jsrfvalentine finished in the 95th percentile last year, and the fantasy world has noticed, which makes it all the more awkward that the 2026 projection has this team sitting at 6th percentile in the tournament and 12th in the Oregon Trail division. The roster is not without its anchors: Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and De'Von Achane (RB6) form a backfield that would make most managers blush, and the TE group with Dallas Goedert (TE15), Oronde Gadsden (TE16), and Hunter Henry (TE18) is genuinely deep. But the receiver corps thins out fast after Davante Adams (WR25) and DK Metcalf (WR36), and the draft board shows three major reaches, including Matthew Stafford taken more than two rounds before his ADP and Troy Franklin grabbed nearly three rounds early, suggesting jsrfvalentine was hunting upside in places the market had not yet priced. Last year's 28-8 record was real. This year's construction looks like a manager chasing the memory of a roster that no longer exists, and the projections are not being polite about the distance between those two things.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes from being the smartest person in the room one year and then watching your successors shrug at what you built. ToewsFF finished 2025 in the 99th percentile, and the 2026 projection has them sitting 11th in the Oregon Trail division and in just the 7th percentile of the field. The gap is not subtle. The draft did not help close it: five major reaches across the board, including Patrick Mahomes at QB12 taken nearly two full rounds early and J.J. McCarthy at QB37 grabbed almost five rounds before the market said he was worth selecting. Christian McCaffrey projects as the team's clearest star at RB3, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 is a real asset, but the volume of draft capital spent chasing players ahead of consensus suggests a manager who was reaching for last year's ceiling rather than building toward a new one. Brian Thomas Jr. sits at WR31 after a

2025 that featured injuries and a quietly troubling disconnect with Trevor Lawrence. That is the kind of player you need to rediscover himself. Right now, ToewsFF needs several of those stories to break right at once.

There is a version of this roster that feels salvageable, and then you look closer and realize that version does not exist. dlaron14 sits 10th in the Oregon Trail division and in just the 15th percentile of the field, and the draft did not provide much of a ladder out. The receiver group has genuine star power, with Ja'Marr Chase, Drake London, and Nico Collins all projected as starters, but the rest of the scoring pool is thin in ways the receiver depth cannot paper over. The backfield tops out at Brian Robinson at RB45 and Isiah Pacheco at RB52, neither of whom projects to move the needle. More damaging is what the draft sheet reveals about process: the two major reaches were Josh Downs at WR46 and Jayden Reed at WR48, both taken roughly four rounds ahead of their ADPs, capital spent on depth contributors when the team desperately needed foundational upgrades elsewhere. dlaron14 finished 74th percentile in scoring in 2025, so the ceiling exists somewhere, but this roster as constructed looks like a long, quiet ride west with a bad wheel.

Nozzzbush did almost everything right at the draft table, and the roster still lands at 28th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you want to apologize to someone. The value column tells the story: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 fell to pick 2.03, Jared Goff at QB16 slid nearly two full rounds, and both represent genuine wins on process. The problem is that process and product diverged badly here. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Lamb forming a top-shelf foundation, and the Goff stack on top of that is a sensible structural choice. But outside that receiver core, the roster thins into a collection of adequate, and the projected weakest starter is Chuba Hubbard at RB29, a man taken slightly early for the privilege of being the floor. Thirteen chalk picks, four values, zero steals, and a 2025 campaign that finished 29th percentile in scoring, this is a team that followed the right process into the wrong building and is now standing there wondering what happened.

BaseballGuru28 sits eighth in the Oregon Trail Division and projects at just the 29th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much cause for optimism. Twelve chalk picks and one major reach define a strategy that mostly paid full price and occasionally overpaid, most notably on Emanuel Wilson, taken a stunning 7.2 rounds ahead of his ADP. The receiver group is the clearest soft spot, with Christian Watson as the top projected option at WR28 and Quentin Johnston behind him at WR41, neither of whom inspires confidence as a cornerstone. The backfield looks better on paper, but paper has a way of lying: David Montgomery signed with Houston this offseason hoping to reclaim a feature role, only to find himself in another competition, this time with Woody Marks for top billing. If Montgomery loses that battle the way he lost the one in Detroit, his RB23 projection starts to look charitable. Josh Allen is a genuine anchor, but one elite QB can only carry so much weight, and right now BaseballGuru28 is asking him to carry quite a lot.

RabbitDad is the team that shows up to the Oregon Trail at 48th percentile, perfectly packed wagon, enough oxen to make it to Fort Kearney, and then promptly fords a river it probably should have caulked. The core is genuinely good: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in this division cannot match, and the Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds correlated upside on top of that. But the margins are where this season gets decided, and the margins are complicated. Daniels and McLaurin cost late capital precisely because Trevor Lawrence fell two-plus rounds past his ADP to land at 7.01, a genuine steal that freed up resources elsewhere. The problem is that those resources went toward J.K. Dobbins at RB36, taken nearly four rounds early, and Aaron Jones, taken four rounds early at RB38. Both are projected starters propping up a lineup that needs every slot to produce. This is not a bad team. It is a team that will finish exactly as well as its shakiest decisions allow.

tjgoss23 sits at the 52nd percentile and ranks sixth in the Oregon Trail division, which is basically the definition of a team that wins the matchups it should and loses the ones it shouldn't. The ceiling here is real: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Chris Olave at WR11 give this roster genuine top-end firepower, and the Joe Burrow and Tee Higgins stack adds a layer of upside that can swing a week entirely on its own. But the floor is where things get complicated. Burrow is a QB4 talent playing inside a fragile body, a manager who watched him go down in Week 2 last year and not return until Week 13 knows exactly what that anxiety feels like. Malik Willis sitting at QB24 is the contingency plan, and it isn't a comforting one. Wan'Dale Robinson, reached more than two rounds early at WR47, also needs to earn that investment. The margins decide this season, and right now those margins are thin enough that Burrow's health is less a subplot than the whole story.

darrinschully didn't swing for the fences and miss. They just kept making the right call, round after round, and the draft sheet shows it. The foundation is impossible to argue with: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster a backfield core that wins weeks outright, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 only deepens what the lineup can put on the field. But the real story is what happened in the middle and late rounds. Jalen Hurts fell nearly a full round past his ADP, Jordan Love fell almost two, and Jake Ferguson slid more than two rounds before darrinschully scooped him at TE12. That's not luck, that's a manager who knew what things were worth and waited. The draft logged four values and one outright steal against only one major reach, a profile that tends to translate into the kind of steady scoring darrinschully already showed in 2025, when they finished in the 68th percentile. Fifth in the Oregon Trail division is where they land now. That's a projection worth challenging.

wigglebang isn't the flashiest name in the Oregon Trail division, but at 71st percentile this roster earns its seat at the table through something harder to replicate than a single lucky swing: consistent, compounding draft discipline. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this team two projected starters who can win a week outright, and Harold Fannin at TE6 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 represent the kind of positional edge that quietly separates winning rosters from also-rans. What makes the construction hum, though, is the quarterback situation. Bo Nix was projected QB15 and fell nearly two rounds to wigglebang's lap, and Kyler Murray slid an even more absurd 3.6 rounds to become the biggest steal on the board. Murray isn't just a discount play, he's stacked with Jefferson, which means Denver drives and Arizona drives can compound into the same lineup in the same week. This team didn't lunge for a unicorn. It just kept beating the market, pick after pick, until the margins added up to something real.

skipnewton31 didn't need a headline move to land at the 82nd percentile. The draft just kept quietly winning. Caleb Williams slid two full rounds past his ADP and landed at pick 5.07 despite projecting as QB6, a gift that gets better when you notice he's stacked with Colston Loveland, who projects as TE3 and figures to benefit every time Williams spreads a defense thin. Then at pick 10.06, Parker Washington fell two rounds past his ADP to land as a projected WR35 starter, the kind of late-round find that turns a good team into a deep one. The foundation underneath those steals holds up too: Brock Bowers projects as TE1, Derrick Henry and Bucky Irving both project as top-25 running backs, and Marvin Harrison Jr. sits at WR33. skipnewton31 didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't reach wildly up the board, and didn't get lucky once. The draft just came out ahead at nearly every turn, and third in the Oregon Trail division looks more like a floor than a ceiling.

ScottLarson lands at 94th percentile in the field and second in the Oregon Trail division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This was not a roster built on one home-run swing that happened to connect. It was built pick by pick, with five values spread across the board and only two minor reaches on a 19-round card. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slipping half a round past his ADP is a fine illustration: not a robbery, just a manager who knew what things cost and kept getting slightly better prices than he paid. The same logic applies to Josh Jacobs falling 1.3 rounds past his ADP, landing a RB16 projection in round seven. Then the receiving corps arrives, and the conversation gets louder. A.J. Brown at WR8, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 all projecting as starters gives ScottLarson a ceiling that most rosters in this field simply cannot match. The floor holds up too, with Trey McBride projecting as TE2. Coming off a 92nd-percentile scoring season in 2025, this team has receipts to go with the optimism.

Sitting at the top of the Oregon Trail division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, jackwl97 did not stumble into this position. This draft was constructed with precision. Puka Nacua lands as WR1 in the projections and was drafted at 1.06 when his ADP sat at 1.01, a whisker of value on the most important pick of the board. Then the patience paid bigger dividends: Brock Purdy, projected QB13, fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP to 8.07, and the manager was there to collect. Pair Purdy with George Kittle and you have a stack that turns a value grab into a structural weapon. George Pickens at WR10, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and Jameson Williams at WR21 give the lineup a starting corps that would be the envy of most rosters in this field. The one blemish, Calvin Ridley taken 3.2 rounds ahead of schedule, is a footnote on an otherwise meticulous sheet. jackwl97 drafted like someone who had already done their homework twice.
