There is no spin available for Rapinha, and honestly, there is barely enough energy left to try. The draft was a cascade of early commitments to players who did not require them, and the cumulative damage is sitting at the bottom of the Joel division with a 2nd percentile projection to show for it. The headliner is Kenneth Walker III, a fine RB10, but taken 1.3 rounds early at 2.01, which set the tone immediately: Rapinha was going to pay retail, then some. Sam LaPorta went four rounds before his average draft position. Stefon Diggs, a WR56 who barely registers as a starter-caliber option, cost a 10th-round pick. Tua Tagovailoa, sitting at QB31, was taken nearly three full rounds ahead of where the market valued him, which is the kind of move that makes sense only in a draft room where panic has replaced process. Five major reaches across a 15-round draft is not bad luck. It is a philosophy, and this one has Rapinha projected to suffer for it all season long.

Billygan88 sits at 8th percentile in the tournament and 11th in the Joel division, and the draft chart does not offer much optimism about a turnaround. The foundational problem is at quarterback, where Bo Nix projects as a QB15 and Kyler Murray slots in as the weakest projected starter on the roster at QB19, neither of them capable of carrying a week on their own. Billygan88 did build a Nix-Jaylen Waddle stack that could spike on a good week, but stacks are variance tools, not floor-raisers, and this team needs a floor. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a genuine anchor and Chris Olave at WR11 gives the lineup real teeth, but beyond those two the roster grades out middling at best. The draft did not help matters: twelve chalk picks with two major reaches, including Jeremiyah Love taken a round and a half before consensus said to and Brian Robinson pulled forward nearly two and a half rounds near the end. That is a draft that created no margin. After a 42-percent win rate in 2025, there is no obvious lever left to pull here.

LUISO59BB finished 7-29 last season with a 20th-percentile scoring output, and the 2026 projection offers little reason for optimism, slotting this roster 10th in the Joel division and in just the 14th percentile of the field. The foundation is genuinely strong at the skill positions, with Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1), Ashton Jeanty (RB7), and Omarion Hampton (RB9) projecting as legitimate weekly difference-makers. The problem is everything around them. The receiving corps grades weak, the tight end room grades weak, and the quarterback situation grades weak, which means this roster is relying on a narrow tier of talent to carry a lot of dead weight. RJ Harvey (RB28) looked like upside insurance at draft time, but with JK Dobbins back in Denver and the Broncos adding Jonah Coleman in the draft, Harvey is buried in a committee that shows no signs of clearing. Four major reaches in the draft suggest the manager was fighting the board rather than letting value come to him, and at this point, LUISO59BB looks like a team that built one exceptional layer and ran out of runway before finishing the rest.

DiegoDM went 30-6 last season and finished in the 100th percentile, which means everyone in the Joel division already knows the name and is drafting accordingly. The problem is that 2026 DiegoDM is not 2025 DiegoDM, and the draft did not exactly close that gap quietly. Four major reaches dot this roster, including Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 taken more than two rounds early and Jerry Jeudy at WR66 grabbed more than five rounds before his ADP, suggesting a manager who trusted last year's instincts a little too hard this time around. The genuine assets are real: Brock Bowers at TE1, Nico Collins at WR9, and a quarterback room where Dak Prescott at QB7 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 were both acquired at meaningful value. But the tournament percentile sits at 36th, and that number does not care about 2025 trophies. Reputation is not a starting lineup, and right now the gap between what DiegoDM was and what this roster projects to be is the most interesting storyline on the team.

Last year RodoMora posted an 84th-percentile scoring season, and someone in that manager's circle probably still brings it up at dinner. The 2026 roster is a quieter conversation. The team sits at just the 43rd percentile in tournament projections and eighth in the Joel division, and the construction tells you why. The receiver group is the soft underbelly, with Deebo Samuel projecting at WR70 and Chimere Dike at WR84 rounding out the back end of the starts, and the draft did not help matters there, with Dike taken three full rounds ahead of his ADP and Samuel over two rounds early. The run game is genuinely impressive on paper, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 anchoring a group that stays productive deep into the roster, but in a positionless format, elite backfield depth only carries the scoring load so far when the rest of the lineup thins out. RodoMora won with a full hand last year. This year they are drawing to it.

Marizzett is the kind of team that wins a fantasy tournament not with a knockout punch but with a thousand small correct decisions, and in 2026 the margin for error is thin enough to feel it. The receiver group is genuinely elite at the top, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Drake London (WR7), and Zay Flowers (WR16) all projected starters capable of carrying a week on their own, and Tyler Warren (TE4) and Tucker Kraft (TE5) give the position a rare top-five depth that most rosters can't match. The Jordan Love stack with Kraft is the kind of quiet efficiency that doesn't show up on highlight reels but absolutely shows up in box scores. What keeps this team in the 53rd percentile rather than climbing is the fragility at the margins: Jaylen Warren (RB27) is the projected weakest starter, and Travis Kelce, officially back for 2026 but chasing his way back into the top-12 conversation at TE10, is upside you're hoping for rather than banking on. This roster doesn't scare anyone. It also doesn't lose to anyone easy.

GeCaVe90 didn't win the draft on one spectacular swing, they won it by consistently getting more than they paid for. The two clearest examples sit at opposite ends of the roster. Josh Allen is the kind of QB1 anchor that makes a manager sleep at night, but it's Trevor Lawrence, projected QB10, who represents the real coup, a player whose career year last season answered several years of "what if" with actual production. Then there's D'Andre Swift, projected RB24, who fell more than three rounds past his ADP and slots in as a genuine starter. Layer in Malik Nabers at WR12 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 and you have a group of projected starters that could carry this team through a brutal stretch. The weak link is real, Juwan Johnson at TE20 is not a weapon, but in a positionless format the rest of the roster has enough range to absorb it. GeCaVe90 sits sixth in the Joel division right now, but the draft suggests that number should move.

MrShao's draft reads like a patient card game where every hand was played a beat late by the competition and a beat early by him. The clearest example is De'Von Achane, a projected RB6 landed at pick 3.04 after his ADP suggested he'd be gone nearly a round sooner. That kind of quiet execution ran through the whole board: four players taken after their ADP, twelve picks that hit chalk, and not a single major reach across nineteen rounds. The receiver corps anchors everything, with Puka Nacua projecting as WR1 and Luther Burden (WR22) and Christian Watson (WR28) giving the lineup genuine depth behind him. Colston Loveland at TE3 only adds to the ceiling. The one honest question mark is C.J. Stroud, the projected QB22 who has spent the last two seasons trying to rediscover the form that made him a sensation. His situation at Houston hasn't been ideal, but MrShao needs Stroud to find that version of himself. If he does, this team sitting fifth in the Joel division and at the 65th percentile looks like a very conservative estimate.

Kangel79 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by being right, over and over again. The receiver corps alone makes a statement: A.J. Brown at WR8, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 are all projected starters, and none of them cost a king's ransom. Then Trey McBride at TE2 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give the roster a second tier of elite talent that most managers would kill for. The draft grade backs up the eye test, with steals at quarterback materializing when Brock Purdy fell to pick 8.03 despite an ADP of 5.09 and Aaron Rodgers slid more than four full rounds past his expected range. The one genuine blemish is Ja'Kobi Lane, reached 3.6 rounds early, but a single late-round overreach doesn't dent a draft this measured. After finishing in the 21st percentile in 2025, Kangel79 looks like a team that did its homework and landed at 77th percentile for a reason.

JerryWarz97 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick, they won it by repeatedly being right. Drake Maye came off the board at 3.05 despite carrying a QB2 projection, a full round and change after his ADP suggested he should have been gone. Jonathan Taylor landed at 2.08 with an RB4 projection and still represented value against where the field was taking him. That's the pattern here: six players acquired past their ADP, zero major reaches, and a receiving corps headlined by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Ladd McConkey at WR20 that gives this roster a genuine weekly ceiling. Even the late rounds held up, with Tyler Shough providing QB20-level upside at a price that barely registered. The one soft spot is Michael Pittman projected at WR44, the weakest projected starter on the sheet, but in a positionless format, the top of this roster carries enough weight that Pittman is a footnote, not a flaw. Third in the Joel division and 82nd percentile overall, JerryWarz97 built a contender the quiet way.

LaMafiaPacheca sits second in the Joel division and in the 90th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: five genuine values against one major reach, with the good picks spread across the board rather than concentrated in one lucky run. Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Caleb Williams at QB6 both fell to this manager, Jackson by four spots and Williams by a full two rounds, and that kind of quiet accumulation at the top of the board is how contenders are built. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchors the skill-position group, and Rashee Rice at WR13 projects as a difference-maker when available, though "when available" is doing real work there: a suspension, concussion symptoms, a knee procedure, and now a probation violation have turned Rice into a fantasy soap opera with a highlight reel attached. The floor here is genuinely high regardless, because the manager consistently came out ahead on the deal without mortgaging the middle rounds to do it.

DadVader did not stumble into correlation, they built toward it with intention. The spine of this roster is a pair of Cincinnati stacks: Joe Burrow at QB4 running with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Tee Higgins at WR19, meaning a big Bengals game does not just lift one starter, it floods the scoresheet. Jared Goff at QB16 paired with Jameson Williams at WR21 gives DadVader a second connected engine, so the team is never fully dependent on one offense having a signature week. Getting Burrow at pick 4.10 when his ADP sat at 2.05 is the kind of draft capital that makes the whole structure work, because landing a QB4 two-plus rounds late gives you the room to spend early picks on Chase and George Pickens at WR10. The ceiling here is real and it is tied directly to those pairings firing together, which is exactly the point. DadVader is not hoping the stacks hit. They are the plan.
