Last year's 86th-percentile scoring machine has returned to the Scott Fish Bowl and immediately set fire to the blueprint. @KingSam lands in the bottom 5 percent of the field heading into 2026, and the draft tells you exactly why. Five major reaches litter this roster, but the one that stings most is T.J. Hockenson, snagged nearly four full rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as a TE23, making him the weakest projected starter on the team. You do not spend that kind of draft capital to land a TE23. Then there is the quarterback situation, where @KingSam somehow found two reaches in one position group, taking C.J. Stroud two rounds early and Aaron Rodgers two-plus rounds early, leaving the team with a QB22 and a QB29 as its best options under center. The running back group anchored by Jonathan Taylor and Saquon Barkley is genuinely good, but in a draft that produced eight chalk selections, one steal, and five major reaches, good running backs cannot paper over a strategy that looks like it was assembled in a panic.

Your Mother is a Chozo sits 11th in the Metroid division and in the 8th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how it got there: zero steals, six major reaches, and a self-satisfied pile of chalk in between. The reaches tell the whole story. Jordan James, projected RB67, was taken 6.4 rounds ahead of his ADP, a kind of aggressive wrongness that takes real commitment. Alec Pierce, projected WR32, cost two rounds of premium over market to land a projected starter who grades out as average. The one moment of genuine value, Ladd McConkey falling to a WR20 projection at pick 6.04, got buried under the rubble before anyone could feel good about it. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 give this team a floor, but a format that rewards depth and volume means leaning on two stars while the back end of the roster is stocked with late-round guesses taken as if they were certainties is not a plan. It is a confession.

Justin Leonard's 2026 draft reads like a case study in manufacturing your own bad luck. The most glaring symptom is a quarterback obsession that bent the entire board out of shape: Leonard reached for Jared Goff at QB16 a full round and a half before the market demanded it, then doubled down with Jacoby Brissett at QB28 two and a half rounds early, then somehow kept going and grabbed Carson Beck at QB40 nearly six rounds ahead of his ADP. That is three quarterbacks who don't start, acquired at prices that should have bought something useful. The opportunity cost shows up immediately in the skill positions, where the best projected starter outside of Ja'Marr Chase is Jacory Croskey-Merritt at RB40, the one player on this roster who actually fell to Leonard rather than getting yanked off the board prematurely. Tyler Warren at TE4 and Travis Kelce at TE10 offer genuine upside, but this team finished in the 15th percentile in 2025, and nothing about this draft suggests the view improves from the basement of the Metroid division.

Sigmund Bloom's 2026 SFB entry sits at the 24th percentile of the field, and the draft board offers little reason to expect a dramatic reversal of fortune. The foundational problem is straightforward: the roster graded out with zero steals and only two genuine values, while accumulating six minor reaches and a major one in Jalen Coker, a WR55 taken nearly three full rounds ahead of his market price. Even the draft's brightest moments are muted. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Christian Watson at WR28 both fell past their ADPs, but neither represents the kind of top-end windfall that changes a team's ceiling. Drake London, the clear centerpiece at WR7, was a minor reach himself, which means Bloom essentially paid full retail for his best player and overpaid for most of the depth behind him. The projected weakest starter is Jonathon Brooks at RB37, which tells you something about where the floor is. There is no buried treasure left to unearth here, just a team quietly hoping the projections are wrong.

The @PRedLSU Brostars sit eighth in the Metroid division and in just the 28th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it easy to understand why. The receiving corps is the one genuine bright spot, with Justin Jefferson (WR6), George Pickens (WR10), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) giving the team a ceiling to dream on, and Pickens arriving as one of the few draft-day values after sliding nearly a full round past his ADP. But that strength can only carry so much weight when the quarterback group grades out this poorly. Jordan Love (QB17) and Tyler Shough (QB20) are the best options in the room, and neither projects as someone who will consistently elevate a lineup on their own. Meanwhile, De'Von Achane (RB6) is a legitimate top-end asset, but he was a major reach at pick 1.11 when his ADP sat closer to the middle of the second round, which means the roster paid a premium for production it should have had without sacrificing draft position. There is no obvious fix here, just a team hoping its best players overperform their projections all at once.

Eric Leon drafted the way the textbooks tell you to: patience rewarded, value accumulated, the ADP exploited at nearly every turn. CeeDee Lamb fell almost a full round past his price, Bucky Irving slipped more than two rounds before Leon scooped him, and the steal count outnumbers the reaches by a comfortable margin. On paper, that is a well-run draft. On the field, it projects to 41st percentile and seventh in the Metroid Division, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether the textbooks were written by losers. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Lamb at WR5 forming a top of the lineup that most managers would envy. But the backfield starters top out at Jadarian Price, projected RB26, and the quarterback shelf runs from Justin Herbert at QB8 down to names that do not inspire confidence in anyone's playoff seeding. Leon bought correctly and assembled incorrectly, and the standings do not grade you on process.

Chozo Claypool Delirium landed at 56th percentile in the field, which looks modest until you trace how they built it. The reach column is striking: four major reaches in a single draft, including Dallas Goedert pulled two full rounds early, Rhamondre Stevenson grabbed 2.5 rounds before consensus said to, and Matthew Stafford snatched well ahead of his ADP with Puka Nacua already on the board to make that Stafford/Nacua stack sing. Any one of those moves looks aggressive in isolation. All four together looks like a philosophy. And here is the thing, it mostly worked. Lamar Jackson at QB3 anchors a starting group that is genuinely difficult to push around, and Jakobi Meyers and Khalil Shakir showed up as the two biggest steals on the board, each falling nearly three rounds past ADP before this manager scooped them in the late rounds. The roster did not arrive gift-wrapped. It was constructed through a series of bets the market disagreed with, and the final product is better than the draft grades suggest. Whether that reflects vision or variance, the scoreboard will sort it out.

Dimitar Stamatov did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on one splashy gamble. He built it by being right, repeatedly, at a level most managers never sustain across a full draft. Five good values and a major steal give this team a structural edge that shows up not in one flashy name but in the cumulative quality of the depth chart. The spine of the lineup is genuinely elite: Brock Bowers at TE1, A.J. Brown at WR8 landing in New England alongside a quarterback coming off an MVP runner-up season, and Nico Collins at WR9 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 giving Stamatov a receiving group most managers would envy. The value acquisition of Jaxson Dart at QB11, snagged nearly two rounds after his ADP, keeps the position from being a burden. A 76th percentile tournament projection for a team sitting fifth in the Metroid division suggests this roster has more ceiling than the standings imply. Stamatov did not outmaneuver the field in one moment. He just kept coming out ahead.

Hasan Rahim did not need a lightning bolt to build a winner in the Metroid division. He just needed to be right more often than wrong, and the draft record shows exactly that: three values, fifteen chalk, and zero major reaches across the board. The values tell the story cleanly. Carnell Tate fell nearly a round and a third past his ADP before Rahim scooped him at WR29, Courtland Sutton slid a full round to WR37, and RJ Harvey drifted almost two rounds past his number to land at RB28, all three now projected starters. Meanwhile the top of the roster is quietly stacked at tight end, where Trey McBride at TE2, Harold Fannin at TE6, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give Rahim a projected positional edge that most managers in this field simply cannot match. Baker Mayfield is the softest spot on the roster at QB18, but in a positionless format, a manager who leans on McBride, Jeanty, and Nabers can paper over a lot. Sitting at the 81st percentile before a single week is played, Rahim looks like a team that got right what most drafters left on the board.

The Great Gibbsby landed at 86th percentile in this field and third in the Metroid Division, and the draft sheet alone does not explain how. Three major reaches, two minor ones, zero steals. On paper, this manager was paying premiums all afternoon. In practice, Jahmyr Gibbs is RB1, Drake Maye fell a full round and a half to become QB2, and Joe Burrow arrived at QB4 with a Tee Higgins stack already attached. The bones of this roster were built the right way even when the board disagreed. The reaches that raised eyebrows, Isiah Pacheco pulled more than three rounds early, Tyquan Thornton grabbed nearly seven rounds before consensus caught up, look more like conviction bets than panic moves when you see what surrounds them. Gibbs at the top of the position, Maye and Burrow rotating through the QB spot, Isaiah Likely and Chigoziem Okonkwo giving genuine optionality at tight end. Whether Gibbsby saw something the board missed or simply got away with it, the roster they assembled does not much care which answer you prefer.

FantasyGumshoe sits at 86th percentile and second in the Metroid division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The approach here was disciplined and patient, the kind of board management that lets value come to you instead of chasing it. Jake Ferguson landing at pick 10.06 when his ADP sat at 8.05 is the headliner, a TE12 acquired more than two rounds late while others presumably overpaid elsewhere. But the real story is how consistently that patience paid off across the board: Luther Burden at WR22 fell a round and change, Jordyn Tyson at WR34 slipped similarly, and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 came more than a round after he should have been gone. Six values and a steal against a single minor reach on Fernando Mendoza is a clean, nearly spotless ledger. Up top, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and a Patrick Mahomes and Rashee Rice stack give this team genuine ceiling, and Colston Loveland at TE3 is a weapon most rosters in this field simply do not have. FantasyGumshoe did not get lucky. They did the work.

Jeremy Spolarich did not stumble into a 98th percentile roster. He built it, pick by pick, in a draft that kept coming out ahead. The centerpiece is Josh Allen, the QB1 in the tournament, landed at 2.08 when the field had him priced a full round earlier. That kind of positional value at the top of a draft has a way of compounding: when you get a QB1 at a QB1 discount, the downstream picks carry less pressure, and Spolarich spent that breathing room wisely. Chris Olave at WR11, Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, and Oronde Gadsden at TE16 all came in past their ADPs, and the Allen-Dalton Kincaid stack gives the roster a weekly floor that most managers in the Metroid division simply cannot match. Yes, there are late-round fliers like Ted Hurst and Chris Bell who were taken considerably ahead of consensus, and those bets may not all land. But a team sitting first in its division does not need every gamble to pay off. It just needed a draft that consistently came out ahead, and this one did.
