There is no polite way to dress up a 5th-percentile projection, and RaiderYahir26 sits dead last in the Cordyceps division with a roster that grades out near the bottom of the entire field. The foundation is not worthless, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and George Pickens at WR10 give this team a legitimate top tier, but the draft strategy that built around them left almost no margin for error, nine chalk picks, seven minor reaches, and one major reach in Chimere Dike, taken nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as WR84. That is the kind of swing that needs to hit to justify itself, and Dike at WR84 is not hitting. The projected weakest starter, Kyle Monangai at RB33, was also reached for, taken a round and a half early. When you spend premium draft capital ahead of schedule and the players you accelerated for grade out in the bottom third of their position, there is no clever waiver move or lineup shuffle that fixes the underlying math. Yahir built this roster like every pick needed to be protected, and the board responded accordingly.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from one catastrophic mistake but from a dozen small ones adding up, and Netobot's 2026 outlook carries that weight. The draft told the story early: three major reaches, including Joe Burrow taken nearly a full round ahead of his ADP at the first overall pick and Kenyon Sadiq pulled more than three rounds early in round eight, decisions that burned positional capital before the roster ever had a chance to breathe. Burrow as a projected QB4 is not the problem, he is genuinely good, but the cost compressed the rest of the build. The receiver group has some real names, Drake London projecting as WR7 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18, but the projected lineup bottoms out at Jayden Reed as a WR48 starter, and a 42-percent win rate and 32nd-percentile scoring in 2025 suggest this is a roster without much hidden upside waiting to be unlocked. Sitting 11th in the Cordyceps division and in just the sixth percentile of the field, Netobot does not have a lever left to pull.

tonlaj drafted with genuine discipline. Nearly every pick landed at or after ADP, Terrance Ferguson fell more than four full rounds before being scooped up, and the misses were minor, Rashee Rice a tick early here, Terry McLaurin a round early there. The process was sound. The results are brutal anyway. The quarterback situation projects as the weakest positional group on the team, Jordan Love checking in at QB17 and Daniel Jones at QB25, and in a positionless format where your best ten players take the field, a dragging QB room acts as a ceiling rather than a floor. Meanwhile, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Colston Loveland at TE3 provide genuine upside at the top, but the back half of the roster, Makai Lemon, Brenton Strange, Bucky Irving, all hovering in the middle tiers of their respective projections, never generates the kind of surplus that compensates for the anchor. This is what makes the cruelest drafts so exhausting to look at. tonlaj did the work and still lands 22nd percentile. The game sometimes just shrugs.

AbueloFF arrives in the Cordyceps division sitting ninth, projected at the 24th percentile, and the draft log tells you everything you need to know about how they got there. The foundation looks fine on the surface, Josh Allen at QB1 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 anchoring a group that could carry a contender, but AbueloFF spent the draft burning early capital to acquire receiver depth that simply did not require that kind of commitment. Davante Adams, a WR25, was pulled nearly two rounds ahead of his ADP. Courtland Sutton, a WR37, cost over two rounds more than the market demanded. Matthew Golden, a WR52, got yanked more than three rounds early. Three major reaches across the draft, zero steals, and a 2025 campaign that produced a 36 percent win rate all tell the same story: this manager paid a premium for players the board was perfectly willing to deliver later, gutting the mid-round efficiency that championship rosters are built on. Allen and Jackson are real. The path AbueloFF took to surround them is not.

MatadorFF drafted with patience and discipline: Puka Nacua at WR1 slipped to pick 1.06, Zach Charbonnet fell more than two rounds before being snagged at RB42, and nearly every selection came at or after consensus value. The process was sound. The outcome, sitting 8th in the Cordyceps division and in the 29th percentile of the field, is the kind of result that makes you question whether process matters at all. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, with Nacua, Chris Olave, Malik Nabers, and Jameson Williams all projected as starters, but this is a positionless format and impressive depth only converts to wins if the aggregate ceiling is high enough. It is not quite high enough here. The backfield projects weakly, with Jadarian Price at RB26 serving as the best option, and T.J. Hockenson at TE23 provides little upside at the margins. MatadorFF found value consistently and still assembled a roster that projects below the median. That is not bad luck. That is the cruelest verdict a draft can render.

BernsCC7 sits at 44th percentile and seventh in the Cordyceps division, which tells you everything and nothing at the same time. This is a team built on a genuinely elite backfield, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchoring a group that also includes Breece Hall at RB14, and that collection of talent gives BernsCC7 a ceiling that can beat anyone in a good week. The problem is the margins, and the margins here are tight in both directions. Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give the receiving corps a credible top end, but the depth fades quickly toward Stefon Diggs at WR56 and Travis Kelce at TE10 is fine without being dominant. The draft board offers one notable data point: BernsCC7 reached three rounds early on Shedeur Sanders at QB32, a 14th-round investment in a player projected well outside the starting tier. That kind of luxury spending at the back of a draft only works if the top of the roster performs exactly as projected. For BernsCC7, the margin between contender and afterthought is razor thin, and the schedule will not care about the difference.

Art2r is the 52nd-percentile team that has fully internalized what it means to live at the 52nd percentile: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster a genuinely terrifying ceiling at the top, but the margins below them are where seasons like this one get decided. Jalen Hurts landing at QB9 as a projected starter, taken a full round and change after his ADP, is the kind of quiet draft win that compounds over a long season, and George Kittle at TE9 ensures the position does not become a quiet drain on the lineup. What threatens to bleed those gains back out is the receiver group, where Khalil Shakir projects as the weakest starter at WR51 and names like Tory Horton and Dontayvion Wicks, both reached for aggressively in the late rounds, represent lottery tickets printed with slightly too much confidence. A 50-percent record and 49th-percentile scoring last year is not a cautionary tale, it is a baseline, and the 2026 version of this team has enough at the top to clear it, provided the thin margin between good enough and not quite holds together when it has to.

Cespec33 didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by being right, over and over again. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster two of the best projected players in the field, and Achane arriving at 2.12 when his ADP sat at 2.07 is the kind of quiet precision that separates good drafters from lucky ones. Kyle Pitts landing at TE7 a round and a half after his ADP is the same story, a manager who stayed patient and got paid. Parker Washington at WR35 falling nearly three rounds past his ADP to pick 11.01 looks like the steal of the draft in hindsight. The one wrinkle worth watching is the receiver group, where projected starters Mike Evans and Washington rank WR27 and WR35 respectively, solid but not dominant. The 2025 résumé helps the case: 72 percent win rate and 86th percentile scoring suggest this isn't projection optimism talking. Cespec33 simply drafted better than most people noticed.

DemonicMike lands at 74th percentile in the field, and the draft log tells you why: this roster was built through sustained discipline rather than a single lottery ticket. The crown jewel is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, but the pick that quietly defines this team is Tyler Warren. The TE4 fell a full 1.6 rounds past his ADP, and DemonicMike was sitting right there to take him. That is not luck, that is positioning. Caleb Williams arriving at QB6 nearly two full rounds after his ADP is the same story told twice. The reaches at the back end, Rashid Shaheed and Rashod Bateman, are real and worth noting, but they arrive late enough in the draft that the cost of being wrong is manageable. What anchors the whole thing is the WR group, where Chase and A.J. Brown at WR8 give the team a ceiling that most managers in the Cordyceps division simply cannot match. Fourth in the division today, with genuine room to climb.

Sergiodbr didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't reach desperately into the late rounds hoping lightning would strike. This team was built on quietly winning exchanges, and the draft board tells the story. Drake Maye, a QB2, slid nearly two full rounds past his ADP and landed at 3.10. Matthew Stafford, a QB14, fell two rounds past his number and cost almost nothing in round eight. Those two pickups alone represent a surplus that most managers never accumulate across an entire draft. Layer in a starting group that includes Justin Jefferson at WR6, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Josh Jacobs at RB16, and you have a team that didn't need to get lucky because it never fell behind. Sitting third in the division and in the 84th percentile of the field, Sergiodbr built a team that rewards patience, punishes no single catastrophic decision, and simply, consistently, came out ahead.

bigotesdeltoro sits second in the Cordyceps division and in the 91st percentile of the field, and the draft board tells you exactly why. Out of 20 picks, there are zero reaches, which is the kind of discipline that separates managers who understand value from those who fall in love with names. The steals are the story: C.J. Stroud at QB22 fell more than two full rounds past his ADP, and Jaylen Warren at RB27 did the same, both landing late when the board handed them over for free. Meanwhile the headliners hold up on their own terms, with CeeDee Lamb projected as WR5, Trey McBride as TE2, and Jayden Daniels as QB5 all sitting in the projected starting lineup. The floor is high because the upside was acquired cheaply. Chris Godwin at WR38 is the weakest projected starter, and in most builds that would warrant a sentence of concern. Here it just means bigotesdeltoro maxed out everywhere else first.

Sitting atop the Cordyceps division and projecting in the 97th percentile of the field, maurubio16 built something that holds up from every angle. The headliner is Brock Bowers, a TE1 projection that anchors the whole roster, but the real story is how patiently this draft was constructed around him. Dak Prescott landed at 5.08 despite projecting as QB7, a steal of more than two full rounds, and Harold Fannin came in at 7.08 against an ADP of 5.04, quietly one of the cleaner finds in the tournament. Tucker Kraft and Jake Ferguson were both drafted past their ADPs as well, and Ferguson forms a Prescott stack that adds another layer of ceiling. Against that backdrop, the one minor reach, Tee Higgins taken just over a round early, barely registers as a blemish. Twelve chalk picks, two outright steals, four good values, and zero major reaches: that is not luck, that is a manager who knew exactly what they were doing and let the board come to them.
