There is no charitable read on what Wally Spurlin did in this draft, and the numbers make that case plainly. Five major reaches, zero steals, zero values, and a team sitting dead last in the MutantLeagueFootball division with a third-percentile tournament projection. The reaches were not the opportunistic kind, where you grab someone you love a round early. Spurlin took C.J. Stroud, a QB22, nearly three and a half rounds before market and then somehow doubled down by spending late capital on Michael Penix Jr. at QB33 and Kirk Cousins at QB35, quarterbacks who rank outside the top 30 and were not worth reaching for at any price. The pattern holds at other positions too: Isaac TeSlaa, a WR68, went more than six rounds early, and Cooper Kupp at WR88 followed the same logic into the same ditch. Dallas Goedert stayed in Philadelphia and projects as a legitimate TE15, which is genuinely useful, but one sound pick surrounded by this much draft mismanagement is less a life raft than a single dry sock.

Thomas Karlac's draft reads like a study in self-inflicted damage, and the standings are already confirming it: 11th in the MutantLeagueFootball division and sitting at just the 9th percentile of the field. The fingerprints are everywhere. Karlac spent a second-round pick on Jalen Hurts, a QB9, when Hurts was sitting there a full round later for anyone with patience. Then, apparently unconvinced he had reached enough, Karlac went back to the well for Aaron Rodgers in round 10, a QB29 taken more than three rounds before the board demanded it. That is two quarterback slots consuming real draft capital on players who project as fringe contributors at best. Meanwhile, the receiving corps craters out at Jayden Reed as the projected weakest starter, a WR48, and Jalen Tolbert, a WR102 taken nearly five and a half rounds before his ADP, anchoring the back end of the roster. Josh Allen is genuinely excellent, but one QB1 cannot carry a roster assembled with this much aggressive incorrectness.

There is no painless way to say this: Blockheads are projected to finish 10th in the MutantLeagueFootball division and in the bottom 10 percent of the entire field, and the draft sheet does not offer much comfort. The roster leans on Puka Nacua (WR1) and A.J. Brown (WR8) as its clearest strengths, and both were genuine values at the draft table, but the floor collapses quickly after them. What really stings is the draft capital that went toward players who were not worth the early investment. Jared Goff at QB16 cost a fourth-round pick when he was a sixth-round price, Alec Pierce at WR32 was drafted nearly two and a half rounds ahead of schedule, and Rhamondre Stevenson, the projected weakest starter at RB31, was taken almost two full rounds early. Three major or minor reaches in a draft that needed to nail value at every turn is the kind of mistake a team can absorb once, not three times. Nacua and Brown are real, but they cannot carry a sinking ship alone.

Corner Slice sits at 9th in the MutantLeagueFootball division and in just the 12th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains most of why. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Derrick Henry at RB12 look fine on paper until you notice Henry was taken a full two rounds before his ADP, burning a second-round pick on a player the market valued in the fourth. Jaxson Dart cost a 4.01 pick to land a QB11, which is a price that almost never works out in your favor. Fernando Mendoza, a QB27, went in the 10th round when the field didn't think he was worth a pick until the 13th. Those three reaches alone account for a draft that logged zero steals and three major reaches against nine chalk selections. George Pickens at WR10 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 give the lineup a real floor, but this roster grades out near the bottom of the tournament for a reason, and there is no obvious lever left to pull to change that projection before a single game kicks off.

Pike1212 arrives in 2026 carrying the residue of a strong 2025 campaign, a 78th-percentile scoring season that now feels like a high-water mark rather than a baseline. The draft tells most of the story: two major reaches at quarterback, Cam Ward at QB23 and Tua Tagovailoa at QB31, consumed real capital in rounds six and ten to land a pair of starters who grade out as backups on most contending rosters. Meanwhile, the genuine bright spots, Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, were largely chalk picks, the kind of safe selections that keep a team competitive without gaining any ground. The few places where Pike1212 did outrun the market, Chris Olave, Tetairoa McMillan, and Dalton Kincaid all slipping past their ADPs, are real, but good values at WR11, WR15, and TE11 are not enough to offset a quarterback room that costs too much and delivers too little. Sitting eighth in the division and in the 42nd percentile of the field, this roster has no obvious lever left to pull, just the uncomfortable task of watching better-constructed teams cash in on the mistakes Pike1212 made on draft day.

John Halpin's 2026 roster is the kind that makes you squint at the standings every week trying to figure out exactly where it belongs. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give this team a genuine ceiling, and the wide receiver group as a whole is legitimately strong, but the margins that decide a season like this tend to live in the middle of the lineup, not the top. That's where things get murky. Travis Etienne at RB18 and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 are projected starters you can live with, but Tony Pollard at RB30 is the weakest projected starter on the roster, and a positionless format doesn't let you hide that kind of projection. Halpin drafted with modest efficiency, landing five values against just one major reach, that being Carson Beck at QB40, a six-round reach that will cost him nothing if Beck never sees the field but signals an aggressive late-round bet that didn't come cheap on the board. Seventh in the division at the 44th percentile, this team isn't broken. It just needs everything in the middle to break right.

Gregory Baxter's draft card looks like a series of mistakes, and his roster looks like a success, and the gap between those two facts is the entire Gregory Baxter story. He racked up four major reaches, including a 5.8-round early grab on Michael Mayer and a nearly three-round early pull on Jerry Jeudy, and the board would have told him to stop at almost every turn. Instead he came away with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7 anchoring a genuinely dangerous top end, Jayden Daniels as a QB5 starter, and Breece Hall as the kind of RB14 who carries weeks on his own. The 59th percentile ranking and sixth-place division standing feel a little cool for a team this loaded at the top. The honest answer is that reaching early and often is how you draft badly and win anyway, and Baxter seems to have done exactly that, which means you can call it conviction or call it fortune, but you probably cannot call it a mistake until the standings say otherwise.

Ben Zickel didn't win his draft with one flashy pick. He won it by being right, repeatedly, at the margins. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 give the roster a legitimate top-end foundation, but the real story is how consistently the rest of the board fell Zickel's way. D.J. Moore landed 1.5 rounds after his ADP, Christian Watson came 1.1 rounds late, and Brenton Strange slid a full two rounds past where he was expected to go. Six good values and one steal across a single draft is less luck than it is pattern recognition, and that pattern points toward a team sitting at 64th percentile tournament-wide with real room to climb. Malik Nabers as a projected starter at WR12 gives the lineup a second receiver who can carry a week on his own, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 is the one place Zickel paid early, a minor reach that looks defensible given what the position returns. This roster didn't arrive loudly. It just arrived ready.

The Madden Curse sits at 85th percentile in the field and fourth in the MutantLeagueFootball division, and the draft record explains both: 3 steals, 2 values, and zero major reaches across the whole board. That is a clean sheet. The steals start with Ladd McConkey, a WR20 projection taken at pick 7.04 against an ADP of 4.10, a full two and a half rounds of free equity. Khalil Shakir fell even further, nearly three and a half rounds past his number, and lands as a projected starter at WR51. Those two alone would make most managers happy, and this roster has neither of them anywhere near the top of the depth chart. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Drake Maye at QB2 are the anchors, both projected starters, both acquired at or near fair value. The one honest question mark is Marvin Harrison Jr., a WR33 projection who has not yet matched his enormous early reputation and heads into 2026 with Jacoby Brissett under center in Arizona. For a team this disciplined everywhere else, that is a very small fire to put out.

Chad Christensen did not stumble into an 87th percentile roster. He built it with a surgeon's precision, identifying value where the field left it on the board and converting it into a lineup that projects as one of the cleanest constructions in the MutantLeagueFootball division. The headliners are genuine: Patrick Mahomes at QB12 and Trey McBride at TE2 give Christensen an elite anchor at two premium positions, while James Cook at RB5 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 form a backfield core most managers would mortgage their middle rounds to secure. But the real story is the efficiency underneath. Seven values on a single draft sheet is not luck, it is pattern recognition. Mike Evans landed at WR27 roughly one and a half rounds after his ADP suggested he would, Chris Godwin followed a similar trajectory, and KC Concepcion slid more than two full rounds before Christensen collected him at WR50. The one minor reach in the ledger, Chuba Hubbard, barely registers as a blemish. Third in the division heading into 2026, this roster looks the part.

Frogs land at 88th percentile in the field, and the draft sheet explains why: this was not a team built on one thunderbolt pick but on a consistent pattern of getting more than fair value. Harold Fannin, projected at TE6, came off the board a round and a half after his ADP suggested he would. Michael Pittman, projected at WR44, slid nearly three full rounds past his expected landing spot and ended up a starter anyway. De'Von Achane at RB6, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 give the lineup a ceiling that most managers in this division would trade for, and they arrived without requiring the kind of aggressive overpaying that usually accompanies that tier of talent. Thirteen chalk picks sounds like a passive draft, but when four additional selections qualify as genuine value and your steals include a player who projects as a top-six tight end, chalk starts looking a lot like discipline. Frogs did not outsmart the board on one pick. They just kept beating it, quietly, over and over again.

Craig Plaza sits first in MutantLeagueFootball and in the 97th percentile of the entire field, and the reason is straightforward: the top of this roster is loaded with players who project to matter every single week. Joe Burrow, a QB4, anchors everything, and while his injury history demands an asterisk the size of a billboard, the counterpoint is Caleb Williams sitting at QB6 as a handcuff most managers could only dream of carrying. Beneath that quarterback duo, Rashee Rice, Garrett Wilson, Tee Higgins, and Terry McLaurin all project as starters, and Brock Bowers at TE1 is simply the best at his position. In a positionless format where you start your ten best players regardless of position, accumulating this much projected starter-caliber talent at quarterback, receiver, and tight end is not a quirk of roster construction, it is the entire strategy executed correctly. The Burrow-Higgins stack adds a scoring-correlation bonus on top of everything else. Plaza drafted efficiently to build it, landing Wilson and McLaurin well past their ADPs. The argument for this team writes itself.
