Tad Mackey sits second percentile in the tournament, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. He reached on four players in ways that cannot be explained away by personal conviction or system fit. Matthew Stafford at pick 4.02 with an ADP of 6.02 is a quarterback you can get in round six projected as QB14, not a round-four target. Saquon Barkley went a round early at 2.02, and Kyren Williams followed him off the board nearly two rounds before his ADP, meaning Mackey spent three of his first four picks acquiring players he could have had later. The receiver group feels like the bill coming due: Davante Adams projects as WR25, Marvin Harrison Jr. clocks in at WR33 with two underwhelming seasons and a current quarterback situation in Arizona that is, generously, unsettled, and Makai Lemon at WR40 is the lone steal on this sheet. When your best draft moment is a late-round flyer, and your early rounds were spent overpaying, you do not end up with a good team. Mackey ended up with this one.

Downstairstvk lands at 7th percentile in the tournament field and 11th in the NBAJam(Berry) division, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: four major reaches against a single steal. The reaches were not scattered accidents either, they form a pattern. Justin Herbert, a QB8 projection, was taken 1.4 rounds early. Bo Nix, a QB15, was pulled off the board nearly two rounds ahead of schedule. Josh Jacobs, projected RB16, cost a full two-plus rounds of equity before anyone else was even thinking about him. That is three premium picks burned chasing signal callers and a running back the market had not yet priced. The lone steal, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 falling two full rounds, softens none of it, because the roster around him reflects the cost of those earlier indulgences. Aaron Jones, a projected RB38, is the weakest projected starter on a team that needed every late pick to matter. Most of them did not.

There is something genuinely sad about watching last year's 83rd-percentile team return to the field looking like a 12th-percentile squad, and Jamie Luttrell-Houlihan is living that particular nightmare in 2026. The receiver corps is legitimately excellent, CeeDee Lamb (WR5), DeVonta Smith (WR14), and Tee Higgins (WR19) headlining a group that would make most managers jealous, and Smith's long-awaited moment as a true alpha now that AJ Brown is gone to New England adds a compelling subplot. But the gap between that sparkling top line and what surrounds it is where the pity sets in. The backfield is a procession of mid-tier contributors topped by David Montgomery at RB23, a player Luttrell-Houlihan reached two full rounds early to acquire. Reaching for Montgomery in round six while the receivers were still falling, including Higgins slipping a round past his ADP, suggests a draft that never quite found its rhythm. Last year's results earned a reputation. This roster, sitting tenth in the NBAJam(Berry) division, is the painful reminder that reputations do not carry over.

BMayerCT sits ninth in the NBAJam(Berry) division and in the 13th percentile of the field, and the roster explains exactly why. The receiver group is genuinely good, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and A.J. Brown (WR8), the latter a steal taken nearly two rounds past his ADP. That is the bright spot, and it is mostly surrounded by fog. The backfield grades weak across the board, with Rico Dowdle (RB32) leading a group that bottoms out fast, and none of those names project to move the needle in a positionless format where volume at the top matters more than depth. The draft board compounds the concern: Jared Goff (QB16) was reached nearly three rounds early and projects as the QB16, a steep price for a player who grades out average at his position. Reaching that aggressively on a middling asset while the rest of the roster needed shoring up is the kind of decision that turns a difficult season into a long one, and BMayerCT appears to have no obvious correction left to make.

NoNoNo-ImLevanderWilliams sits eighth in the NBAJam(Berry) division and in the 19th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism about how it got there. The manager spent premium capital chasing quarterbacks, reaching three full rounds early for Kyler Murray (QB19) and two rounds early for Cam Ward (QB23), the team's own weakest projected starter. That is a lot of draft equity burned at a position the format's positionless lineup rules make the least valuable, and there is almost nothing left over to show for it. The RB group is genuinely strong, Jonathan Taylor (RB4), De'Von Achane (RB6), and Derrick Henry (RB12) forming a top-end core that most managers would envy, and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) arriving as the clearest steal of the draft at pick 6.06. But when your most obvious competitive advantage is undermined by a quarterback obsession that ate two early picks without landing a QB1, you are not drafting a winner, you are drafting a rationalization.

Panos Papagiannopoulos is not going to sneak up on anyone in the NBAJam(Berry) division, and he is not going to get pushed around either. The foundation is real: Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Ashton Jeanty (RB7) give this roster a top-end punch that most managers in this field would trade for without blinking, and Terry McLaurin (WR24), acquired 1.3 rounds after his ADP, is the kind of quiet value that separates winning drafts from forgettable ones. The ceiling question is whether the rest of the projected starters can hold up their end. Zay Flowers (WR16) and Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) are serviceable, but RJ Harvey, the weakest projected starter at RB28, is exactly the kind of player who makes a good team look average when things go sideways. Dak Prescott (QB7) steadies the whole operation, though a minor reach on Patrick Mahomes (QB12) as insurance suggests Papagiannopoulos sees the position as worth protecting. Sitting 7th in the division and right at the 50th percentile, this team earns nothing automatically. The margins decide everything.

Jared Ridoutt sits at 54th percentile and sixth in the NBAJam(Berry) division, which means he is exactly the kind of team that decides its own fate through the small stuff. The foundation is real: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Colston Loveland as TE3, and Kyle Pitts as TE7, and Pitts arriving with genuine momentum after 2025 finally silenced the annual "this is his year" chorus matters here because his production now looks durable regardless of who Atlanta trots out at quarterback. Chase Brown at RB11 and Cam Skattebo at RB20 give the starting core legitimate upside. What separates Ridoutt from the teams one tier above him is whether the margins behave. Dalton Kincaid, grabbed 2.8 rounds after his ADP, is the kind of late-round intelligence that quietly wins weeks in October. The roster has no catastrophic liabilities, no transformative edge either, and that is precisely the point. In a tournament decided by fine lines, Ridoutt drafted sharply enough to be dangerous but not so explosively that anything less than clean execution will forgive the difference.

Michael Utke sits 72nd percentile and fourth in the NBAJam(Berry) division, and the draft sheet makes him look reckless getting there. Four major reaches, three minor ones, a manager who kept jumping his spots. But here is the thing: the roster keeps winning the argument. Tucker Kraft, reached 1.6 rounds early, lands as TE5. Baker Mayfield, grabbed 2.2 rounds ahead of schedule, slots in as a QB18 with real upside behind Caleb Williams. And then there is Justin Jefferson, the anchor of the whole operation, a WR6 projection who fell nearly a full round past his ADP and let Utke swoop in at 2.08 like someone left the vault open. The reaches are real, but so is the haul: a projected WR3 in Jaxon Smith-Njigba, Harold Fannin at TE6, Williams at QB6. The board will tell you Utke drafted wrong. The roster will politely disagree. Whether that gap closes on him by October or holds all season is the only question worth asking.

Jeff Russell drafted like someone who had already seen the answers but kept circling the wrong ones anyway, and yet here we are. Five major reaches across the board, and the finished product still lands at the 72nd percentile of the field. The secret is that when the board gifted him George Pickens at WR10 a full round and a half after his ADP, and Trey McBride at TE2 nearly a round late, Russell banked enough surplus value to cover a multitude of sins. Those two alone give this roster a genuine ceiling, and Christian McCaffrey at RB3 makes the floor pretty comfortable too. The reaches that should sting most are the quarterbacks, Tyler Shough and Daniel Jones taken 2.2 and 2.8 rounds early respectively, because Jones projects as the weakest projected starter on the roster at QB25. Russell came into this draft swinging with conviction, or something that looks exactly like it, and the Pickens and McBride windfalls made all the difference between a team that got lucky and a team that looks like it knew what it was doing all along.

Allan Wells drafted like someone who actually did their homework, and the results speak for themselves: 88th percentile in the field, third in the NBAJam(Berry) division, and a roster built almost entirely on patience and process. The foundational piece is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, a genuinely elite anchor that gives Wells a ceiling most managers in this tournament would trade their best pick to have. From there, the value hunting kicks in. Drake London slid half a round past his ADP to land at WR7, Jaylen Waddle fell nearly two rounds to give Wells a WR23 at a discount, and Tyler Warren provides a TE4 floor that quietly elevates the entire roster. The one blemish is Cooper Kupp, taken nearly three rounds early at WR88, but in a draft this disciplined, one reach is a footnote rather than a story. After a 26th-percentile finish in 2025, Wells clearly recalibrated, and this looks like the kind of roster that proves it was the right call.

Judy Vinzant's 2026 SFB entry reads like a clinic in board discipline, the kind of draft you screenshot and send to people who think being early on everyone is a strategy. The foundation is immaculate: Josh Allen at QB1 slid to pick 1.10, Brock Bowers at TE1 fell nearly a full round to 2.03, and Nico Collins at WR9 dropped a round and a half before Vinzant quietly took him at 4.03. That is three of the most valuable positions in the format, all acquired below market. The rest of the draft follows the same pattern, eight players taken at or past their ADP against a single major reach in Josh Downs, which barely registers as a complaint when the top of the roster looks like this. Allen stacks with D.J. Moore for extra ceiling on the days everything clicks. Tony Pollard is the weakest projected starter at RB30, but in a lineup this loaded at the top, that is a feature, not a flaw. Vinzant sits second in the NBAJam(Berry) division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field. This draft earned it.

Matthew Berry did not come to play around. Sitting atop the NBAJam(Berry) division and in the 100th percentile of the entire field, this roster reads like a masterclass in patience and board awareness, the kind of draft that makes other managers stare at their recap screens wondering where it all went wrong. The engine is the Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase stack, a QB4 and WR2 sharing the same huddle, and Berry landed Burrow a full half-round past his ADP. From there, the values cascade: Ladd McConkey at WR20 slid two full rounds, Rashee Rice at WR13 fell nearly a round, and Travis Kelce came off the board a round and a half late at TE10. Rice carries real risk, between the knee procedure, the suspension history, and the reported probation violation, but a healthy Rice at WR13 is a difference-maker, and Berry got him at a discount anyway. Nine chalk picks, seven values, two steals, zero major reaches. That is not luck. That is discipline.
