Little YAC sits dead last in the Soda Popinski division and in the 1st percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: six major reaches, six minor reaches, one steal. The most damning evidence is where the reaches clustered. Bucky Irving, a perfectly fine RB21, was grabbed 3.2 rounds before the market came calling. Jaylen Warren was taken 2.2 rounds early. James Conner was yanked off the board four full rounds ahead of his ADP. The manager clearly fell in love with a positional type and kept overpaying for it, which left the receiver group gasping. The lone steal of the night was Michael Pittman, a WR44 now tasked with catching passes from a 43-year-old Aaron Rodgers in Pittsburgh on an offense still searching for an identity, which is less a lifeline than a metaphor for this entire roster. You can survive a reach or two in a long draft. You cannot survive a philosophy built almost entirely around them, and Little YAC did not.

The ShrimpShack Shooters are sitting at 6th percentile in the field and 11th in the Soda Popinski division, and the roster tells you exactly why. The top-end talent that separates contenders from also-rans just isn't here. Ty Simpson grades out at QB36, which in a positionless format where you can simply not start him is less of a death sentence than it sounds, but it does mean the Shooters are leaning almost entirely on their skill players to carry the load. Justin Jefferson and Malik Nabers are real weapons at WR6 and WR12 respectively, but Nabers is his own asterisk right now, coming off an ACL that his new head coach described as "not simple" and showing up in a celebrity softball video with a limp that had dynasty managers wincing. He looked like himself in camp, which is encouraging, but "looks good in camp" has buried teams before. Tyler Warren at TE4 is a genuine advantage, and the manager clearly believed in him, drafting him a full round ahead of ADP. But one strong position and two

receivers with question marks attached does not build a winner, and with no obvious upgrades available, the Shooters look like a team hoping for circumstances to change rather than a roster built to force them.

Last year PurpleRubes finished in the 99th percentile, rattling off 29 wins and 5,307 points in a season that looked like genius. This year the projection is 14th percentile, which is not a dip so much as a crater. The roster construction tells the story: Josh Allen anchors everything at QB1, and the backfield depth is genuinely impressive with Omarion Hampton, Chase Brown, Kyren Williams, and Javonte Williams all projecting as starters, but the wide receiver group is where last year's version of this team quietly doesn't exist anymore. Jordyn Tyson at WR34 is the top option at the position, and the cupboard thins out fast after that. The draft did not help matters, with five minor reaches and two major ones, including Elijah Sarratt taken nearly three and a half rounds before his ADP and slotting in at WR98, a number that does not inspire much. PurpleRubes won't be judged on what they did in 2025. They'll be judged on whether this roster can remember how that felt.

Professor Chaos sits ninth in the Soda Popinski division and in just the 26th percentile of the field, and the draft did almost nothing to change that trajectory. Of 20 picks logged, not a single one qualifies as a steal, and the two major reaches, Michael Penix Jr. at QB33 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10, burned capital on a backup quarterback and a running back whose price exceeded his projected value. The saving grace is the top of the roster: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, and Jalen Hurts at QB9 gives the lineup a real engine. But after Gibbs and Hurts, the drop-off is steep and the depth chart reads like a list of footnotes. Mark Andrews at TE14 was the one genuine bargain, falling nearly two rounds past his ADP, yet a single good-value pick cannot paper over a roster that grades out near the bottom. The 2025 campaign produced a 31 percent win rate, and nothing about how this team was built suggests 2026 will feel any different.

Hairydeal arrives in the Soda Popinski division sitting eighth in the standings and hovering around the 28th percentile of the field, and the draft chart does little to inspire confidence in a turnaround. The most telling problem is not any single player but the pattern of how this roster was built: three major reaches, four minor reaches, and just one steal across the entire draft. That steal, Makai Lemon at WR40, is projected to be the weakest starter on the roster, which means the one moment Hairydeal got real value from the board is also the floor of their lineup. Justin Herbert, a QB8, was drafted nearly a full round ahead of his ADP in round two, an aggressive commitment to a player who grades out as a back-end starter at his position. Caleb Williams and Brock Bowers give this team a genuine ceiling, but ceiling means very little when the supporting cast was assembled at a consistent premium. There is no undervalued depth waiting to emerge, no overlooked asset to flip into relevance. Hairydeal paid full price or more for almost everything they have, and what they have is not quite enough.

Dohlenkamp is the kind of team that finishes 9-7 and spends October wondering if that's enough. The receiver corps is genuinely impressive, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Chris Olave at WR11, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 all projected to start, and the draft board backed it up: Olave and Wilson both fell past their ADPs, and Marvin Harrison Jr. came in a full 2.5 rounds late at WR33. That's real drafting. The concern is that the margins elsewhere are thin enough to matter. De'Von Achane at RB6 is a legitimate difference-maker, but the depth behind him, Jonathon Brooks at RB37 and Jacory Croskey-Merritt at RB40, is the kind of depth that works until it doesn't. Patrick Mahomes cost 2.1 rounds of early capital at QB12, a price that squeezes flexibility throughout the roster. Last year's 44 percent win rate and 51st-percentile scoring tell you exactly where this team lives: just competent enough to beat itself with bad luck, not quite built to overcome it.

Dandy Don Flamenco didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it by repeatedly being in the right place at the right moment, collecting six values across the board while keeping reaches to a minimum. The headliner is Bijan Robinson at RB2, a projected starter who anchors the whole operation, but the supporting cast is where this draft quietly earned its grade. Drake London fell half a round past his ADP and lands as a projected WR7 starter. Jameson Williams slipped nearly two full rounds and projects as a WR21 starter, and he stacks with Jared Goff, meaning Detroit's pass volume could pay dividends twice over. Yes, Goff was the one notable overpay at 1.3 rounds early, and Quentin Johnston is the weakest projected starter at WR41, but neither detail undoes what surrounds them. After a rough 2025 that left this manager in the 30th percentile of scoring, the 2026 roster sitting at the 67th percentile feels less like luck and more like a correction that was overdue.

FFootballBrian sits at 78th percentile in the field and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. The steals and values are spread across the roster with quiet consistency: George Pickens fell a full round and a half past his ADP before Brian scooped him at WR10, Travis Kelce slipped more than two rounds to land at TE10, and Nico Collins came off the board nearly a round late to pair with Pickens as a projected WR9 starter. That is the kind of patient, opportunistic drafting that compounds. Then there is Drake Maye, taken a half-round early and worth every bit of it. Maye finished second in MVP voting last season, made modest weapons look dangerous, and now gets AJ Brown added to the mix in New England. The rest of the lineup reads like a clean execution top to bottom, with more values than reaches and almost nothing glaring to criticize. FFootballBrian came to draft, and the board rewarded the discipline.

There was no single thunderclap moment in thomas0611's draft, just round after round of quiet, compounding correctness. CeeDee Lamb fell to pick 2.03 against an ADP of 1.11, a gift that most managers spend the rest of their draft trying to manufacture. Emeka Egbuka arrived a round and a half late at WR18, and Parker Washington slid nearly two full rounds before thomas0611 scooped him at WR35. Stack Egbuka with Baker Mayfield and suddenly that mid-roster tier has actual upside baked in. The one wildcard worth watching is Tucker Kraft, a TE5 projection who was pacing toward 1,000 yards before a November ACL tear interrupted everything. He cleared the preseason PUP list in July and returns to a Packers receiving corps that lost more than it gained this offseason, which means the target environment that briefly made Kraft a star could be right there waiting for him. Two major reaches at the back of the draft are the only blemishes on a ledger that otherwise grades out at the 83rd

percentile, and in the Soda Popinski division, that kind of methodical precision is exactly what earns a seat at the table.

Playboy1966 sits third in the Soda Popinski division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: no flashy gambles, just a steady accumulation of edges. The foundation starts at the top, where Lamar Jackson fell to pick 2.08 despite projecting as QB3, and Puka Nacua slipped to 1.05 with a WR1 projection attached to his name. Those two values alone would make most managers feel good about their day, and Playboy1966 built from there rather than squandering the cushion. The Jackson-Zay Flowers stack gives the roster a bonus layer of upside when Baltimore gets rolling, and DeVonta Smith at WR14, Jayden Reed at WR48, and Carnell Tate at WR29 round out a group of projected starters that keeps the lineup competitive top to bottom. The one area where the roster thins is at tight end, where Kenyon Sadiq projects as a TE21, but in a format this positionless, that is a minor inconvenience rather than a defining flaw. This was a draft that just kept coming out ahead.

Garyleehagar9 sits second in the Soda Popinski division and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is unimpeachable: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 came off the board at 1.06 when his ADP sat at 1.02, a minor slip that Garyleehagar9 was ready to pounce on, and George Kittle fell a full two rounds past his ADP to land at TE9 in the sixth round. Pair Kittle with Sam LaPorta at TE8 and Dallas Goedert at TE15, and this roster carries elite production from positions most managers treat as an afterthought. Rashee Rice adds WR13 value taken a round and a half late, James Cook projects as RB5, and Breece Hall slots in at RB14. The one blemish is Jaylen Wright, reached nearly six and a half rounds ahead of his ADP, though a late-round gamble is far easier to forgive when the rest of the board looks this disciplined. With six values or better across the roster and almost nothing to apologize for, this team came to compete.

cmbruen didn't swing for the fences on some high-risk dart throw. This roster was built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting first in the Soda Popinski division and in the 97th percentile of the field. The centerpiece is a receiver group that keeps delivering: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and A.J. Brown at WR8 were both taken after their ADPs suggested they should have been gone, with Brown sliding all the way from a 2.10 ADP to the 4.02 pick, a gift that rarely goes uncollected by managers paying attention. Trey McBride at TE2 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give the roster an upper-tier presence at a position where most managers are scrambling for scraps. The RB group ranks weakest on paper, but in a positionless format the conversation starts with who your best players are, and McBride, St. Brown, and Brown answer that question convincingly. There were a couple of reaches along the way, but four values and a major steal don't happen by accident. This is a well-constructed team, and first place in the division reflects it.
