BNFbrian arrives in the Mortal Kombat division projected third in the division and in the bottom three percent of the entire field, and the draft tape does not offer much reason for optimism. The strategy leaned heavily on upside, with four major reaches across the board, including Bhayshul Tuten at RB25 taken more than two rounds early and RJ Harvey at RB28 grabbed similarly ahead of schedule. Those are the kinds of bets that pay off in a great year and quietly sink a roster in an average one. David Montgomery adds another layer of uncertainty, a back who lost his featured role in Detroit and now heads to Houston to fight Woody Marks for carries on a team with its own question marks. Drake Maye and Jayden Daniels give the squad genuine upside at the position that matters most, but the projected starters behind them grade out at average or below, and the weakest link, Kenyon Sadiq at TE21, was a reach to begin with. Coming off a 30th-percentile scoring season in 2025, BNFbrian needed a draft full of answers. This one mostly added more questions.

There is no polite way to frame a 10th-percentile projection and a division rank of 11, so let's not try. qb3qb3 enters 2026 looking like a team that drafted carefully down the middle and ended up with very little to show for it, one major reach setting the tone: Jaylen Warren pulled at pick 8.01 with an ADP of 10.02, a slot that could have addressed something more meaningful. The QB room is the one genuine bright spot, with Lamar Jackson and Jalen Hurts both projecting as starters, but in a positionless format the ceiling on that group only matters if the rest of the roster can keep pace, and it mostly cannot. Harold Fannin slots in as a projected TE6 and carries real upside if Cleveland's offense takes a step forward, but Deshaun Watson is the favorite at quarterback there, which is not exactly a step forward. With Khalil Shakir grading out as the weakest projected starter and the draft yielding almost nothing beyond chalk, qb3qb3 is looking for exits on a highway that has none.

AmyFly enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Mortal Kombat division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster, examined honestly, does not offer much of an argument against either number. The foundation is real: Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) are legitimate top-end talent, and landing both past their ADPs qualifies as genuine draft craftsmanship. But the receiver group never got off the ground, with Terry McLaurin (WR24) leading a group that grades out weak at the position level, and the draft did AmyFly no favors there, including a Cooper Kupp (WR88) taken a staggering 3.5 rounds ahead of his ADP. That kind of reach does not just cost you a player, it costs you the pick that might have fixed something. Last season's 31 percent win rate and 33rd-percentile scoring feel less like bad luck and more like an honest preview of what this roster generates, and nothing about the 2026 construction suggests the story reads differently this time.

There is no spin available for dynastydadmike's 2026 roster, and the draft log explains why. The most damning evidence starts at the top of the board: Garrett Wilson, projected WR17, was taken at pick 3.01 when his ADP sat at 4.07, a reach that cost dynastydadmike positional value before the draft had even found its rhythm. Then came Javonte Williams at 4.12, a full round and a half ahead of consensus on a back projected RB17, which is the kind of optimism that tends to age poorly. The damage was done early, and the late rounds offered no redemption, with Daniel Jones landing at 8.12 despite projecting as a QB25, a reach of nearly two and a half rounds on a player who has no business being a fantasy anchor. The cumulative result is a roster that went 15-21 last season, scored in the 29th percentile, and now sits ninth in the Mortal Kombat division with a tournament outlook in the 25th percentile. dynastydadmike drafted like someone who had conviction about everything and edge on nothing.

TheLandmine drafted like a patient economist and still arrived at a roster that projects 37th percentile, which is the draft equivalent of clipping every coupon in the circular and still leaving the grocery store hungry. The value discipline is genuinely there: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 slid nearly a full round past his ADP at 2.09, Travis Kelce came at a discount despite returning for another season with genuine TE12 upside, and Alvin Kamara fell two and a half rounds before this team scooped him at 18.09. But the discipline broke down at receiver, where Deebo Samuel was grabbed 3.7 rounds early to land a player projecting as WR70, and the position as a whole grades out weak. In a positionless format where the top of the roster is everything, Christian Watson at WR28 and Michael Wilson at WR39 are fine depth pieces masquerading as ceiling. Taylor and Trey McBride can anchor a contender. The players around them right now project to anchor an eighth-place division finish.

BougieSports enters 2026 as the Mortal Kombat division's most frustrating middle child, talented enough to beat anyone on a given week and inconsistent enough to lose to anyone too. The ceiling is real: Josh Allen at QB1 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster genuine top-end pop, and Nico Collins at WR9 arriving as a draft-day value after slipping nearly a full round past his ADP quietly makes that receiver corps one of the better constructed units on the sheet. The concern is what happens below that top layer. The projected starters are fine across the board, but fine doesn't win championships in a field this deep, and a 2025 showing that landed in the 13th percentile of scoring is a reminder that fine can curdle fast when the wrong games go sideways. With 15 chalk picks and only two genuine values on the board, this manager drafted almost exactly what the consensus expected, no surprises in either direction. BougieSports isn't a long shot and isn't a favorite. The margins decide this season, and right now those margins are a coin flip.

After a 2025 season that saw Schnabs13 scrape along in the 20th percentile with just 4,046 points and a 13-23 record, the 2026 roster looks like a genuine course correction. The engine of this rebound is a receiver group anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5), two projected top-five players at their position, with Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Mike Evans (WR27) adding real depth behind them. Lamb is particularly worth noting as a draft win: taken at 2.04 with an ADP closer to a top-five pick in round one, Schnabs13 got legitimate WR5 production at a discount, which is the kind of small edge that compounds over a long season. Omarion Hampton (RB9) and Breece Hall (RB14) give the backfield a credible one-two punch. The question mark is at quarterback, where the ceiling tops out around Tyler Shough (QB20), but in a positionless format, a dominant receiver group can carry a squad past that limitation. This feels less like a rebuild and more like a team that simply got its roster right.

The case for optimism starts at the top: Caleb Williams at QB6 was pulled two picks before his ADP, which looks like a reach until you notice he is stacked with Luther Burden, a projected WR22 starter, giving this roster a live ceiling play baked into the foundation. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors everything, and Chase Brown falling a full round past his ADP to land here as an RB11 starter is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafts from lucky-looking ones. The concern is that three major reaches in a single draft is not a small number, and Eli Stowers at TE32 as the projected weakest starter is the spot where that aggressive approach left the thinnest margin. Still, this team finished in the 86th percentile in scoring last season and sits at a 56th percentile projection now, which feels like a floor being drawn conservatively. The board said reach. The roster keeps disagreeing.

TJCIII didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't gamble on one transformative piece, just drafted a roster that kept winning the transaction. Five values against the board, zero major reaches, and a draft philosophy that looks less like a strategy and more like a reflex. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and Colston Loveland at TE3 gives TJCIII a genuine week-winning advantage at a position where most managers are settling. The most interesting piece in the portfolio is Malik Nabers, a WR12 projection that actually undersells what he is when healthy. After an ACL recovery that had the dynasty world nervous enough to clock his softball game gait on social media, Nabers showed up to training camp looking like himself, and every highlight that comes out of camp will push that WR12 ceiling higher. The math here is straightforward: a manager who drafted without panic, found five players past their ADP, and is currently sitting at the 70th percentile in the field. That tends to go somewhere.

poolmanNY03 sits at 88th percentile in the field and third in the Mortal Kombat division, and the draft sheet that got them there looks like a series of crimes against ADP orthodoxy. Justin Herbert, projected QB8 and a genuine starter, went in the second round when the consensus had him going in the third. Deshaun Watson landed more than five rounds ahead of his ADP. Jack Bech got grabbed nearly four rounds early. Three major reaches, zero steals, and the roster still landed Bijan Robinson at RB2, A.J. Brown at WR8, and a starting trio of tight ends anchored by Kyle Pitts at TE7. That is the whole tension with this team: the reaches look reckless on paper, but the roster looks carefully built in practice. Herbert was a bargain at QB8 regardless of the round, and the values on Pitts and Matthew Stafford suggest poolmanNY03 was not just gambling but was reading the room and acting before the market caught up. Conviction and luck often look identical from the outside. This roster makes a reasonable case for conviction.

ChadScott13 lands in the 90th percentile of the field and second in the Mortal Kombat division, and the draft board tells you exactly why. This was not a roster built on lottery tickets. It was built on finding good players a little later than the market expected, round after round. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 slid nearly a full round past his ADP before ChadScott13 nabbed him at 3.06. Tucker Kraft, projected as the TE5, fell nearly a round and a half and landed at 6.07. Rashee Rice at WR13 came a round and a third late. Jordan Addison at WR43 dropped a round and a half. None of these are flashy heist stories, they are just a manager who consistently took more than he gave up. The one blemish is Kenneth Walker III, reached for almost a full round early, but a projected RB10 starter softens that critique considerably. ChadScott13 did not out-gamble the field. He out-drafted it.

mraladdin23 sits first in the Mortal Kombat division and at the 96th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. The headliner is James Cook, a RB5 projection snagged at 3.08 when his ADP sat at 2.04, a steal that would make any drafter smug for weeks. But the real signature of this roster is not one big score, it is the steady accumulation of value throughout the draft: Justin Jefferson at WR6 sliding to pick 2.05, Tony Pollard falling two and a half rounds past his ADP, Isiah Pacheco taken later than the market wanted. Stack those together and you have a team built the right way, not on luck at the top but on discipline from round two through round eighteen. The starting group reflects it, with Jefferson, DeVonta Smith, and Jaylen Waddle anchoring the skill positions alongside Brock Bowers at TE1 and George Kittle at TE9. The floor here is high, the ceiling is real, and there is almost nothing to argue with.
