at QB3 adds another elite piece, and the fact that elmurpho landed him a little past his ADP makes the acquisition even cleaner. The draft was heavy on chalk, which is fine when the chalk includes players at this level. Travis Kelce, back for another season after his uncertain offseason, slots in at TE10 and was also taken at a slight discount, rewarding patience. The roster projects to the 70th percentile of the field, which would represent one of the more satisfying single-season turnarounds in the Master Chief division. After an 11-25 record and nearly 4,000 points that somehow felt like not enough, elmurpho has built something that looks like the real thing.

terpfan20 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. This roster was built round by round, pick by pick, until the cumulative advantage became impossible to ignore. The clearest example is Trey McBride, a TE2 projection taken at 2.01 when his ADP sat at 1.08, a full round of surplus value on one of the most reliable starters in the field. D'Andre Swift followed in the same spirit, sliding to 9.12 despite an ADP of 8.02, giving terpfan20 a projected RB24 at a discount. Layer Christian McCaffrey at RB3 on top of that, add Chris Olave at WR11 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 as projected starters, and the starting lineup fills out with genuine quality before you even get to Kyle Pitts at TE7 providing real insurance at a position that often goes thin. The result is a team sitting third in the division and at the 71st percentile tournament-wide, a fair return on a draft that consistently found value without ever swinging for the fences.

DynastyBobFF didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting second in the Master Chief division and at the 75th tournament percentile with real aspirations to climb higher. The foundation is a backfield anchored by Jonathan Taylor (RB4), who slipped just enough past his ADP at 2.05 to qualify as a legitimate value, and Omarion Hampton (RB9) and Derrick Henry (RB12) ensure the depth behind Taylor isn't decorative. Brock Purdy (QB13) stacking with George Kittle (TE9) gives the lineup a reliable connective tissue, two players whose production tends to travel together. Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) rounds out a starting core that projects as genuinely threatening on paper. The late-round reaches on Kaytron Allen and Dontayvion Wicks are fair criticism, though they represent upside bets rather than miscalculations on proven contributors. Coming off a 96th-percentile scoring season in 2025, DynastyBobFF hasn't rebuilt so much as reloaded, and this draft reflects a manager who knows how to keep the machine running.

etcat30 didn't win the draft with one audacious swing. They won it by quietly coming out ahead at pick after pick. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors a starting group that also features De'Von Achane at RB6 and Harold Fannin at TE6, a projected-starter trio that would look comfortable on any contender's roster. What separates this team from other strong builds, though, is the discipline behind it. Four players came to etcat30 at genuine value relative to ADP, including Pat Freiermuth, grabbed nearly two rounds after his market price, and Matthew Stafford, who slid a full round past where he was supposed to go. Neither name makes anyone gasp, but that's the point. The manager wasn't hunting headlines, just advantages, and they found them consistently enough to land first in the Master Chief division and in the 87th percentile of the entire field. etcat30 is built the way good rosters quietly always are: not on one great decision, but on a draft where almost nothing went wrong.
