There is no spin available for drjessemorse, and the draft record makes that plain: four major reaches, three minor reaches, and zero steals across the whole board. The defining sin is not any single pick but the cumulative pattern of overpaying everywhere that mattered. George Pickens, taken nearly a full round early at WR10, is a fine player who cost too much. Parker Washington, a WR35 projection taken 2.2 rounds before the market agreed, is not a fine player and still cost too much. Tyquan Thornton, a projected WR97 taken 4.1 rounds ahead of his ADP, is the moment that turns a questionable draft into a cautionary tale. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 is genuinely good, and Zay Flowers and Jameson Williams project as credible starters, so the ceiling is not zero. But this roster sits in the sixth percentile of the field for a reason, and that reason is a manager who consistently saw the board differently than everyone else and was consistently wrong. The Scott Fish Bowl does not grade on a curve.

CAPSLOCKJR lands 11th in the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division and in the 8th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how it happened: zero steals, zero values, nine chalk picks, and four major reaches that read like a case study in self-sabotage. Keon Coleman at WR91 was taken nearly six rounds early, Mac Jones at QB39 went five rounds before his number was called, and Ryan Flourney was grabbed four rounds ahead of schedule, all of which means CAPSLOCKJR paid premium prices for players whose projected ranks suggest they were already being generously evaluated. The roster does have genuine anchor talent. Joe Burrow and Brock Bowers give the team a QB4 and TE1, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack adds some connective tissue. But Mike Evans is now on his third act with San Francisco after injuries ended his consecutive 1,000-yard streak and his time in Tampa, and he projects as WR27. When your best argument for optimism requires leaning on a recovering 30-something and a backup quarterback in Brock Purdy, you have already lost the plot.

Raminator sits 10th in the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division and in the 27th percentile of the field, and the draft log explains exactly why. The core problem is not bad luck but bad sequencing: five major reaches across the board, starting with George Kittle at pick 5.03, pulled more than two rounds ahead of his ADP. Kittle is a TE9 projection attached to a genuine injury question, having torn his Achilles in the 2025 NFL playoffs, and his "on track for Week 1" optimism is the kind of language that ages poorly. That reach at five displaced whatever upside was sitting on the board, and Raminator kept pulling the same lever, grabbing TreVeyon Henderson at 4.10 when Henderson's ADP sat at 7.01. The one thing working here is the receiver group, anchored by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8, but Raminator needed those picks to carry a draft that gave them almost nothing to work with elsewhere. Chase and Brown can win you weeks. They cannot fix a draft construction that reads like someone kept panic-buying comfort picks until the board ran out.

There is a particular kind of fantasy misery that comes not from catastrophe but from adequacy, and Steevy Teevy Tavi, Bitch! is drowning in it heading into 2026. The roster sits ninth in the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division and in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the draft did almost nothing to change that trajectory, producing zero steals, fourteen chalk picks, and a haul of minor reaches that suggest a manager paying slightly above market for players who were already available. The one genuine bright spot is Puka Nacua at WR1, a legitimate anchor, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 alongside Travis Kelce at TE10 gives the team real firepower at the top. But the problem is the middle. Javonte Williams projects as RB17, which is serviceable, and then the depth falls off a cliff into Kenneth Gainwell at RB34 and J.K. Dobbins at RB36. The 2025 season ended at .500 with a 68th-percentile scoring output that never translated into wins, and right now there is no obvious reason to expect that math to improve.

Last year cbsheath finished in the 82nd percentile, and the temptation is to pencil in a similar outcome and move on. The 2026 roster politely disagrees. The team lands at just the 45th percentile in tournament projections and sits eighth in the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division, a gap between reputation and reality wide enough to matter. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, Colston Loveland comes in at TE3, and Kyle Pitts and Sam LaPorta give the lineup genuine positional depth that most managers would envy. But the receiver group is thin where it counts, with Rashee Rice at WR13 as the lone projected starter with a credible ceiling and the rest of the corps filled out by players in the WR52-to-WR99 range. Then there is Josh Jacobs, projected RB16 and a cornerstone of the backfield, currently navigating an offseason arrest with no charges filed and no resolution in

sight. Gibbs can carry a lot, but cbsheath is essentially betting that last year's version of this team still exists. The projections suggest it does not.

Swan Song is the kind of team that finishes 7-6 and spends the whole season wondering which version it is. The foundation is genuinely good: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster a ceiling most teams in the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division cannot match, and Tyler Warren at TE4 paired with Harold Fannin at TE6 means the tight end group alone could carry weeks when everything else goes sideways. The problem is that the margins close fast once you move past those names. The receiver group projects weak, with Michael Wilson at WR39 as the projected starter most likely to lose a close matchup on a given week. The draft did not generate much of an edge either, with 15 chalk picks and just one genuine value, Trevor Lawrence falling a full round past his ADP. None of this is disqualifying. But 54th percentile teams do not win championships because they are comfortable, and Swan Song will need Taylor and Warren to be exceptional before the depth is ever asked to be merely adequate.

Larry Schechter didn't go hunting for a signature moment in the draft, and he didn't need one. The résumé here is built on consistency: 15 chalk picks as the foundation, three good values layered on top, and a steal that quietly reshapes the back end of the roster. David Njoku fell three and a half rounds past his ADP before Schechter scooped him up at pick 18.05, turning a late-round selection into a projected TE29 contributor that costs almost nothing in draft capital. Pair that with Trey McBride at TE2 leading the starters, and Schechter extracted real value from a position most managers treat as an afterthought. The running game is similarly sound: Derrick Henry at RB12, Breece Hall at RB14, and D'Andre Swift at RB24 give this roster the kind of consistent projected production that compounds over a long season. Drake Maye projects as a QB2. At 59th percentile in the field, Schechter hasn't done anything flashy, but round after round, this draft simply came out ahead.

KendallDolphinz didn't load up on one flashy piece and hope for the best. They just kept winning the exchange, pick after pick, until the roster quietly became something worth respecting. The foundation is genuinely elite: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this team a top-end that most managers in the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division can't match, and Saquon Barkley slid nearly a full round past his ADP before KendallDolphinz scooped him at WR8. That's the kind of quiet discipline that separates good drafts from great ones. Jaylen Waddle, Terry McLaurin, and Jalen Hurts round out a projected starting group that has real scoring upside, and even Brenton Strange, a steal at TE17 taken more than two rounds after his ADP, gives the team a respectable floor at a position that often gets punted. The 2025 season was rough, a 25th-percentile finish that suggests this roster needed a reboot. Based on this draft, the reboot happened.

After finishing in the bottom 17 percent of scoring in 2025, dylznick has clearly come to collect. The foundation of this rebound starts with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and a quarterback room featuring Jayden Daniels at QB5 and Caleb Williams at QB6, both projected starters, giving this team legitimate elite-level firepower at the top. Chris Olave, a projected starter at WR11, was a genuine value pick, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP, and he anchors a receiver group that can carry real weekly weight. The draft was mostly disciplined, with four values and just two minor reaches across the board. The one asterisk worth watching is Oronde Gadsden at TE16, a projected starter who showed real receiving chops last season before the Chargers signed David Njoku late, clouding what had been a cleaner role. That is a situation to monitor, not a reason to panic. After the misery of 2025, this roster looks like a genuine step forward, and a 62nd percentile projection in a loaded field says the rebound is already well underway.

There was no single heist in smooth1074's draft, no moment where the room gasped and the feed lit up. There was just round after round of quiet, compounding competence, and that is exactly how you end up in the 75th percentile of the field. Kenneth Walker III fell a full round past his ADP before smooth1074 scooped him at RB10. Jeremiyah Love followed the same pattern, sliding 1.2 rounds before landing at RB13. Nico Collins drifted nearly a round past his number and became a WR9 starter. Seven values across the roster, zero steals necessary, because smooth1074 simply let the board come to them and took what the room left behind. Lamar Jackson anchors the quarterback situation as a projected QB3, and Christian McCaffrey at RB3 gives the roster a genuine difference-maker at the top. The one blemish is Skyler Bell, taken more than seven rounds ahead of his ADP, but that is a footnote on a draft that otherwise reads like a clinic in patience. Third in the division, with good reason.

michugana did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by simply refusing to lose their draft picks at fair value or worse. The headline is the wide receiver group, where Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 form a projected starting core that most managers in this field would mortgage a pick or two to acquire. Then add Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 as a fourth option and the depth starts to look almost unfair. The running back side holds up just as well, with Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Chase Brown at RB11 as projected starters anchoring a group that goes eight names deep. Matthew Stafford landing at QB14 in round eight when his average draft position sat in round six is the kind of quiet arithmetic that separates good drafts from great ones. michugana finished 2025 in the 76th percentile and now projects at the 86th. The work is showing.

RB2K sits atop the Grand Theft Auto Vice City division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: this team won quietly, one good decision at a time. The headliner is Baker Mayfield, a QB18 projection snagged three full rounds after his ADP, which is the kind of surplus value that wins championships without anyone noticing until the standings are posted. Malik Nabers came nearly a round cheaper than the market asked, too, and at WR12 he gives this roster a genuine alpha at the skill positions. The backfield is where the floor gets built: De'Von Achane at RB6, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Kyren Williams at RB15 form a projected starter group that very few teams in this field can match in terms of collective upside. Zach Charbonnet, taken three rounds ahead of his ADP, is the one spot where the draft cost more than it should have, but when the rest of the board looks like this, one overpay is a rounding error. RB2K didn't force anything. They just kept coming out ahead.
