The 343 Guilty Sparks sit 12th in the Halo: Combat Evolved division and in the 5th percentile of the entire field, and nothing about their draft suggests that ranking is about to improve. The two most aggressive moves of their offseason, taking A.J. Brown at 1.10 and Nico Collins at 2.03 against ADPs of 2.10 and 2.11 respectively, were not bold gambles so much as a manager paying a premium for the comfort of known quantities. Brown (WR8) and Collins (WR9) are genuinely good, but overpaying for your floor is not a strategy, it's a personality trait. Tucker Kraft (TE5) is the other piece worth watching, as a pre-injury trajectory that had him pacing toward 1,000 yards gives him real upside if his ACL cooperates, but a brief preseason PUP stint is not exactly a clean bill of health. Fifteen chalk picks out of nineteen total means this roster is essentially what it looks like on paper, and on paper it is projecting well below the median. There is no hidden lever here, no sleeper quietly waiting to flip the standings.

Novachr0n0 enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Halo: Combat Evolved division and down in the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The backfield is legitimately impressive, with James Cook (RB5), Josh Jacobs (RB16), and TreVeyon Henderson (RB19) projecting as starters alongside Trey McBride (TE2) and Harold Fannin (TE6) giving this team genuine upside at tight end. The problem is that the rest of the roster has to carry weight it cannot support. The receiver group tops out at Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), and the quarterback situation, headlined by Sam Darnold (QB21), reads like a waiting room nobody wants to be in. What makes the outlook bleaker is that the draft offered little runway to correct course, producing zero steals, two minor reaches, and a major reach on Jacobs taken 2.4 rounds before his ADP. The good pieces are real, but this roster feels like a car with a strong engine and four flat tires, pointed uphill with no spare in the trunk.

There is something uniquely brutal about drafting almost entirely at or after ADP and still landing at 10th in the division and the 21st percentile of the field. schrupp22 did nearly everything right on paper: zero major reaches across the whole board, fourteen picks at chalk value, and two genuine finds in C.J. Stroud and Marvin Harrison Jr., both of whom slid a full round or more past their expected range. And yet here we are. Brock Bowers at TE1 anchors the lineup, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 gives this team a credible top end, but the depth underneath those names thins out quickly, and a 2025 season that produced a 25 percent win rate suggests schrupp22 is not a manager who tends to get the most out of a roster when things get close. Following the rules and still finishing near the bottom of the class is the kind of outcome that makes a person question whether the rules were worth following in the first place.

zilladog's 2026 campaign looks like a team that drew a good hand at the top and then slowly ran out of cards. Josh Allen is a genuine QB1 anchor, and the projected starting group around him, including George Pickens at WR10 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10, gives the roster a respectable surface shine. But that shine fades fast. The draft generated zero steals, and the one move that stings most is Rashod Bateman, reached a staggering 3.6 rounds ahead of his ADP only to project out as a WR92. That is not a reclamation project, that is a capital allocation disaster. Sitting ninth in the Halo: Combat Evolved division and in the 29th tournament percentile, zilladog is essentially the team that spent its discretionary budget on a luxury car and then couldn't afford gas. The 2025 record of 36 percent wins and a 23rd-percentile scoring finish wasn't a fluke, and nothing about this roster construction suggests the trajectory has meaningfully changed.

Commander Cole did something quietly impressive in this draft: thirteen chalk picks, three values, and zero major reaches, a disciplined card-counter who never chased and never panicked. Joe Burrow landing at 2.11 when his ADP sat at 2.05 is a rounding error, sure, but Xavier Worthy sliding a full 1.7 rounds to 12.11 is real money, and Jadarian Price at RB26 dropping into the tenth round is exactly the kind of late-round upside you build a championship floor on. And yet the team lands at 40th percentile and eighth in the Halo: Combat Evolved division, which is the specific cruelty of positional value in a positionless format: being right about price does not guarantee being right about output. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is a genuine anchor, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 gives the roster a second projectable star, but after those two the drop-off in projected production is steep enough that drafting well against ADP only illuminated the ceiling, not raised it.

The Pillar of Amon-Ra is a team that earns your respect without quite demanding your fear, sitting at the 47th percentile and seventh in the Halo: Combat Evolved division with a roster built around a genuinely elite top end and some uncomfortable questions underneath it. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 form the kind of starting core that wins weeks outright, and a 61 percent win rate last season confirms this manager knows how to deploy talent. The cracks show at the margins, though. Demond Claiborne landed five rounds ahead of his ADP at RB63, a reach that would look fine if he contributes and quietly brutal if he doesn't, and Wan'Dale Robinson projects as the weakest starter at WR47, a player who will cost this team points against anyone who drafted deeper. Jordan Love and Tyler Shough at QB17 and QB20 represent another quiet drag on ceiling. This roster does not lose series, it loses close weeks, and in the Scott Fish Bowl those are the only ones that matter.

Installation 00 exists in the most honest place a fantasy team can occupy: the margin, where winning and losing are separated by a Jayden Reed target share and a favorable schedule week. The floor here is real. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this roster genuine upside at the top, and the Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack adds the kind of correlated ceiling that turns a mediocre scoring week into a great one. Drake Maye at QB2 is quietly the steadiest thing on the board. But the draft tells a careful, slightly anxious story: thirteen chalk picks, four minor reaches, and one genuinely puzzling commitment to Michael Pittman at WR44, taken 2.4 rounds before the market agreed. Pittman projects as a starter, which means he occupies a spot that a healthier value could have claimed. In a field this competitive, that kind of inefficiency does not cost you a season outright, it just makes every week a little harder than it needed to be, and for a team sitting at 51st percentile, harder is exactly the wrong direction.

After finishing 2025 in the third percentile in scoring, Iceman needed a gut renovation, and this draft looks like exactly that. The engine is a projected starting corps headlined by De'Von Achane (RB6), Colston Loveland (TE3), and Caleb Williams (QB6), with Williams and Loveland running as a stack that gives this team a genuine upside ceiling on big weeks. The receiver depth behind that is quietly impressive: DeVonta Smith (WR14), Jameson Williams (WR21), and Terry McLaurin (WR24) are all projected starters, and Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) and Chris Godwin (WR38) push the quality even further down the board. Godwin came as honest value, slipping more than a full round past his ADP. The concern is J.K. Dobbins (RB36), the weakest projected starter on the roster and a reach at nearly three rounds early, but one soft spot does not undo a roster this deep at the top. A 59th-percentile projection is a long way from the basement, and after last year, that distance is the whole point.

Flood season didn't build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it by repeatedly coming out ahead on value, and the results compound. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 slipped half a round past his ADP, Dak Prescott at QB7 fell a full round, and Ja'Marr Chase, a WR2, was still sitting there at pick 1.06 when the field had him projected to go four spots earlier. None of those are lottery tickets, they're just a manager who did their homework and cashed in three times. The projected starters reflect it: Taylor and Barkley in the backfield, Chase leading the receivers, all of them carrying asterisks for a reason. Rico Dowdle adds depth worth watching, a player who logged back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons before landing in Pittsburgh, where his role is still being sorted out. At 65th percentile and fourth in the Halo: Combat Evolved division, this team isn't positioned to run the table, but they're positioned to compete in almost any week, and that's exactly how 78-percent win rates get built.

FunkyBunches didn't need a miracle pick to build one of the better rosters in the Halo: Combat Evolved division, just a draft that kept winning small. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the whole operation, but the real fingerprints of this draft are in the receiver group, where Rashee Rice fell 1.2 rounds past his ADP and Chris Olave slipped nearly a full round, leaving FunkyBunches with a WR11 and a WR13 among their projected starters at discount prices. Then there's Baker Mayfield, a QB18 projection snagged three full rounds after where the field valued him, which in a positionless format translates directly into roster equity spent elsewhere. The draft wasn't spotless, Theo Johnson went nearly four rounds ahead of schedule and RJ Harvey cost a round and a half of premium to secure, but those are the kinds of corrections a deep roster can absorb. Sitting third in the division and in the 82nd percentile of the field, FunkyBunches looks less like a team that got lucky and more like a team that simply drafted better than most.

BobbyJackson sits second in the Halo: Combat Evolved division and in the 88th percentile of the field, and the draft log explains exactly why. This was not a team built on one lightning-bolt pick. It was built on a series of moments where the board came to BobbyJackson instead of the other way around. Christian McCaffrey, projected RB3, slid to the 2.01, a quiet windfall that set the tone. Tee Higgins fell a full round and a fifth past his ADP, landing as a projected WR19 starter at a discount. Jared Goff arrived nearly two rounds late as a projected QB16, turning a position most managers stress over into a budget line item. Three values across the draft, zero major reaches, and a floor defined by Tony Pollard at RB30 as the projected weakest starter. That last number is the real statement. When your starting floor is a projected RB30, the draft did not just go fine, it went consistently, methodically right.

Admirable Pop N' Fresh didn't win the draft with one audacious swing, they won it with compounding interest. The foundation is genuinely elite: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Lamar Jackson as QB3, and Ladd McConkey and Jaylen Waddle round out a starting group that most managers would envy before they even scroll to the bench. What makes this roster worth admiring, though, is how the manager found that group. Jackson slid half a round past his ADP, Quentin Johnston fell more than a round to become a projected WR41 starter, and Trevor Lawrence, a projected QB10, tumbled a full two-and-a-half rounds past his expected price before Admirable Pop N' Fresh quietly scooped him up in the seventh. Three values and a major steal, all woven into a draft that reads like chalk because the targets kept falling right on schedule. The 2025 campaign finished at the 61st percentile in scoring, and this roster is constructed to blow past that ceiling. Division rank one and 95th percentile in the field didn't happen by accident.
