While the previous season's middling performance offered a glimmer of mediocrity, this year's campaign promises to take them in a more singular direction—straight to the bottom.

As the 2025 fantasy football season approaches, the outlook for team "in" is rather bleak. Despite boasting a relatively strong running back corps with Jahmyr Gibbs and Josh Jacobs, the team's overall composition leaves much to be desired. Currently languishing in 11th place in their division and scraping the bottom of the percentile barrel, it's clear that their prospects are dim. Their wide receiver lineup, headlined by Ladd McConkey but further populated by underwhelming options like Chris Godwin and Rome Odunze, ranks only eighth in the division—a testament to their struggles in the passing game. To make matters worse, the decision to reach on players like Caleb Williams and Zach Ertz has significantly eroded potential value, and with Ertz as a starter at tight end, the weak link's strain begins to show. While there have been a few value picks, such as Bhayshul Tuten and

Dylan Sampson, these bright spots are overshadowed by the team's broader deficiencies. The small stack bonus from rostering Justin Herbert and McConkey provides little solace in the face of what promises to be a challenging season ahead.

As the 2025 season looms on the horizon for Plowking, optimism is in short supply. Despite an average finish last year, this team's prospects seem dimmer as they languish near the bottom of their division and flounder at a dismal percentile in the tournament. The Plowking roster, youthful at an average age of 24.8, appears to lack the experience and depth needed to gain traction. With glaring weaknesses at the tight end position, the team must also contend with the unenviable task of relying on Jayden Higgins, a receiver barely scraping into the top 50, to start. While there were some valuable draft picks like Geno Smith and Zay Flowers, these are overshadowed by costly overreaches, notably selecting Tyler Lockett and Dontayvion Wicks well ahead of their expected

spots. Even with the slight advantage from stacking Justin Jefferson with J.J. McCarthy, it seems unlikely that such a strategy will suffice to propel the team forward. As the dust settles, Plowking's hold on solid mid-tier wide receivers doesn't promise much solace or triumph in what might prove to be another underwhelming season.
