Ranked 10th in their division and languishing in the 17th percentile overall, the team faces an uphill battle against formidable odds. Despite boasting a strong quarterback lineup with Josh Allen, Caleb Williams, and C.J. Stroud, the roster is riddled with vulnerabilities, particularly at tight end, where Kyle Pitts's TE17 ranking barely inspires confidence. The wide receivers offer flashes of hope—especially with Nico Collins ranked WR7—but fall short of delivering consistent firepower across the board. Jayden Higgins, at WR52, stands as a stark reminder of the team's depth woes. Further complicating matters, the draft strategy saw several players taken significantly earlier than their average draft positions. Notably, Caleb Williams's selection at 4.09, well ahead of his 6.01 ADP, might have sacrificed critical value that was sorely needed elsewhere. As Carla Gruse heads into the season, the glimmer of promise from their

quarterback stack seems overshadowed by the relentless challenges of climbing out of such a steep competitive hole.


