The Superflex of Us sits at the 5th percentile of the field, and the draft board tells you exactly why. The most damning evidence arrives early: Calvin Ridley, projected WR78, was taken nearly six rounds before his ADP, and Cooper Kupp, projected WR88, went nearly six rounds early as well. Those two picks consumed real draft capital on players projected to be fringe contributors, and there is no soft way to frame that. The damage compounds when you see that the team logged five major reaches across the roster and not a single steal, meaning no good fortune arrived to offset the self-inflicted wounds. There is a functional core here, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 are genuine assets, and the Daniels/Terry McLaurin stack adds some upside. But finishing 35th percentile in scoring in 2025 and then drafting like this in 2026 is not a rebuild, it is a continuation. Las Lucirnagas has a lot of teams. The Superflex of Us appears to be feeding them.

Last year aaronmaverick went 30-6 and scored in the 100th percentile, which is the kind of season that buys you a reputation you then have to live up to. The 2026 roster does not look like a team eager to do that. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are legitimate top-end pieces, but the draft offers little reason for optimism beyond that core. Thirteen chalk picks and two major reaches suggest a manager who paid market rate for most of what they got and overpaid for some of it, including Bo Nix, taken nearly two rounds before his ADP despite projecting as a QB15. A positionless format rewards depth at the top, and what sits below McCaffrey and Barkley, a WR9 in Nico Collins, a TE15 in Dallas Goedert, is serviceable but not the kind of profile that replicates 5,360 points. The current division rank of 11th and tournament percentile of 11th say the same thing the roster does: 2025 was the peak, and the distance between that memory and this projection is uncomfortably wide.

The House of Downs sits 10th in Las Lucirnagas and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and there is no clean explanation to hide behind. The draft produced three major reaches, headlined by Nicholas Singleton at RB57 taken a stunning 7.4 rounds ahead of his current projection, a pick that looks increasingly difficult to defend. The roster does have a genuine star at the top, Bijan Robinson grading out as RB2 and De'Von Achane as RB6, but the deeper you go the faster the returns diminish, and the projected weakest starter, Josh Downs at WR46, is a ceiling more than a floor at that spot in a lineup. The wild card is Malik Nabers. After a torn ACL that his new head coach John Harbaugh called "not simple," Nabers looked like himself in training camp and shed the PUP concerns that haunted dynasty circles all summer, but whether he is fully available for Week 1 alongside an unproven quarterback remains an open question. For a team already short on margin, banking on that answer being yes is not a strategy, it is a prayer.

Owen Moore enters 2026 sitting ninth in Las Lucirnagas and in just the 21st percentile of the field, and the roster offers little reason to expect a climb. The surface reading looks decent enough: James Cook (RB5) and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) give the lineup a legitimate core, and Drake Maye (QB2) is as good as the position gets in this format. But once you get past that upper crust, the drop-off is steep and the draft did not soften the landing. Moore reached 2.3 rounds early for Wan'Dale Robinson (WR47) and 3.7 rounds early for Elic Ayomanor (WR95), two of the weakest projected starters in the field at their ranks, and neither pick came with the kind of upside that justifies that kind of aggression. The WR group grades out as genuinely weak, and with Jadarian Price (RB26) projected as the floor of the starting lineup, there is no obvious lever left to pull. This roster is not a project, it is a ceiling, and that ceiling is low.

iamcoryOO enters 2026 sitting 8th in Las Lucirnagas and in the bottom quarter of the entire field, and the roster makes it hard to argue with either number. The foundation is legitimately exciting: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the RB1, Lamar Jackson anchors the QB spot despite being taken two spots past his ADP, and DeVonta Smith finally gets his shot as a true alpha receiver in Philadelphia now that A.J. Brown is gone. That is a real core. The problem is what surrounds it. Tony Pollard, the projected weakest starter at RB30, cost iamcoryOO a 7th-round pick on an 11th-round player, a 3.7-round overpay that left the roster thin in the middle. Travis Kelce lands as TE10, which is respectable, but this team needed backfield insurance and depth that punches above average, not a fading legend taken a round early. When your best-case scenario requires Gibbs to carry a heavy load and Smith to become everything Eagles fans hope, you are already one injury away from irrelevance.

Sucellus sits exactly where margin-of-error teams live: good enough to beat anyone on a given week, not good enough to make anyone sweat during roster construction. The receiver group is the clearest strength, with Puka Nacua projecting as WR1 and Rashee Rice at WR13 anchoring a corps that can carry a lineup on the right Sunday. Jaylen Waddle at WR23 adds a legitimately intriguing wrinkle, moving from Miami's dysfunction into a Denver offense where Bo Nix threw more passes than anyone in the league last year, which is the kind of low-cost upside that separates 8-8 teams from 10-6 teams in a tournament like this. Where it gets trickier is the draft process: four major reaches, including Christian Kirk taken more than four rounds ahead of his ADP, represent real opportunity cost that tends to show up in the margins of a long season. Rhamondre Stevenson projecting as the weakest starter is manageable, not fatal. This team does not scare you. It also does not lose easily. That is both its promise and its ceiling.

RAGRAM is a team built entirely on the margins, and that is both the source of its ceiling and the explanation for its 53rd-percentile projection. The foundation is legitimately good: Josh Allen at QB1 anchors everything, Omarion Hampton projects as RB9, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 gives this roster a reliable edge at a position where most managers are scraping. The problem is that the depth required to sustain a long tournament is uneven. Drake London at WR7 is a genuine weapon, but after him the receiver group leans heavily on projected starters like Michael Wilson at WR39 and Makai Lemon at WR40, players who need things to go right. The draft did not create much margin either, finishing with one steal and one major reach in Pat Bryant, taken more than three rounds before his ADP. RAGRAM does not lose the season on any single decision, but it does not win it on any single decision either. In Las Lucirnagas, that kind of roster sits at sixth and waits for the field to make mistakes.

Cowboy on a Lamb didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by not losing anywhere. The receiver group is the clearest evidence: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Chris Olave (WR11), Garrett Wilson (WR17), and Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) are all projected starters, and that kind of consistent quality across four spots doesn't happen by accident. Jonathan Taylor (RB4) anchors the backfield with the sort of projection that makes opponents nervous from week one, and Javonte Williams (RB17) and TreVeyon Henderson (RB19) keep the floor high behind him. Where the draft gets quietly clever is at quarterback, where C.J. Stroud landed at QB22 despite an ADP that had him going more than two rounds earlier, and Tua Tagovailoa fell over three full rounds past his market price to land as QB31. Neither is a world-beater at those ranks, but both were free money relative to what the field was paying. Fifth in Las Lucirnagas and 55th percentile in the field is a fair starting point for a roster this consistently constructed, with real room to climb.

Oshenta y osho & GOTI did not win this draft on one big swing. They won it by consistently landing players after the market had already moved on. Tyler Warren, projected TE4, slid nearly a full round past his ADP and was waiting. Jake Ferguson, projected TE12, fell another round and a half. Jameson Williams, projected WR21, dropped over a round before this team stepped in. Four values, one steal, thirteen chalk picks, and only one significant misstep in Kyler Murray, taken nearly three rounds ahead of schedule. The upside on Murray is real, and the stack with Justin Jefferson, projected WR6, gives this roster a genuine ceiling-raiser. The foundation underneath that stack is what makes it interesting: Jefferson anchors the receiving corps, McBride projects as TE2, and Williams rounds out a starting group that was assembled without a single moment of panic buying. Last year's

squad scored in the 87th percentile, and this version looks built to at least hold that standard. At 60th percentile in projected tournament standing, there is room to climb.

Lyn May Fanclub lands at 94th percentile in the field and third in the division, and the draft record tells you exactly why: no splashy steals, just a quiet, consistent string of wins against the board. The engine here is the receiver group, where Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a pair of genuine difference-makers, with Ladd McConkey at WR20 adding a third projected starter who would headline lesser rosters. What makes the draft story compelling, though, is where the quarterbacks came from. Dak Prescott ranked QB7 slid a full round and a half past his ADP before Lyn May scooped him, and Patrick Mahomes, projected at QB12, fell nearly two rounds before landing here. Getting that kind of production at a discount late is not luck, it is patience rewarded. The one blemish is Jerry Jeudy, taken nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP, but with this much talent projected to start, that reach gets absorbed without much pain.

betoromanom didn't build this roster on one splashy gamble. They built it the way good drafts actually get built, by staying patient and letting the board come to them. The centerpiece is a Brock Bowers and Kyle Pitts pairing at tight end that gives this team a TE1 and TE7 as projected starters, the kind of positional advantage that quietly tilts weekly matchups before the first snap. The quarterback room is just as loaded, with Joe Burrow projecting as QB4 alongside a Caleb Williams who slid all the way to pick 5.07 despite projecting as QB6, a gift of over two rounds relative to his ADP. The Burrow and Tee Higgins stack adds another layer of upside, two players whose connection gives betoromanom a ceiling that activates at the same time. Throw in Christian Watson as a WR28 grabbed nearly two rounds late, and you have a draft that kept finding edges in quiet places. The result is a roster sitting second in Las Lucirnagas and in the 95th percentile of the field. That's not luck. That's a well-run draft.

Yaircrespo did not win this draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by being right, repeatedly, across nearly every round. The foundation is a receiver corps that holds up to serious scrutiny: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, George Pickens at WR10, Luther Burden at WR22, and Davante Adams at WR25 are all projected starters, and Yaircrespo acquired Harold Fannin, a TE6 projection, almost two full rounds after his average draft position. That kind of consistent surplus is what separates a 96th-percentile roster from a lucky one. There are two reaches worth noting, Fernando Mendoza at QB27 and Theo Johnson at TE37, but they arrive in a draft that also produced Justin Herbert at QB8, taken after his ADP, and Harold Fannin grabbed late. The minor miscalculations are absorbed before they can matter. Sitting first in Las Lucirnagas, this is a team built the quiet way, no single flashy moment to point to, just a draft that kept coming out ahead of the board.
