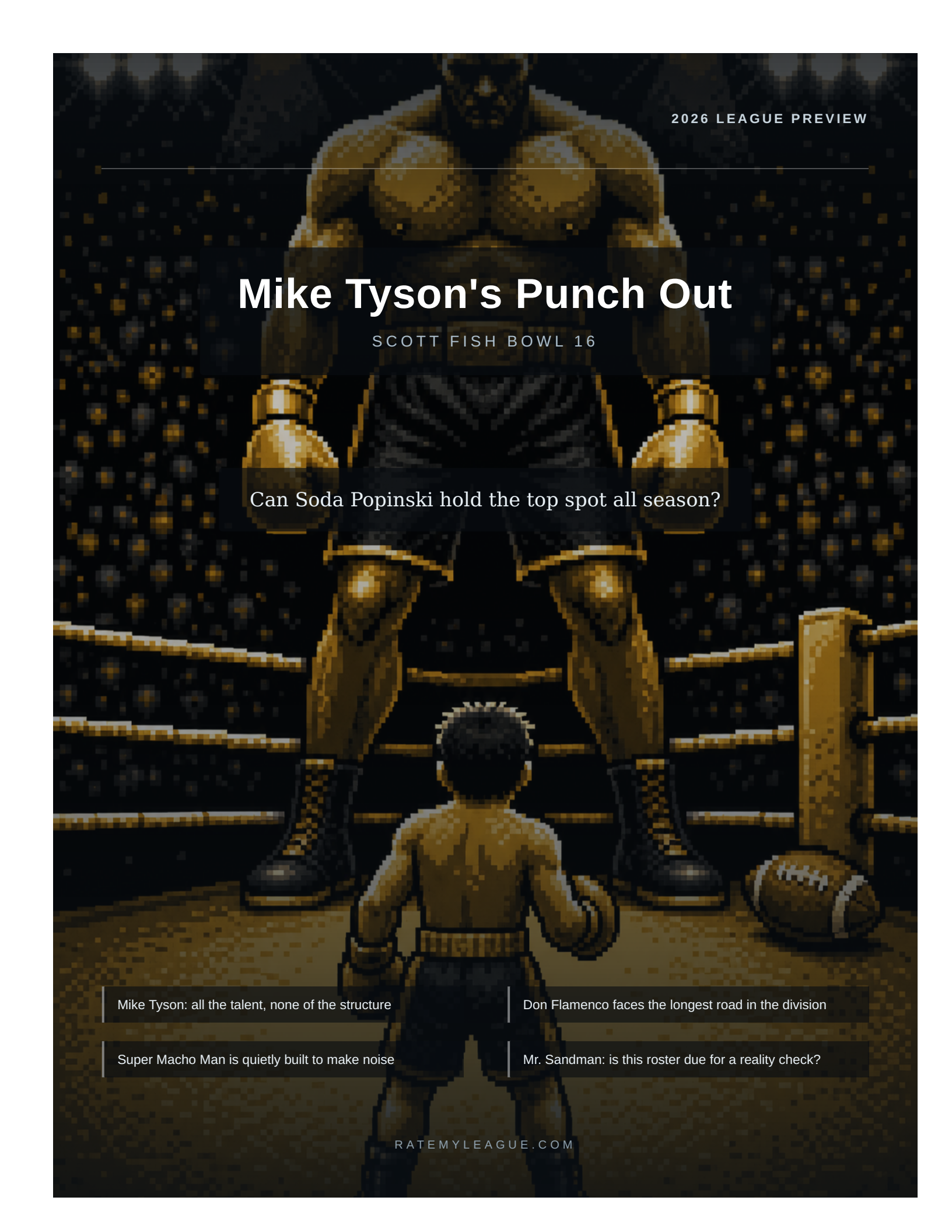

Don Flamenco sits at the 5th percentile of the field heading into 2026, and the roster grade tells you most of what you need to know before you even dig into the specifics. The quarterback room is genuinely strong, Lamar Jackson at QB3 paired with Joe Burrow at QB4 is a luxury most managers would envy, and the Jackson/Mark Andrews stack adds a tidy bonus on top. But strength at the top only papers over so much, and here it cannot paper over enough. The receiver group grades out weak, with Jaylen Waddle projected at WR23 as the best of the bunch and Jordan Addison at WR43 as the next option, which is a thin margin for error in a positionless format where your ceiling depends on how deep quality runs. The draft chart offers no comfort either: zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches, including Tank Dell taken nearly five rounds before consensus. Lamar Jackson cannot carry a roster this thin to relevance, and Don Flamenco enters the season looking less like a contender than a cautionary tale about drafting without a cushion.

Last year, Mr. Sandman went 27-9 and scored in the 94th percentile, the kind of season that earns a reputation. This year's roster is projected 11th in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and that distance between where this team was and where it is projected to be is genuinely painful to sit with. The foundation is real: Trey McBride at TE2 and Caleb Williams at QB6, stacked with Rome Odunze, give the team a legitimate core. But the supporting cast thins out quickly, and the draft offered little relief, producing zero steals and two major reaches, most notably Jaxson Dart taken 2.4 rounds ahead of his ADP at a time when the positional group was already addressed. The receiver group beyond Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Odunze at WR30 drops to Isaac TeSlaa at WR68, and the projected floor leans heavily on a group of backs where Jadarian Price, the weakest projected starter, is already ranked RB26. The 2025 version of this team was something. The 2026 version is mostly a memory of it.

There is not much to say about AsylumFootball-R. Briggs in 2026 that does not eventually circle back to the same uncomfortable truth: this roster is sitting at the 20th percentile of the field and dead last in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, and the draft did not do much to change that trajectory. Fifteen chalk picks and zero steals means Briggs paid market price for everything and got no surplus anywhere, and the one moment the draft showed any real conviction, reaching four full rounds early for Brenton Strange at TE17, it came at a position that is among the weakest on the board. Justin Jefferson at WR6 is a genuine anchor, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 gives the team a second piece worth building around, but after those two the projected starters fall off quickly, with Hunter Henry grading out as the weakest projected starter on the roster at TE18. There is no obvious trade chip, no late-round lottery ticket that hit, and no version of this roster that looks like it is one good week away from turning the corner.

Glass Joe sits ninth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the draft offers little reason to believe a reversal is coming. The receiver corps is genuinely elite, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), Chris Olave (WR11), Malik Nabers (WR12), and Garrett Wilson (WR17) all projected starters, but Nabers is the asterisk beside the asterisk. After tearing his ACL last season and drawing enough offseason concern that his redraft value cratered from a top-10 receiver to WR21 by July, Nabers looked sharp in training camp, yet his availability for Week 1 and his chemistry with Jaxson Dart remain open questions. That uncertainty matters because the rest of the roster can't carry the weight. The quarterback room projects Daniel Jones at QB25 and Fernando Mendoza at QB27, and while both were mild values relative to their ADP, mild value on weak players is still weak players. Glass Joe drafted mostly chalk, reached on Sean Tucker and Nabers, and found no steals. The ceiling is real if Nabers is healthy. The floor has a trapdoor.

Bald Bull enters 2026 sitting at 36th percentile in the field and eighth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, and the roster construction doesn't inspire much confidence that either number is about to improve. The receiver group has names worth respecting, CeeDee Lamb projects as WR5 and Colston Loveland slots in as TE3, but below that top tier the depth trails off fast, with Denzel Boston projecting as the weakest projected starter at WR58. The draft board compounds the concern: six minor reaches and a major reach on Terrance Ferguson, taken nearly two and a half rounds ahead of his ADP at TE28, signal a team that repeatedly paid a premium for players who didn't demand one. Jordan Love arriving as QB17 two and a half rounds after his ADP is a genuine bright spot, and his stack with Jameson Williams gives the offense a ceiling to chase, but one draft steal doesn't unwind a pattern of overpaying elsewhere. There isn't an obvious move left to salvage the range of outcomes here, just a roster grinding toward the projections it earned.

Piston Honda is the team that exists in the margins, and the margins in 2026 will decide everything. The foundation is genuinely compelling: Brock Bowers at TE1 is a weekly hammer, Jayden Daniels projects as a QB5 starter, and Kenneth Walker III and Jeremiyah Love give the backfield real teeth. That core can beat anyone on a given week. But the roster thins out fast once you move past the top names, and the WR group is where this gets precarious, with Jalen Coker projected as the weakest starter at WR55. The draft history compounds the concern, not because the mistakes were catastrophic, but because they were precise in the wrong direction: Parker Washington taken 1.6 rounds early, AJ Barner reached 1.8 rounds before his ADP, and Kimani Vidal pulled three full rounds ahead of the market. Those aren't panic moves, they're a manager who kept outrunning consensus by just enough to pay for it. Sitting 46th percentile and seventh in the division, Piston Honda isn't broken. It just needs everything to go right.

Little Mac did not win the draft with one jaw-dropping pick. They won it by repeatedly coming out on the right side of value, and that consistency is worth more than a single flashy swing. Jonathan Taylor slipped to 2.06 despite projecting as RB4, Nico Collins landed at 3.07 despite projecting as WR9, and David Montgomery fell a round and a half before Little Mac scooped him up at 9.07. None of those are lottery tickets; they are just a manager who knew what players were worth and stayed patient while others blinked first. The projected starting group anchored by Taylor, Breece Hall, Javonte Williams, Josh Allen, and Collins is legitimately difficult to beat on a week-to-week basis, and the depth behind them gives the roster a cushion most teams in this division cannot match. The Juwan Johnson reach at 8.06 is a minor blemish on an otherwise disciplined sheet. Sitting sixth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and at the 57th tournament percentile, this team is quietly better than its standing suggests.

King Hippo didn't build this roster on one splashy move. They built it by being right, repeatedly. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the backfield, and the receiver group is quietly elite, with A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, and Zay Flowers at WR16 forming a projected starting core that most managers in this tournament would trade their entire bench to acquire. The draft itself was almost aggressively disciplined, 17 chalk picks against zero major reaches, which sounds boring until you realize that boring drafts with good players win leagues. Tucker Kraft at TE5 adds another projected starter with genuine upside: he was pacing toward 1,000 yards before a November ACL injury ended his 2025 season early, and with Green Bay losing more receivers than it added this offseason, Kraft steps back into a target environment that made him briefly look like one of the best tight ends in football. A 66th percentile tournament projection and fifth in the division feels light for a team this consistently constructed.

Mr. Dream did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by winning the small battles over and over, and the cumulative effect is a team that projects to sit in the 67th percentile of the field with a legitimate case for more. Start with the backfield, where Bijan Robinson (RB2), James Cook (RB5), and Saquon Barkley (RB8) form a projected-starter group that most managers would mortgage their mid-rounds to assemble. Then consider that Justin Herbert (QB8) arrived at pick 5.06, nearly two full rounds after his ADP suggested he should have been gone, a quiet reprieve that let this roster breathe in the early going. The draft as a whole logged 15 chalk picks and two genuine values against zero major reaches, which is not the draft of someone gambling on upside, it is the draft of someone who knew their prices and refused to overpay. Mr. Dream may not have the most dramatic roster in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, but draft discipline has a way of looking very smart by October.

Super Macho Man didn't build this roster with one flashy swing. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 73rd percentile that feels like it could climb. The foundation is Christian McCaffrey, an RB3 projection landed at pick 2.03 when his ADP said he should have been gone by the end of round one, and the receiver group piled on from there. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Tee Higgins at WR19 give this lineup a ceiling that most managers in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division would envy, and Higgins himself was another quiet value, falling over a round past his ADP. The draft wasn't perfect, Harold Fannin cost a round and a half of equity taken early at TE6, and the quarterback situation is thin with Baker Mayfield and Tyler Shough projecting as QB18 and QB20 respectively. But four genuine values against two major reaches is a ledger most managers would sign off on without hesitation.

Mike Tyson's namesake team entered the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting at 82nd percentile and second in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, and the draft sheet looks like it should not work. Two major reaches, two minor reaches, and not a single steal on the board. Then you look at the roster and wonder what you were worried about. The major reaches tell the story: Pat Freiermuth at TE30 taken nearly three rounds early, Darnell Washington at TE38 taken almost four rounds early. Those picks drew raised eyebrows in the moment, and they should have. But the top of this roster is genuinely hard to argue with. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, Rashee Rice at WR13, all projected starters, all legitimate. The Patrick Mahomes and Rice stack adds a ceiling most managers would trade a clean draft board to own. Wan'Dale Robinson gives pause, a WR47 who reunited with Brian Daboll in Tennessee now competing for targets with Carnell Tate, but Robinson is depth, not a pillar. The reaches did not hurt this team. The conviction behind them might actually be the reason.

Soda Popinski did not swing for the fences and miss, did not gamble on a single transformative pick, and still landed in the 97th percentile of the field. That is what quiet excellence looks like. The foundation is genuinely elite: De'Von Achane (RB6) and Ashton Jeanty (RB7) give this roster a backfield pairing that most managers would sell a kidney to field one of, and Puka Nacua (WR1) sits at the top of his position entirely. Then the draft started finding value in the middle rounds, picking up Dak Prescott (QB7) a full 1.7 rounds past his ADP and Jalen Hurts (QB9) another round behind that. The Jaylen Wright (RB68) reach at 17.03 is the one wrinkle worth noting, six-plus rounds ahead of consensus, but in a format where Achane and Jeanty are already doing the heavy lifting, that gamble barely registers. Coming off a 65th-percentile scoring season in 2025, Soda Popinski has rebuilt the engine rather than patched it, and the division lead they hold heading into 2026 looks entirely earned.
