WORKnGRIND sits at the 5th percentile of the field and dead last in the City of Heroes division, and the draft log explains exactly how it got there. The most damaging entry is Elijah Sarratt, a WR98 taken 6.4 rounds ahead of his ADP, which is not aggressive drafting so much as it is paying a penthouse price for a storage unit. Sam LaPorta went in the fourth round at a cost of nearly two rounds of premium capital to land a TE8, a reach that would sting less if the WR room weren't anchored by Mike Evans, a WR27 who played just eight games last season, ended his consecutive 1,000-yard streak, and now heads to San Francisco with plenty of questions trailing him. The steal column reads zero. The major reach column reads three. Chris Bell lands at WR87 after another early pull. The projected starter list is not without names, Ashton Jeanty and Lamar Jackson carry real weight, but the supporting cast was assembled as if the manager was drafting against himself, and winning.

There is something almost admirable about how completely calburgam committed to correlation, right up until you notice this team sits at 6th percentile in the field and 11th in the City of Heroes division. The architecture is clear: Drake Maye paired with A.J. Brown at WR8, Jordan Love stacked with both Christian Watson at WR28 and Tucker Kraft at TE5. When those pairings fire, the ceiling climbs fast. The problem is the cost of building around them. Brown was a reach of nearly a full round at 2.01, Kraft was grabbed early at 4.01, and the Love connections required even more capital. That draft capital had to come from somewhere, and it came from the running back group, where the projected top option is Chuba Hubbard at RB29. This roster does not hedge. It does not diversify. It prays that Maye finds Brown on the same Sunday that Love finds Watson and Kraft. That is a parlay, not a fantasy team, and most parlays lose.

DixonCox9775 sits at 10th in the City of Heroes division and the 16th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: zero steals, four major reaches, and not a single moment where the board broke their way. The most telling detail is the tight end stack, where Jake Ferguson, AJ Barner, Cade Otton, and Darnell Washington were all taken a full two-plus rounds before their respective ADPs, a series of panicked overcorrections that burned the capital needed to build elsewhere. Justin Jefferson at WR6 is the one genuine bright spot, a player who slid to 2.05 when his ADP sat at 1.12 and who seems poised to remind the league what he looks like with a quarterback who can actually find him, now that Kyler Murray has arrived in Minnesota. But Jefferson carrying a roster this thin on upside is its own kind of cruel joke. When your weakest projected starter is

Jalen Coker at WR55 and your draft log reads like a hostage negotiation with your own panic, the charitable read simply does not exist.

AndrewVcourt enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting ninth in the City of Heroes division and in just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the roster doesn't offer much to argue with either of those numbers. The core is built around Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1) and Jonathan Taylor (RB4), two legitimate difference-makers, but the draft surrounding them was mostly chalk with four major reaches, and those reaches didn't buy upside so much as they bought more tight ends. Pat Freiermuth (TE30), Gunnar Helm (TE26), and Michael Mayer (TE39) were all pulled forward by two to three and a half rounds, rounds that could have shored up a wide receiver group that projects Romeo Doubs as the WR53 and lists him as the weakest projected starter. Justin Herbert grades out as a QB8 and Patrick Mahomes carries the Mahomes/Travis Kelce stack, so the ceiling is visible, but ceilings require floors, and this one keeps dipping. When your best argument for optimism is "well, Gibbs is really good," you're not building a case so much as stalling for time.

Trusttheprocess sits at 34th percentile and eighth in the City of Heroes division, and the roster does not hide why. The foundation is genuinely strong: Josh Allen is a QB1 and Jalen Hurts slots in as QB9, with the Allen/DeVonta Smith stack adding a nice bonus layer. But the draft revealed where this team's real problems were buried. Juwan Johnson, a TE20, was taken 4.1 rounds before his ADP, a reach so aggressive it swallowed a mid-draft pick that could have shored up real value elsewhere. Meanwhile the projected weakest starter is Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, which tells you the floor here is not comfortable. James Cook at RB5 is a legitimate asset and arrived as the draft's best value, but one elite back and two strong quarterbacks cannot paper over a roster that logged two major reaches and only one outright steal across the whole board. The process, it turns out, did not trust the market.

The City of Heroes division may need to find its heroism elsewhere, because eltalén is staring down a 7th-place projection and sitting at just the 43rd percentile of the field with precious little rope left to climb. The receiver corps looks genuinely impressive on paper, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and George Pickens (WR10) anchoring a group that runs several names deep, but in a positionless format the whole roster has to hold up, and the quarterback situation is quietly catastrophic. Bryce Young (QB26) and Aaron Rodgers (QB29) are the options under center, and projecting the weakest starter on your team at QB26 is not a crisis you can paper over with good receivers. Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) could theoretically add a boost, but his 2025 was undermined by injuries and a concerning disconnect with Trevor Lawrence, which makes leaning on him feel more like a wish than a plan. The draft showed mostly chalk with four reaches and only one genuine steal. There is no cavalry coming.

RayFincklesFootballCamp didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently landing where the board was soft. The backfield alone makes a case: Bijan Robinson at RB2, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Kyren Williams at RB15 give this roster a floor that most managers would envy, and that foundation was built before the mid-rounds even got interesting. Then the receivers came in and held up their end, with Nico Collins at WR9, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and Terry McLaurin at WR24 projecting as reliable contributors. Collins was technically a minor reach at pick 2.07, but taking a WR9 a few spots early is hardly a confession. The quarterback picture is the one place the team needs a break to go its way. Kyler Murray, coming off a lisfranc injury that cost him most of last season, now sits in a quarterback competition in Minnesota, and while prevailing opinion says the job is his to lose, that qualifier matters in a tournament where every edge counts. Still, at the 58th percentile, this roster has a legitimate argument for more.

JonnyDanger34 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. This is a roster built on consistent execution, round after round, and the standings reflect it: 67th percentile in the field, fifth in the City of Heroes division, which is exactly the kind of position you build toward rather than stumble into. The foundation is legitimate. Joe Burrow checks in as QB4, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack gives this team a weekly ceiling that most managers would trade for on the spot. Brock Bowers at TE1 is the kind of positional anchor that quietly tilts games, and Mark Andrews at TE14 sitting behind him keeps the depth honest. The real draft story, though, is Brock Purdy, a QB13 projection scooped up at pick 8.08 when his ADP suggested he'd be gone nearly three rounds earlier. That's not luck, that's a manager reading the room. Fourteen chalk picks alongside just one steal sounds conservative on paper, but when the chalk includes a TE1 and a QB4, conservative is just another word for correct.

Messy69 is sitting at 74th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl field and fourth in the City of Heroes division, and the draft record tells you exactly how they got there: no dramatic lottery tickets, just a consistent pattern of coming out ahead on value. Davante Adams at WR25 fell more than a round past his ADP, David Montgomery at RB23 slipped a round and a half, and Bo Nix at QB15 tumbled a full two-plus rounds before Messy69 quietly helped themselves. None of those pickups individually reshapes a roster, but three value acquisitions stacking on top of each other absolutely do. The one blemish worth noting is Dallas Goedert, taken nearly three rounds early at TE15, which is the kind of reach that burns draft capital before it has a chance to compound. Jayden Daniels at QB5 anchors the passing game and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is the sort of top-end talent that wins weeks outright. This roster did not get built on one bold swing. It got built by winning small, repeatedly, and that adds up.

k9ike lands at third in the division and the 77th percentile of the field, and the draft that got them there reads less like a gamble and more like a steady hand collecting what the board offered. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchors the top of the roster with the kind of dependability that makes every other decision easier, and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 gives that same floor at receiver. From there, k9ike layered in real upside: Malik Nabers at WR12 and Rashee Rice at WR13 give the team three projected starters who can each carry a week, and the Jaxson Dart stack with Nabers adds a ceiling that a flat roster simply cannot manufacture. Dart brings legitimate mobile-quarterback upside, even if his passing volume and durability have given observers reason to temper expectations. The two genuine values on the board, Trevor Lawrence and Cam Skattebo, came a full round past their ADPs, and not a single major reach mars the sheet. There was no lottery ticket moment here, just a draft that kept coming out ahead.

Crusadin sits second in the City of Heroes division and at the 93rd percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is legitimate: Saquon Barkley at RB8 came off the board a full round and change after his ADP, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 followed with a similar discount, meaning this team grabbed two top-15 running backs for prices that felt like a clearance sale. Then Quinshon Judkins at RB22 slid two full rounds past his ADP into Crusadin's lap, which is the kind of thing that makes other managers check if they misread the draft order. The receiver room is anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, who pairs with Jared Goff in a proven stack, while Caleb Williams connects with Colston Loveland in a second stack that adds another layer of upside. Five values, one steal, and almost nothing paid above market. The weakest projected starter is Makai Lemon at WR40, and even that complaint feels like splitting hairs on a draft this clean.

WyzMan didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't anchor the roster to one transcendent name. This team was built pick by pick, and the draft sheet shows it: five values, one outright steal, against just two reaches of any note. The headliner is Puka Nacua at WR1, which is a genuinely elite anchor, and the Stafford stack running behind him adds connective tissue, not redundancy, given that Matthew Stafford spent last season setting a career high in touchdown passes on the way to an MVP award. He may be playing with a clock ticking above his head in Los Angeles, but the projection still says QB14, and WyzMan got him a full round later than the market expected. Drake London landing at WR7 for a late second-round pick tells the same story. None of these individual moments were heroic, but the compounding effect is a roster sitting first in the City of Heroes division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, which is exactly where steady drafting tends to land you.
