issues, with questionable decisions overshadowing any glimmers of value found in late-round picks. As the season unfolds, it feels like the team is on a treadmill to nowhere, desperately needing a turnaround but finding themselves stuck in a quagmire of their own making.

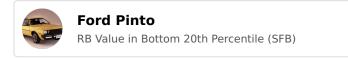

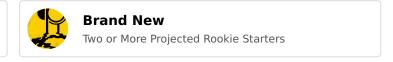
