There is no spin available for BlackNindo, a team sitting at the bottom of the Rayman division and in the 5th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly how it got there. Five major reaches across the board tell the story: C.J. Stroud, a QB22, was drafted four full rounds ahead of his ADP; Bucky Irving, an RB21, went nearly three rounds early; Xavier Worthy, a WR49, cost a round-8 pick to acquire a player who projects as the weakest starter on the roster. Each of those reaches is its own small catastrophe, and together they compound into a draft that reads like someone was in a hurry to lose. Trey McBride at TE2 and Nico Collins at WR9 give BlackNindo a couple of genuinely good players, but good players surrounded by overpriced middlemen do not win leagues, they just make the losses more confusing to explain. This roster did not fall into bad luck. It drafted its way here, one early trigger-pull at a time.

Yardzilla23 sits 11th in the Rayman division and in just the 9th percentile of the field, and there is not much in the draft chart to suggest a turnaround is coming. The team leaned heavily on chalk, logged three major reaches, and found only one genuine steal, which is a profile that tends to describe a manager who paid full price for mediocrity and got it. The quarterback situation is the loudest alarm: Tyler Shough grades out at QB20 and was already reached for by more than two rounds, while Malik Willis sits at QB24 and is the projected starter most likely to cost this team a week outright. Ja'Marr Chase is a legitimate WR2 and anchors the group, but even he came with an asterisk, snagged a tick later than his ADP suggested he should have gone. Harold Fannin offers some intrigue at TE6, though his upside is tethered to a Browns offense built around Deshaun Watson, which is less a safety net and more a suggestion. When your best-case scenario requires a lot of things to go right for Cleveland, you are mostly just waiting for the season to end.

Team Rocket arrives in the Rayman division sitting 10th and in just the 15th percentile of the field, and the draft didn't generate the kind of surplus value that typically rescues a middling roster. There are genuine pieces here, Brock Bowers at TE1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 form a legitimate top-end foundation, but the supporting cast grades out thin fast. Jeremiyah Love projects as RB13 and Tetairoa McMillan as WR15, which sounds encouraging until you notice both were minor reaches, and the team's lone genuine steal was Javonte Williams at RB17, taken more than two rounds after his ADP. Meanwhile, Kyler Murray cost a fifth-round pick to land a QB19, a reach of 3.2 rounds that represents real draft capital burned for a quarterback who barely cracks the top 20 at his position. That's the bind Team Rocket is in: the top of the roster is real, but the draft didn't stockpile enough upside underneath it, and there's no obvious move left to change the math.

tallguytimm lands in the Rayman Division at 9th, sitting at the 43rd percentile of the field, and the roster tells you why. The backfield is genuinely impressive, with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Chase Brown at RB11 all projecting as starters, but that group is basically doing all the heavy lifting for a team that grades out weak everywhere else. The receiver corps tops out at Emeka Egbuka at WR18, then falls off quickly toward Adonai Mitchell at WR67 and Tyreek Hill at WR77, the latter a four-and-a-half round reach that already looks like a problem. The quarterback situation is no better, with Jaxson Dart projecting as the starter at QB11 and little behind him worth mentioning. Fourteen chalk picks in the draft left almost no margin for inspired roster building, and the two major reaches burned capital that could have addressed the very weaknesses now dragging this team toward the bottom of the standings. The bones are here for a functional lineup, but functional does not win this tournament.

Last year's 72nd-percentile finish feels like a mirage now. Sitting eighth in the Rayman Division and hovering around the 45th percentile of the field, jmb101 enters 2026 with a roster that looks better on paper than it projects in practice. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with George Pickens, Ladd McConkey, and Jameson Williams all projecting as starters and representing real depth, but this format rewards overall quality across the whole lineup, and the QB situation quietly drags everything down. Jordan Love checks in at QB17 and was already a reach at his draft cost, taken nearly two rounds ahead of his ADP, and the fallback options behind him, Cam Ward at QB23 and Jacoby Brissett at QB28, offer little comfort. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give the roster two pillars worth building around, but when your weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, you're essentially hoping everything breaks right. In a field this competitive, hope is not a strategy.

NorwegianNightmare sits at the 51st percentile and seventh in the Rayman division, which is about as middle-of-the-road as fantasy rosters get, and the margins really do decide everything here. The case for optimism starts with Drake Maye (QB2) anchoring the passing game and a tight end group that could quietly be the team's sharpest edge, with Tucker Kraft (TE5), Kyle Pitts (TE7), and Travis Kelce (TE10) all projected as starters. Kelce looked done to some, but he's back and chasing a return to the TE12 conversation, which means this manager is betting on three viable starters at the position rather than one creaky veteran. The case for concern is the draft capital spent to get there: pulling Brock Purdy (QB13) nearly two rounds early in round three is a price that still stings when you trace what could have been grabbed instead. Luther Burden (WR22) and Mike Evans (WR27) were legitimate values, each falling over a round past their ADP, but DK Metcalf (WR36) projects as the weakest starter, and thin margins punish weak links without mercy.

btuk finished 24-12 last season and enters 2026 looking like a team that knows exactly what it is doing, even when the draft board suggests otherwise. The headliners are legitimate: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this roster a top-end that most managers would envy, and Caleb Williams at QB6 adds a starter who can genuinely move the needle in a positionless format. But the reach column is where this draft gets interesting. btuk pulled Jalen Tolbert 6.3 rounds early and Michael Mayer 4.3 rounds early, the kind of numbers that make draft analysts wince. And yet the overall roster landed at the 56th tournament percentile, which is not the outcome you expect when three picks qualify as major reaches. The most charitable read is that btuk had a plan and stuck to it. The least charitable read is that it could have been even better. Either way, a team built around St. Brown, Jefferson, and Williams does not need to apologize for much, reaches included.

dddDanger landed in the 61st percentile of the field, which feels about right until you look at how they got there and start to wonder if the number should be higher. The defining move is Tyler Warren, a TE4 taken as a minor reach at pick 2.12, and Sam LaPorta, a TE8 grabbed another round and a half ahead of schedule. Both are projected starters, and together they give this team a genuine positional edge at the tight end spot that most managers in the Rayman division simply cannot match. Add Puka Nacua, the WR1 overall at his position, and a Matthew Stafford stack that ties the whole thing together, and the top of this roster is legitimately good. The counter-argument lives in the draft log: four minor reaches, one major reach in Elijah Sarratt at WR98, and exactly zero steals. Every good piece came at a premium. The question dddDanger has to answer over the course of the season is whether paying up for Warren and LaPorta was vision or just an expensive way to get lucky.

HippieChick66 lands at 71st percentile in the field and fourth in the Rayman Division, which looks modest until you read the roster and realize the draft board was apparently just a loose suggestion. Four major reaches, two minor ones, and yet here we are: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, De'Von Achane at RB6, Drake London at WR7, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 all projecting as starters. That is not luck, that is a manager who knew what she wanted and went and got it before the room caught up. Achane is the cleanest example: taken at 3.07 against a 2.07 ADP, a full round late to the rest of the field, HippieChick66 simply waited and scooped a top-six back. The reaches are real, Carson Beck drafted six rounds ahead of consensus being the loudest one, but the starters they produced have enough collective upside to make the argument that conviction and luck are sometimes the same thing wearing different jerseys.

sevLANG didn't need a splashy moment to build something worth watching in 2026. The foundation is Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Justin Herbert at QB8, two projections that would anchor any contender in the Scott Fish Bowl. What makes this roster interesting, though, is how consistently the draft compounded those early investments. Terry McLaurin, a projected WR24 starter, slid a full 1.3 rounds past his ADP before sevLANG picked him up. TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 came nearly two rounds late. Derrick Henry at RB12 fell almost a full round. None of those were dramatic lottery tickets, just a manager who kept finding the market slightly wrong and taking advantage each time. The Jalen Hurts reach at 2.10 is a fair critique, a QB9 taken more than a round early, but the roster absorbed it without flinching because the value kept arriving elsewhere. The result is a team sitting third in the Rayman division and in the 76th percentile of the field, built less on one inspired swing than on a draft that quietly won more exchanges than it lost.

The Mud Dawgs don't have a single jaw-dropping story to sell you, and they don't need one. This is a roster built on the quiet discipline of consistently coming out ahead at the table. Jonathan Taylor lands at RB4 despite slipping nearly a full round past his ADP, and Malik Nabers and Jaylen Waddle arrived at WR12 and WR23 respectively after similar delays on draft day, each one a small win that compounds into something meaningful over a full season. The positionless format rewards exactly this kind of depth, and the Mud Dawgs have projected starters stacked from top to bottom, anchored by Josh Allen at QB1 and complemented by a Bills stack with Dalton Kincaid at TE11. If there is a speed bump, it is the MarShawn Lloyd selection, taken nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP, but one reach in a draft this clean is more a footnote than an indictment. Second in the Rayman division and sitting in the top 10 percent of the field, the Mud Dawgs are the product of a manager who just kept making the right call.

BoardManGetsPaid sits first in the Rayman Division and at the 93rd percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: one steal, four values, and only two minor reaches across the whole roster. The headliner is James Cook, a RB5 projection who fell a full round and a half to pick 3.11, which is the kind of inefficiency that separates good drafters from great ones. What makes it more impressive is that Cook did not arrive alone. Saquon Barkley and Breece Hall each slid a full round past their ADPs, and Rashee Rice fell nearly two rounds before landing here at WR13. That is not luck running on a loop, that is a manager who identified market inefficiencies and had the patience to let value come to him. The one real quibble, Joe Burrow taken a half-round early, barely registers against that backdrop. When your weakest projected starter is Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31, you have built something worth respecting.
