There is no charitable read on alamb's 2026 draft, and the numbers do not ask you to find one. The most damning detail is not what was acquired but how: four major reaches in a single draft, zero steals, zero values, sixteen chalk picks. Travis Etienne at RB18 was taken more than two full rounds early, Aaron Jones at RB38 nearly three rounds early, and Trey Benson at RB64 almost four rounds early, meaning alamb spent real draft capital accumulating depth at the cost of ever building genuine upside elsewhere. The receiver corps sits at WR24 and WR51 as the projected starters, Terry McLaurin and Khalil Shakir, with Shakir himself one of those four reaches. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give the roster a real foundation, but the rest of the build looks like someone who got nervous and started hoarding. The result is a team sitting sixth percentile in the field, which is where drafts like this tend to land.

Zero QB Mafia sits 11th in the RoboCop: Rogue City division and projects in just the 13th percentile of the field, and the draft did nothing to change that trajectory. Thirteen chalk picks and one major reach across the entire board tells you everything: this manager paid full price for a mediocre roster and got no surplus value in return. The one place the lineup genuinely shines is at tight end, where Brock Bowers, Tyler Warren, Harold Fannin, and Kyle Pitts project as TE1, TE4, TE6, and TE7 respectively, which is a genuinely elite concentration of talent at that position. The cruelty is that all that richness at tight end cannot paper over the wider picture. The receiver group grades out weak, with Xavier Worthy projecting as the WR49 and drawing the unenviable distinction of weakest projected starter. Omarion Hampton offers a real foundation at RB9, but he was taken nearly a full round early, so even that win came at a cost. This roster has a penthouse and a condemned basement, and the overall grade reflects the average.

ExtremeFF bottomed out at 18th percentile in 2026, and the draft board explains almost everything. The team produced zero steals, one value, and three major reaches, which is less a draft strategy than a series of escalating bad decisions. The most damning entry is RJ Harvey, taken nearly three full rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as just RB28, the team's weakest projected starter. Reaching for a player who grades out below 30 players at his position and paying a premium for the privilege is the kind of move that echoes through a roster all season. Braelon Allen, an RB58 taken 3.4 rounds early, compounds the damage. Meanwhile, the one area where ExtremeFF actually has something, Trey McBride projecting as TE2, was built on chalk, not vision. The Tyler Shough and Chris Olave stack adds a floor, but Shough is QB20 and Olave is WR11, so this is a ceiling-chasing bet on a middling quarterback. Last year's 31 percent win rate was not an anomaly. It was a preview.

Even the qbs run! is the cautionary tale of a draft executed with discipline and rewarded with mediocrity anyway. The manager played the value game almost perfectly, logging 15 chalk picks, a pair of values, and zero major reaches across the board, which sounds like a sound strategy until you look at the results. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 form a genuinely elite top end, and the Bo Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack offers a ceiling-raising upside play. But the production falls off a cliff after that. The receiver group projects as a weakness no matter how you arrange it, with Waddle at WR23 as the only starter worth the slot. Oronde Gadsden and Juwan Johnson, the projected tight ends, rank TE16 and TE20, serviceable but never difference-making. The cruelest part is that nothing went wrong on draft day, not really. The market just did not have better players available, and buying at or near fair value from a limited menu produces a limited team. Sitting at 23rd percentile and ninth in the RoboCop: Rogue City division, this roster is the portrait of a puzzle assembled correctly that still turns out to be missing pieces.

FeelingLucky13 finished in the 80th percentile last season, and this year's version is currently projected 25th percentile, which is less a step back than a freefall. The reputation is built on a backfield anchored by Saquon Barkley (RB8) and Kenneth Walker III (RB10), and those names still command attention, but this is a positionless format where what ultimately wins is having elite players at the top of the lineup, and the receiver group is where that logic quietly breaks down. The projected starters at receiver are Mike Evans (WR27), Michael Pittman (WR44), and Jakobi Meyers (WR45), with Pittman specifically flagged as the weakest projected starter. None of those ranks inspire confidence when the field is this competitive. The draft offered no steals and no values, just chalk and a handful of minor reaches, meaning FeelingLucky13 paid above-market prices for players who are

already priced for disappointment. Last year's 26-10 record looks less like a foundation and more like a ceiling that this roster, as constructed, has no obvious way to reach again.

C4TZ3R0 enters 2026 sitting seventh in the RoboCop: Rogue City division and projected at just the 40th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason to argue with those numbers. The receiver group is legitimately elite, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Justin Jefferson (WR6), and Rashee Rice (WR13) all projecting as starters, but that excellence gets swallowed by what surrounds it. The backfield fades quickly after Breece Hall (RB14), and the quarterback situation is shakier than the names suggest. Patrick Mahomes (QB12) is the obvious anchor, but Sam Darnold (QB21) is the insurance policy, and Darnold's fantasy value hinges almost entirely on whether the Seattle passing game expands beyond what it was last season, when the offense leaned so heavily on one target that Darnold's own numbers came out modest despite winning a Super Bowl. A draft that produced zero steals and zero values, just chalk and a pair of minor reaches, means C4TZ3R0 has already played most of its cards. The hand is not unplayable, but it is thin at the margins where these tournaments get decided.

The Nightman Cometh sits at 45th percentile heading into 2026, and that number tells the whole story: good enough to beat the teams below them, probably not good enough to consistently beat the teams above them. The margins decide everything here. Caleb Williams at QB6 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give the roster a legitimate ceiling, and the Dak Prescott/George Pickens stack adds a wrinkle that can spike a week when it connects. But the floor is where things get uncomfortable. Pickens was taken nearly a full round early at WR10, which is fine if he delivers, but it leaves the manager with less room to absorb a down week from projected starters like Emeka Egbuka and Travis Kelce, both of whom rank just well enough to start without inspiring much confidence. Josh Downs, the projected weakest starter at WR46, is the canary in the coal mine: if injuries or variance push him into a meaningful role, the ceiling shrinks fast. Last year's 86th-percentile scoring feels like a distant country from where this roster currently lives.

JMC442 landed at 65th percentile in the field, sitting fifth in the RoboCop: Rogue City division, and the draft sheet looks like someone who kept jumping the gun. Three major reaches, two minor ones, one steal, the whole thing reads like a manager who had a plan and refused to let the board talk them out of it. The thing is, the plan worked. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Drake Maye at QB2 give this roster a legitimate elite foundation, and Chase Brown projected at RB11 means the depth behind Robinson is not just filler. The reaches are harder to defend on paper, J.J. McCarthy going nearly six rounds early and Ray Davis nearly six rounds early too, but if either hits, JMC442 will look like a genius and if neither does, the top of this roster is sturdy enough to survive the experiment. Dallas Goedert at TE15 is a quiet stabilizer, a player who stayed in Philadelphia against expectations and rewarded fantasy managers last season when it mattered most. The conviction was real. Now we find out if the players are too.

Cookin with the Sun God walked into the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft and treated it like a controlled burn, methodical, precise, and deeply satisfying to watch. The foundation is Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and James Cook at RB5, two genuinely elite projected contributors who anchor everything downstream. From there, the roster reads like a clinic in patience rewarded: six values and a steal sprinkled across the draft board, headlined by Jordan Love falling nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP to land at WR17 and Carnell Tate sliding a full round and change to be scooped in the eighth. The draft versus ADP profile, twelve chalk picks, six values, one steal, and only a single minor reach, is the kind of ledger that makes process-minded managers quietly jealous. Sitting at the 79th percentile in the field and coming off a 69 percent win rate in 2025, this team has both the pedigree and the blueprint. The Sun God is not just cooking. The Sun God has already eaten.

ThePaulRuddTouch sits third in the RoboCop: Rogue City division and at the 83rd percentile tournament-wide, and the draft record tells you exactly why: five values, fifteen chalk, zero reaches. That is a disciplined operator at work. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Lamar Jackson at QB3, two players who needed no creativity to identify but did require conviction to pay for correctly, and ThePaulRuddTouch paid. The receiver depth behind Chase is genuinely impressive, with Nico Collins at WR9, Luther Burden at WR22, and Christian Watson at WR28 all projecting as starters in a positionless format that rewards exactly this kind of top-heavy abundance. Dalton Kincaid at TE11 adds a compelling dart throw: if the knee that shadowed his 2024 season finally cooperates, he is a consistent contributor playing alongside Josh Allen, which is a very good situation to be in. There is almost nothing to argue with here, and in a field this competitive, almost nothing is plenty.

Hikadula did not win the draft on one audacious swing. They won it by simply, relentlessly coming out ahead, and the standings reflect it: second in the RoboCop: Rogue City division and sitting at the 94th percentile of the entire field. The engine of this team is a receiver group that reads like a fever dream, anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1, Drake London at WR7, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, all projected starters, all acquired without drama. Nacua is the clearest example of how Hikadula operated: the WR1 slipped to pick 1.05 against an ADP of 1.01, a small gap that compounds into a meaningful edge when a manager collects enough of them. Then, sixteen rounds in, Jalen McMillan fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and landed at 16.08, a steal by any measure. The weakest projected starter is Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, which tells you something important about how much runway this roster has before it starts costing points.

TeSlaa Drives a Ford didn't need a lottery ticket to land in the 95th percentile of the field, they just drafted smarter than the room, round after round. The receiver corps is the clearest evidence: Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), A.J. Brown (WR8), and Malik Nabers (WR12) form a projected starting group that most managers would trade their entire draft for, and Nabers arrived with a discount attached, falling nearly two rounds past his ADP before TeSlaa scooped him at 5.06. That kind of value accumulation is the whole story here. Colston Loveland (TE3) and Chigoziem Okonkwo (TE19) were both taken after the field had moved on, and Okonkwo fell nearly two rounds past his number as well. The two major reaches, Justin Fields (QB38) and Emanuel Wilson (RB69), are real, but in a positionless format those late-round gambles barely dent a roster this well-constructed at the top. Division-leading and sitting comfortably inside the top five percent of the tournament, TeSlaa Drives a Ford earned every bit of it.
