Their wide receiver corps, led by Brandon Aiyuk, who was a value pick, and Wan'Dale Robinson, leaves much to be desired, struggling to keep pace with competitors. Questionable draft choices such as reaching early for Jared Goff and Derrick Henry, combined with reliance on J.K. Dobbins as an unlikely starter, have

compounded their troubles. As they try to avoid the cellar, the team must navigate a season where each step feels more like a backward slide.

While the wide receiver corps boasts talent—Malik Nabers and Puka Nacua shine brightly in their positions—this strength is overshadowed by glaring weaknesses elsewhere. Running back concerns loom large with Rachaad White poised as a shaky starter, ranking 43rd in his position, and the team only managing a middling seventh in running back depth. Despite moments of shrewd drafting, like snagging Travis Hunter well after his ADP, their overall strategy faltered with reaches on players like Tank Bigsby, who was taken significantly earlier than necessary. This miscalculation, combined with a lackluster stack bonus from the

Lawrence/Hunter pairing, leaves them languishing at 11th in their division and stuck in the bottom fifth percentile overall. It's shaping up to be a challenging season where fun could indeed be hard to come by.


