As Eric Vanek (@EricVanekNFL) approaches the 2025 fantasy football season, the outlook is far from promising. Coming off a dominant 2024 performance with an enviable 88 percentile finish and a solid 61% winning record, expectations were high. However, this year, the team finds itself languishing at 11th place in the MiamiSharks division and ranking in the disappointing 3rd percentile overall. The quarterback situation is shaky at best, with Dak Prescott and Geno Smith struggling to make any significant impact. While the running back corps is undeniably strong, boasting players like De'Von Achane and Derrick Henry, it seems that this strength is overshadowed by glaring weaknesses elsewhere. The wide receiver position is a particular concern, with Emeka Egbuka being the team's only notable option, and the reliance on J.K. Dobbins as a starter adds another layer of uncertainty. Despite snagging some late-round value with players like Austin Ekeler and Jaxson Dart,

questionable draft decisions may haunt them—reaching too early for players such as Derrick Henry and Rj Harvey could prove costly. As the season unfolds, the once-promising squad faces an uphill battle to regain its former glory amidst tough competition and internal inconsistencies.
