There is not much to celebrate in the Missile Command division, and espo25 is squarely at the bottom of that conversation, sitting 12th in the division and in just the 14th percentile of the field. The foundation here is not without merit: CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Jayden Daniels at QB5, and Colston Loveland at TE3 give the roster genuine anchors. The problem is that everything below that top tier falls off a cliff. Travis Etienne projects as RB18, Jadarian Price as RB26, and the depth beyond them reads like a tour of late-round prayer, capped by a Ray Davis pick taken nearly three rounds before his ADP with nothing to show for the aggression. Fourteen chalk picks and zero steals mean espo25 had no margin for error in the draft and used none. Last season's 61 percent win rate looks like a high-water mark that this roster, as currently projected, does not have the firepower to reach again. The lever that might fix this does not appear to exist.

EggsAndBacon enters 2026 sitting 11th in Missile Command and in just the 21st percentile of the field, and the roster offers very little reason for optimism. The draft tells a grim story all by itself: zero steals, zero values, thirteen chalk picks, and a major reach on Jaydon Blue, taken six full rounds before his ADP. That kind of draft capital efficiency sinks teams before a single game is played. The top of the roster is legitimately good, Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 are real anchors, but the supporting cast fades fast, and the projected weakest starter is Jonathon Brooks at RB37, a player whose production depends heavily on things breaking exactly right. Last season ended at a 39 percent win rate and 26th-percentile scoring, and nothing in this offseason's construction suggests the trajectory has changed. EggsAndBacon is not rebuilding toward something, they are just running it back, hoping the math eventually blinks first.

MamaDuck4 sits 10th in the Missile Command division and in the 22nd percentile of the field, and the roster grades out in a way that makes optimism feel genuinely difficult to locate. The TE group is the one legitimate bright spot, with Brock Bowers (TE1), Sam LaPorta (TE8), and Travis Kelce (TE10) all projecting as starters, but in a positionless format that kind of firepower only matters if the rest of the roster can hold up its end, and here is where things get uncomfortable. Baker Mayfield (QB18) is the shakiest foundation: he barely scraped together a QB1 finish in 2025 after a strong 2024, Mike Evans is now gone, and consensus projection has him somewhere short of recapturing that earlier form. The Mayfield/Emeka Egbuka (WR18) stack is a reasonable swing, but it is also the clearest lever on this roster, and it is attached to a quarterback whose arrow is pointing sideways at best. With no draft steals and two major reaches, MamaDuck4 did not build in any margin for error, and the 2026 projections suggest there is none available.

There is not much light at the end of the tunnel for darby016 in 2026. Sitting ninth in the Missile Command division and projecting at just the 25th percentile of the field, the roster grades out as a bottom-tier entry with very little leverage left to exploit. The draft tells most of the story: zero steals, and four major reaches that burned capital on players like Jacoby Brissett (QB28) and Kimani Vidal (RB60), taken 2.1 and 3.3 rounds ahead of their respective ADPs. That is not aggressive roster-building, that is paying a premium for players you could have had for free. The one genuine bright spot is Malik Nabers (WR12), a legitimate top-end talent who fell nearly a full round past his ADP, and Omarion Hampton (RB9) and Trey McBride (TE2) give the lineup a real foundation at the top. But foundations only matter if the house gets built around them, and right now the surrounding pieces, capped by a QB room projecting no better than Brissett at QB28, suggest darby016 is constructing something closer to a shed.

TimRivera finished in the 83rd percentile last season, and the Missile Command division is about to find out whether that was a team or a moment. The backfield is genuinely elite, with Christian McCaffrey, James Cook, Chase Brown, Derrick Henry, Javonte Williams, and Bucky Irving all projecting as starters, and Quinshon Judkins lurking right behind them. That group can carry a roster. The problem is that everything outside it is asking a lot of carrying. The receiver corps tops out at Jalen Coker at WR55, and the quarterback situation is a collection of backup-tier arms, with Daniel Jones as the projected starter at QB25 after TimRivera reached for him nearly two full rounds early. That kind of draft aggression might make sense for a difference-maker, but Jones is not that. The draft overall produced 15 chalk picks, no steals, and two major reaches, which suggests a manager building on reputation rather than market inefficiency. The 2026 projection lands in the 30th percentile. That is not a blip. That is the gap between who TimRivera was and what this roster actually is.

Hope Springs Eternal sits at exactly the percentile you'd expect from a team whose season will be decided by inches rather than miles. The foundation is genuinely exciting: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 paired with Caleb Williams in a live stack gives this roster a ceiling that most middle-of-the-pack teams can't touch, and De'Von Achane at RB6 adds another true difference-maker at the top. But this is a team that asked its draft to carry some weight it couldn't quite support. Chuba Hubbard projects as the weakest starter at RB29, reached nearly two rounds early, and he's the player most likely to be the difference between a winning week and a frustrating one. The 2025 version of this team finished in the 10th percentile of scoring, which demands either a complete philosophical rethink or some real optimism about the bounce-back. There's enough here to be competitive in the Missile Command division, ranked seventh, but Hope Springs Eternal needs Chase and Williams clicking in the same weeks to push above .500 when the margins inevitably tighten.

Blind Squirrel landed at 56th percentile in this tournament, which sounds middling until you look at how they got there. The draft sheet reads like a citation list, three major reaches and two minor ones, and yet the roster that came out the other side is genuinely strong. Josh Allen at QB1 went first overall, technically a reach by ADP but not one that deserves scrutiny, and he anchors a starting group that includes George Pickens at WR10, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, and Jameson Williams at WR21. That is conviction paying off. Where things get interesting is Patrick Mahomes, who came at a discount despite a torn ACL and LCL suffered in the 2025 season. The recovery reports have been encouraging and Mahomes is tracking ahead of schedule, though whether he suits up in Week 1 remains an open question. If he does, this team has QB depth that most rosters cannot match. If he does not, Blind Squirrel still has enough to compete, which is the most you can say about a team that kept reaching and kept being right anyway.

Missile429 didn't chase the room in 2026, they just kept winning individual decisions, and a roster built that way tends to hold up over a long season. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give this team a legitimate foundation at the top, the kind of names that show up in winning lineups week after week. What makes this roster more than just a couple of good picks at the top is how the depth was assembled. Tyler Warren, projected TE4, was still on the board past his ADP at pick 3.12, and AJ Barner fell a full round and a half before Missile429 took him at 14.01. Those aren't flashy moves, but they're the kind of quiet advantages that separate 60th-percentile teams from 70th-percentile ones. Kyle Pitts, coming off a legitimate top-5 finish, slots in as TE7 here even with Atlanta's quarterback situation unresolved, and as long as Pitts plays like he did in 2025, the signal-caller across from him probably doesn't matter much. Fifth in the Missile Command division is a reasonable projection for a team this quietly built, but the scoring upside is there to outrun it.

stiles08 didn't need a single lightning-bolt moment to build something worth watching in Missile Command. The draft reads like a string of quiet competence: fifteen chalk picks, one genuine value in Joe Burrow landing a full round past his ADP at QB4, and a receiving corps that holds up from top to bottom. Burrow pairs with projected starter Tee Higgins, a WR19, giving the stack real teeth before the rest of the depth even matters. Then consider that A.J. Brown at WR8, Davante Adams at WR25, and Rome Odunze at WR30 are all projected starters sitting behind that lead duo in terms of draft capital, not roster viability. Bijan Robinson anchors the backfield as a projected RB2. The one blemish worth mentioning is Jaylen Wright, taken more than five rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as RB68, which is the kind of dart throw that tends to look either visionary or wasteful come October. Everything else here landed close to where it should have, and that consistency put stiles08 in the 69th percentile before the season kicks off.

BigPizza sits third in the Missile Command division and at the 72nd percentile tournament-wide, and the honest question is whether the draft deserved that outcome. The board shows two major reaches and three minor ones, which is not the profile of a manager who trusted the market. And yet the roster looks genuinely good. Chris Olave cost a round more than he should have at pick 2.09, and you can argue about the price, but a projected WR11 sitting in your starting lineup is not a mistake you lose sleep over. The more interesting case is Harold Fannin, who fell to 6.09 despite projecting as a TE6, and BigPizza pounced. Fannin outplayed his veteran teammate in Cleveland last season, the Browns have since moved on from that teammate, and while Deshaun Watson's continued presence at quarterback is its own kind of weather system, Fannin earned that rank the hard way. Pair him with projected starters Rashee Rice and Garrett Wilson and you have a team that reached its way into a lineup worth admiring.

Beer Tent Blitz Package did not win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a single inspired gamble. They won it pick by pick, and the receipts are hard to argue with. Justin Jefferson landing at WR6 when his ADP sat at 1.12 is the kind of gift that resets a draft board, and Beer Tent Blitz Package was simply in the right seat at the right time. From there, the receivers kept coming in waves: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, DeVonta Smith at WR14, Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, all projected starters, all collected without theatrics. Dak Prescott at QB7 steadies the position without demanding the draft capital that quarterbacks at that rank usually command. The one blemish worth noting is Tyquan Thornton, taken four-plus rounds before his ADP, a late-round swing that raises an eyebrow but does not define a roster this well-constructed. The 2025 campaign finished in the 34th percentile, so there is genuine ground to reclaim. At 73rd percentile entering 2026 and second in the Missile Command division, this team has quietly put itself in a position to matter.

RooseveltRR sits atop the Missile Command division and in the 92nd percentile of the field, and the draft record explains why: six values, zero reaches, not a single round where this team blinked. The anchor of the whole operation is the receiver corps, where Puka Nacua comes in as WR1 and Nico Collins follows at WR9, both projected starters, both acquired at chalk prices that suggest the manager simply knew what he had. Drake Maye at QB2 slid a full round past his ADP, and the Stafford-Nacua stack adds a structural bonus on top of already-elite individual projections. Pat Freiermuth was the draft's quietest win, falling 2.2 rounds before RooseveltRR claimed him at TE30. This is a team built the right way: no lottery tickets, no panic reaches, just a manager who identified value, waited, and picked it up. After a 63rd-percentile finish in 2025, the leap to 92nd is not luck. It is the predictable reward for a cleaner draft than almost anyone else in this tournament managed to run.
