There is no flattering spin available for nver, a team sitting at the bottom of the Portal division and in the fifth percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The receiver group is genuinely good, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Drake London (WR7), and Chris Olave (WR11), but nver managed to waste draft capital on a supporting cast that reads like a series of confessions. Five major reaches across the board, and not one steal or value to show for any of it. Fernando Mendoza (QB27) was taken nearly five rounds early. Isaac TeSlaa (WR68) cost four-plus rounds of premium. Skyler Bell (WR103) was grabbed seven full rounds ahead of where the market had him, which is not aggressive drafting so much as it is a demonstration of how badly this roster got away from its manager. Matthew Stafford (QB14) is nursing an asterisk next to his name that likely explains why Mendoza exists on this roster at all, and Brenton Strange (TE17) is the kind of TE you end up with when everything upstream has already gone sideways. nver has the receivers to tease but not enough surrounding pieces to compete.

The receiver group is real, and NickFaberNFL deserves credit for landing CeeDee Lamb, Nico Collins, Malik Nabers, Jameson Williams, Davante Adams, and D.J. Moore in the same draft, but that is where the compliments end and the autopsy begins. Collins cost a reach of nearly a full round, Williams cost 1.2 rounds of early capital, and then the back end of the draft dissolved into a loyalty program for running backs nobody else wanted on time. Jordan James was taken four full rounds before his ADP. Tank Bigsby was grabbed 3.4 rounds early. Ray Davis, 2.8 rounds early. J.K. Dobbins, 2.4 rounds early. That is not a draft strategy, that is a panic response to watching running backs disappear off a board that did not need them anywhere near as badly as the manager seemed to think. Meanwhile, Aaron Rodgers and Tua Tagovailoa project as QB29 and QB31 respectively, which means the quarterback position is essentially decorative. The 2025 season went 7-29 and landed in the 11th percentile of scoring. Nothing about this draft suggests 2026 will feel different.

Pizza Time drafted like a team that had read every sleeper column and trusted the process, and the process still left them sitting 10th in the Portal Division at the 27th tournament percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether the process ever existed. The draft efficiency numbers look fine on the surface: 15 chalk picks, a couple of genuine values, and almost nothing taken embarrassingly early. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give the roster a legitimate two-headed backfield foundation, and the Brock Purdy and George Kittle stack is a reasonable way to squeeze connected upside out of two projected starters. But Purdy projects as only QB13, Kittle as TE9, and when you lean into a stack, you need both legs to hold. The cruelty is that Pizza Time did not badly overpay, did not panic, did not lunge for names. They just assembled a collection of fine-but-not-great projections, graded their own homework, and handed it in expecting a B. The Portal Division handed it back with a 10.

PaPaPa-PLAYOFFS?!?!? came to draft day and left with a roster that reads like a cautionary tale told in real time. The skeleton of this team rests on Puka Nacua at WR1, a legitimately elite anchor, but the manager spent early capital reaching for DeVonta Smith at pick 2.11 when Smith's ADP sat at 4.03, then doubled down by grabbing Emeka Egbuka a full round and a half before the market would have delivered him. Those moves might have been defensible if they unlocked late-round steals, but this draft produced zero steals against five major reaches, and the team now sits ninth in the Portal division at the 29th tournament percentile. The 2025 campaign finished at the 16th percentile in scoring, and nothing here suggests a meaningful correction is coming. Sam Darnold, reached two full rounds early, projects as a QB21 sharing the quarterback room with Jaxson Dart. The best version of this roster requires almost everything to break right, and drafts built on this many reaches rarely reward that kind of optimism.

Jason rooftop Thompson enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Portal division and in just the 33rd percentile of the field, and the roster does little to argue against either number. The foundation is legitimately good: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the RB1, and the tight end group anchored by Colston Loveland (TE3), Harold Fannin (TE6), and Mark Andrews (TE14) is a genuine asset. The problem is that those peaks fall off sharply, and the receiver group is where this roster quietly bleeds out, with Michael Wilson checking in at WR39 as the top option at the position. Jayden Daniels carries real upside at QB5, but Tyler Shough was taken 1.7 rounds before his ADP and projects as QB20, which is exactly the kind of draft decision that costs a team when the standings tighten. Thompson went to the well on upside plays repeatedly, reaching on Shough, Tyrone Tracy, Nicholas Singleton, and Demond Claiborne, and the board did not reward the aggression. Gibbs is a star. The rest of this roster is hoping he moonlights as one too.

birsulde sits at the 51st percentile, which is about as on-the-nose a reflection of this roster as you could draw up. The foundation is genuinely strong: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a top-end backfield that most managers would take without blinking, and Caleb Williams at QB6 was a legitimate value, slipping nearly a full round past his ADP. The problem is that the gap between the top of this roster and the bottom is where seasons quietly unravel. Jakobi Meyers projects as the weakest starter at WR45, and when your margin-setters are players like Khalil Shakir and Malik Washington, you need Taylor and Cook to perform at or above projection every single week. There is also the matter of Tre Harris, taken more than three rounds ahead of his ADP and currently projecting at WR72, a reach that hurts in a format where every pick compounds. Seventh in the Portal Division feels right. Not a pushover, not a contender, just a team that needs to run the table on the small decisions it still controls.

Last year was a slog for rmilli231, a bottom-fifth finish in scoring that left little to feel good about entering the offseason. The 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. De'Von Achane at RB6 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a backfield that would anchor most contenders, and Brock Bowers projecting as the TE1 is the kind of positional advantage that quietly separates lineups when the scores get tight. The draft added fuel to that fire without overpaying, landing five values against ADP and zero major reaches, including David Njoku and Terrance Ferguson each falling more than two rounds past their going price. The result is a team sitting at the 62nd percentile tournament-wide, a dramatic climb from a season that felt like treading water the entire way. The rebound is not a hope here, it is baked into the roster construction. rmilli231 built this team to stop apologizing for 2025 and start making noise in the Portal division.

FahlsoTheElder didn't win the draft in one dramatic moment. They won it in the margins, round after round, and the cumulative effect is a roster that sits at the 75th percentile of the field. The foundation is obvious: Josh Allen at QB1 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a ceiling that most managers can't touch, and the Lamar Jackson and Zay Flowers stack adds a bonus layer of correlation that could pay dividends on a big Baltimore day. But the quieter story is the disciplined patience in the later rounds, where Jonathon Brooks fell nearly a round and a half past his ADP, Dalton Schultz slid almost two rounds, and Deebo Samuel came off the board two full rounds late. None of those are lottery tickets. All three represent the kind of incremental edge that adds up. Even the Michael Pittman situation, an offense still searching for an identity in Pittsburgh with Aaron Rodgers at age 43, reads as an educated late-round bet rather than a desperation flier. This is a roster built like a good poker player plays, never chasing, always collecting small edges until the pile is undeniable.

Tecmo Superstars didn't stumble into correlation, they engineered it. The spine of this roster runs through two deliberate stacks: Joe Burrow paired with Ja'Marr Chase, and Dak Prescott paired with George Pickens, and if those pairings catch fire on the same weekend, the ceiling here is genuinely frightening. Burrow checks in as QB4 and Chase as WR2, meaning this isn't a cute dart throw at synergy, it's the best quarterback-receiver duo in the field playing in tandem. Prescott at QB7 and Pickens at WR10 reinforce the same philosophy from the second slot, giving the team two loaded chambers rather than one. The draft execution sharpens the story further. Both Burrow and Prescott came in as good values relative to their ADPs, so the manager secured this architecture without overpaying for it. The path from 35th percentile in scoring a year ago to something much scarier runs directly through those stacks, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, a roster built this intentionally around correlation doesn't need luck, it needs the right Sundays.

Some rosters win the position lottery. The Cake is my RB2 won the whole sweepstakes. Drake Maye at QB2, Bijan Robinson at RB2, and Travis Kelce at TE10 alongside Sam LaPorta at TE8 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 represent the kind of top-end talent concentration that makes the Scott Fish Bowl positionless format feel like it was designed specifically for this manager. When you can field your best players in almost any mix, having Maye, Robinson, Kyren Williams at RB15, and Bucky Irving at RB21 all projecting as starters is not a surplus problem, it is a scoring engine. Irving arriving at RB21 after falling more than two full rounds past his ADP is the kind of quiet steal that pays dividends all season. Maye stacking with A.J. Brown at WR8 adds a ceiling-raising wrinkle on top of an already formidable base. Third in the division and 78th percentile in the field, this team does not need a favorable matchup or a lucky bounce. It just needs to play.

TheFantasyGiant sits second in the Portal Division and in the 81st percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: one steal, four values, thirteen chalk picks, and just one minor reach across the entire board. That is not an accident, that is discipline. The foundation starts at the top, where Justin Jefferson (WR6) anchors the lineup as a genuine difference-maker, and Trey McBride (TE2) was quietly snagged past his ADP, giving the team one of the best projected tight ends in the tournament for less than he cost elsewhere. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) and Kenneth Walker III (RB10) both fell into the lap of a manager patient enough to wait, and Geno Smith landing at QB30 in round 18 is the kind of late-round value that fills out a roster without sacrificing early capital. Last season's 95th-percentile scoring output and 75-percent win rate suggest this is not a team guessing at upside. TheFantasyGiant knew what they were doing in the draft room, and the roster reflects it.

graffito84 finished the draft sitting atop the Portal division and in the 92nd percentile of the field, and the blueprint for how they got there is less about any single thunderbolt pick and more about a quiet, relentless accumulation of edge. Five values against just two reaches tells the story: Jalen Hurts at QB9 slid nearly two rounds past his ADP, Tucker Kraft at TE5 fell a round and a half into their lap, and the net effect of those small advantages compounding across the board is a roster that simply costs less than it delivers. The projected starters are genuinely formidable, anchored by Ashton Jeanty at RB7, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, and Hurts, with the Love-Kraft stack adding a ceiling that straight-line projections tend to undervalue. Even the weakest projected starter, Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31, is a player most managers would be comfortable with. The 2025 finish at the 43rd percentile gives this team something to prove, and the 2026 roster looks built to prove it.
