There is no sugarcoating the situation in the PBA Pro Bowling division: MyPeneilsBigger sits third in the division and in just the third percentile of the entire field, and the roster explains why. The draft tendencies tell a grim story before a single game is played, with two major reaches and zero steals across the board, meaning this manager consistently paid more than market rate and never once found a bargain. The most damaging overpay is D.J. Moore, a WR26 projection snagged 2.5 rounds early at pick 4.02, which is the kind of move that collapses the middle of a draft like a sinkhole. Ashton Jeanty grades out as a legitimate RB7 and gives the roster a real centerpiece, but the supporting cast fades fast, and when your projected weakest starter is C.J. Stroud at QB22, you are not exactly papering over cracks. George Kittle at TE9 offers some upside, but he too was a minor reach. This is a team built on hope and overspending, which is a combination that tends to finish exactly where the projections say it will.

There is no polite way to dress up what FFNICKM is working with here. Sitting 11th in the PBA Pro Bowling division and projected in just the 6th percentile of the entire field, this roster needed a draft that swung for the fences and instead came back holding five reaches against zero steals. The two most glaring ones define the problem: Tyler Warren and Kyle Pitts were both taken ahead of their ADPs, and while Warren projects as TE4 and Pitts as TE7, those early investments crowded out capital that could have shored up the top of the lineup. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 give the roster a pulse, but after them the drop is steep and quick, with projected starters like Jaylen Waddle at WR23 and Rico Dowdle at RB32 carrying the floor. Jared Goff sits at QB16, which is passable, except that a passable QB is about the most exciting thing on this sheet. When your most adventurous draft decisions were made at a position of already settled strength, there is not much left to tinker with now.

CommieEsq sits 10th in the PBA Pro Bowling division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the draft offers little reason to expect a climb. The roster carries no steals and no values, just 14 chalk picks and six reaches, including two major ones. Pulling Sam LaPorta nearly two rounds early makes some sense given his TE8 projection, but burning a 17th-round pick on Tory Horton, a WR93, to beat an ADP of round 20 is the kind of urgency that looks misplaced in hindsight. The real problem is at the top. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Joe Burrow at QB4 are legitimate stars, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 gives the lineup a third credible piece. But the drop-off is steep and fast. Chuba Hubbard projects as the weakest starter at RB29, and the receiver group beyond Smith gets thin in a hurry. There is no obvious trade target hiding in surplus, no late-round lottery ticket with upside. CommieEsq drafted chalk, reached anyway, and still landed near the bottom. That is a difficult combination to explain and a harder one to fix.

CorporalEddy is not hedging his bets in 2026, he is doubling down on them. The entire architecture here runs through two stacks: Jayden Daniels paired with Terry McLaurin, and Matthew Stafford paired with Puka Nacua. Nacua projects as WR1 and Daniels comes in at QB5, so the ceiling on those pairings is genuinely high, but the floor is somewhere in a drainage ditch. If Stafford and Nacua are clicking in Los Angeles and Daniels and McLaurin are doing the same in Washington, CorporalEddy is a problem. If both games go sideways on the same Sunday, the rest of this roster has to carry an ugly load, and the projected starters behind those two stacks, Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Isaiah Likely at TE13, are solid but not transformative. The draft itself was mostly chalk with a few minor reaches sprinkled in, which is fine when your plan is correlation, not arbitrage. Coming off a 99th-percentile scoring season in 2025, CorporalEddy clearly knows how to build a winner. Whether the stacks hit is the only question that matters.

The Victorville Kitty Cats sit at 37th percentile in the field and eighth in the PBA Pro Bowling division, and nothing in the construction of this roster makes a compelling argument for optimism. The running back group is genuinely strong, with James Cook (RB5), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Breece Hall (RB14) anchoring a deep and talented core. But in a positionless format, having elite players at one position only matters if the rest of the roster can keep pace, and that is where Victorville runs into trouble. Baker Mayfield (QB18) is a shaky source of production, especially with Mike Evans now gone in free agency and no clear path back to his 2024 form. CeeDee Lamb (WR5) is legitimately elite, but Rashee Rice (WR13) and Jake Ferguson (TE12) are merely fine, and the rest of the projected starters grade out as filler. The drafting offered no escape hatch, producing zero steals and one value against five reaches, including James Conner (RB56) taken nearly four rounds early. This roster needed precision at the margins and got the opposite.

Nobody FFs with the Jesus isn't here to make enemies or headlines, just to quietly cash a check somewhere around the 54th percentile. The roster's ceiling runs through its tight end corps, where Brock Bowers (TE1) and Trey McBride (TE2) give this team an advantage at the position that most managers are still arguing about in October. Both were legitimate values on draft day, Bowers slipping to 1.12 against an ADP of 1.07 and McBride landing at 2.01 against an ADP of 1.08, which means this manager got the two best projected tight ends in the field without overpaying for either. That edge gets eroded, though, by the Oronde Gadsden situation, a reach of 3.4 rounds that consumed real capital on a TE16 projection when that same equity could have shored up a receiver room where Zay Flowers (WR16) and Ladd McConkey (WR20) are doing the heavy lifting. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) provides a passable floor. This team wins when its values show up and loses when the reaches remind it they were reaches.

jlm2288 didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster, just consistent execution round after round. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the whole operation, and Nico Collins at WR9 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give this team a pair of projected starters who can carry a week on their own. The values scattered through the draft tell the real story: Dak Prescott slipped nearly two full rounds past his ADP before jlm2288 grabbed him at 5.02, and Dalton Kincaid fell a full round before landing here as a projected starter at TE11. That kind of quiet patience across fifteen chalk picks and three genuine values is how you build a 65th-percentile roster without ever swinging for the fences. The 2025 campaign backs up the approach, a 31-5 record and a 90th-percentile scoring season suggests this manager knows how to convert a well-constructed roster into actual points. Sitting sixth in the PBA Pro Bowling division, jlm2288 has the depth to climb.

BBK13 did not win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead on value, and the cumulative effect is a roster that lands at the 73rd percentile of the field. The backfield anchors that case: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, and Omarion Hampton slots in at RB9, meaning BBK13 secured two high-end contributors before most managers were thinking about their second. George Pickens drew a minor reach at WR10, but that is the kind of reach that tends to age well, and the Jordan Love and Tucker Kraft stack gives the roster a connected upside floor that pure positional spread cannot replicate. Where the draft loses a little shine is in the late rounds, where Malachi Fields and Tyquan Thornton were taken 2.7 and 3.1 rounds ahead of their respective ADPs, the one stretch where BBK13 was chasing instead of waiting. Those picks do not undo a draft built on patience and execution, but they are worth watching if the season turns on the margins, which it usually does.

RZFC drafted like a team that trusted its own board more than anyone else's, and the finished roster makes that posture look prophetic. The audacity starts at the top: Malik Nabers fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before RZFC scooped him at WR12, and Josh Allen arrived as the clean QB1 anchor for a squad that now sits at the 79th percentile of the field. Those are the gifts the board delivered. What RZFC manufactured on its own is the more revealing part of the story. Jalen Tolbert was hauled in nearly six rounds before consensus said he was available, Malik Washington came off the board more than three rounds early, and Emeka Egbuka was taken a round ahead of schedule. Reaches, all of them, by any conventional measure. Yet the projected lineup wears them without apology, with Egbuka slotting in as a projected starter at WR18. Whether RZFC saw something real or simply refused to blink long enough that fortune eventually agreed, the roster does not particularly care about the distinction.

cbone617 walked into the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a plan and stuck to it, and the results are hard to argue with. The story starts at quarterback, where Drake Maye (QB2) and Justin Herbert (QB8) both slid past their ADPs by more than a round each, giving this roster elite upside at the position without paying elite prices. Jonathan Taylor (RB4) fell nearly half a round past his ADP in round two, and the board kept being kind from there, with five values and a steal spread across the draft against zero major reaches. The one reach that stands out, Kyren Williams at RB15, is barely worth noting when the surrounding cast is this strong. Even the weakest projected starter, Wan'Dale Robinson (WR47), was a two-round discount off his ADP, which means cbone617 essentially got a bargain on his own floor. A 28-8 record and 89th-percentile scoring in 2025 suggest this manager knows exactly what they are doing, and the third-place division standing and 83rd-percentile tournament projection say the work is already paying off again.

fluffdaddy855 didn't blow the Scott Fish Bowl draft open with one spectacular heist, and that's precisely the point. This is a roster built on the quiet accumulation of edges, the kind of draft where the scoreboard at the end reads 2-0 in values, 0 in major reaches, and a landing spot of 93rd percentile. The engine runs through Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Colston Loveland at TE3, two projected starters operating near the top of their positions, and the Caleb Williams stack layered underneath gives that combination genuine upside. Williams himself arrived at pick 5.03 despite an ADP of 3.06, a round and a half of free equity that fluffdaddy855 simply pocketed without fanfare. Patrick Mahomes followed at 6.10 against an ADP of 5.08, another quiet win. A.J. Brown at WR8 and Harold Fannin at TE6 round out a starting core that went chalk but landed well. Coming off a 58-percent win rate in 2025, this team doesn't need a dramatic storyline. It needs to keep outperforming the board one pick at a time, and so far, it has.

JWN71 sits atop the PBA Pro Bowling division and in the 93rd percentile of the entire field, and neither number arrived by accident. The blueprint here is disciplined patience: six values scattered across the draft board, just one minor reach, and zero panic picks. Jalen Hurts lands at QB9 despite sliding nearly two full rounds past his ADP, Amon-Ra St. Brown and Drake London come in as WR4 and WR7 respectively among projected starters, and Luther Burden at WR22 fell more than a round into this manager's lap. Travis Kelce, projecting at TE10, arrived a round late as well. That is not luck compounding on luck, that is a drafter who knew prices and waited. The weakest projected starter is Michael Wilson at WR39, which in the context of this roster reads less like a vulnerability and more like a floor worth envying. Last season's 77th-percentile scoring output already showed this operation had teeth. The 2026 version has more of them.
