The Philly Reapers finished 38th percentile in scoring last year and somehow managed to get worse on paper heading into 2026. Sitting dead last in the NFL Blitz division and in just the 7th percentile of the tournament field, this roster has the feel of a house where every room looks fine until you open a door. Joe Burrow at QB4 and Nico Collins at WR9 are legitimately elite, and the Joe Burrow / Tee Higgins stack adds a correlation bonus that most managers would kill for. But after that top shelf, the drop is steep and unforgiving. D'Andre Swift projects as RB24 and Jadarian Price as RB26, which sounds passable until you realize those are the best backs on a roster that grades out near the bottom of the field. The draft offered no relief, producing zero steals and leaning heavily on chalk with four reaches mixed in. There is no hidden upside here waiting to be unlocked, no undervalued piece quietly sitting in a late round. What you see is what you get, and what you get is probably another loss.

There is no graceful way to spin TE University's 2026 outlook, so let's not try. The team sits 11th in the NFL Blitz division and projects in the bottom 10 percent of the entire field, and the draft did little to change that trajectory. The manager reached on Sam LaPorta nearly three full rounds early and burned a top-10 pick on AJ Barner two rounds before the market agreed, leaving the middle of the roster thin on upside. Josh Allen is a genuine asset, and Tyler Warren, George Kittle, and LaPorta give the lineup real firepower at the top end, but a positionless format rewards depth of quality across the whole board, and RJ Harvey projects as the weakest projected starter at RB28. The supporting cast behind Allen fades fast, Rashee Rice and Ladd McConkey are solid but not difference-makers at WR13 and WR20, and the three good-value picks the manager found were largely late-round depth, not impact players. This is a team praying for variance because the baseline offers very little comfort.

schnydes did almost everything right on draft day, and that is precisely what makes this roster so dispiriting to look at. Fifteen chalk picks, two genuine values in Javonte Williams and Tony Pollard both sliding more than a round past their ADPs, and only three minor reaches across the entire board. The discipline was real. The results were not. The projected starters here are a mixed bag that does not resolve into anything cohesive: Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give the roster a legitimate top tier, but the depth behind them flattens out quickly, and Pollard sitting as the weakest projected starter at RB30 tells you exactly where the floor is. Drake Maye at QB2 is an aggressive early investment that could either anchor the whole enterprise or haunt it. A 10-26 record and 18th-percentile scoring in 2025 is the shadow this team is drafting under, and sitting 10th in the NFL Blitz division and in the 20th percentile of the field suggests the math has not improved enough to matter yet.

therealscout ran a patient, disciplined draft, landing Lamar Jackson at QB3 seven picks after his ADP and Brian Robinson at RB45 a full three and a half rounds after the market expected him to go. Thirteen chalk picks, zero major reaches, and a process that would earn a passing grade in any draft theory course. The roster it produced sits ninth in the NFL Blitz division and in the 28th tournament percentile, which is the kind of result that makes you question whether draft efficiency was ever the point. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Jackson anchor the ceiling, but the projected starters thin out fast, and Matthew Golden, the weakest projected starter at WR52, is the player standing between this lineup and genuine contention. The cruel irony is that therealscout did almost nothing wrong on draft day, kept the reaches minor and the values real, and still assembled a team that looks median at best. Being right about process and wrong about outcomes is not a tragedy in fantasy football. It is just a Tuesday.

KyleFFAN won 83 percent of their matches last season and scored in the 94th percentile, which makes this year's 37th percentile projection and eighth-place divisional standing feel like stepping off a cliff. The core tension here is that the roster looks built around upside cases rather than proven production. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are genuinely elite anchors, but the projection lives or dies on DeVonta Smith finally becoming the alpha he has never had the chance to be, now that A.J. Brown is gone from Philadelphia and the target share is theoretically all his. That is a reasonable bet, but reasonable bets do not explain a 94th percentile season, and the rest of the receiver group, headlined by Alec Pierce at WR32 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, offers more question marks than answers. The drafting leaned chalk, with 15 picks at or near consensus value and a major

reach on Jalen Tolbert in round 17. This is a team coasting on last year's reputation while fielding a roster that projects closer to mediocrity.

Legend4Ever88 sits seventh in the NFL Blitz division and barely cracks the 43rd percentile tournament-wide, and the draft did little to change the trajectory. The most glaring sign of trouble is Caleb Williams, a reach taken nearly a full round early at pick 2.07 despite projecting as QB6, a fine number on paper that still represents an overpayment when the rest of the roster needed shoring up. The Williams/Luther Burden stack gives the team something to believe in, with Burden projecting as WR22, but belief only goes so far when Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter at WR47, is what the lineup leans on further down the depth chart. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is genuinely excellent, but one elite piece cannot carry a roster where two of the most notable draft decisions were overpays and the lone identifiable value, Alvin Kamara at RB50, was taken almost two full rounds after his ADP, suggesting the manager was reacting to the board rather than controlling it. There is no obvious lever left to pull here.

Jowens finished 2026 in the exact middle of the field, and that feels about right, because this roster is built to hover. The case for optimism starts with Justin Jefferson, a WR6 who anchors the receiving corps, and Trey McBride, a TE2 who quietly gives this team a genuine edge at a position where most managers are scraping. Pair those with a projected RB11 in Chase Brown and RB12 in Derrick Henry, and the starters are legitimate. The case for doubt, though, lives in the margins. Jordan Love, reached 1.6 rounds early, projects as a QB17 in a positionless format where quarterbacks are already devalued, so that draft capital spent accelerating his arrival stings a little. Rashod Bateman is the louder concern, a six-round reach who projects at WR92. Every team has a few of these, but Jowens drafted 14 chalk picks with no steals, which means the ceiling is mostly baked in already. If Jefferson and McBride outperform their projections, this team climbs. If they don't, there isn't enough margin elsewhere to compensate.

Last year's 5-1-4 Up squad was a disaster, finishing in the 18th percentile with just 4,002 points and a 7-29 record that made every week feel like a formality. The 2026 version looks like a genuine correction. The engine here is Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Jonathan Taylor (RB4), a top-of-the-market pairing that alone changes the ceiling of this roster. Add Breece Hall (RB14), grabbed a full round past his ADP, and the depth behind the two headliners is legitimate rather than cosmetic. The wide receiver group is the one area where the projections cool off, with Xavier Worthy (WR49) slotting in as the weakest projected starter, but Chris Olave (WR11) anchors that group with enough upside to carry the position. Jalen Hurts (QB9) adds another projected starter with real teeth. This is a team that sits at the 59th percentile right now, and given how badly the 2025 version underperformed, there is a reasonable case that the floor has been raised considerably more than that number suggests.

Last year was a disaster. FatBoyBenoy finished with a 7-29 record and scored in the 6th percentile of the entire field, which is the kind of season that makes a manager seriously reconsider their life choices. The 2026 roster looks like a genuine reckoning with that failure. The backfield alone tells the story of a manager who went and got theirs: Omarion Hampton (RB9), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) were all projected starters, and Hampton, Love, and Travis Etienne (RB18) were each taken well past their ADPs, meaning FatBoyBenoy squeezed real value out of the draft board. Up top, Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) are a top-shelf receiving duo that flatly did not exist on last year's roster. Mike Evans (WR27) joins them after signing with the 49ers, adding a proven veteran with something to prove after injuries derailed his historic consecutive 1,000-yard streak. The result is an 80th-percentile projection and a 4th-place division standing. The rebound is real.

Last year FFNemo finished in the bottom 9 percent of the field in scoring, a 6-30 record that left nothing to celebrate. The 2026 roster reads like a formal apology for all of that suffering. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the kind of asset that anchors a contender, and Jayden Daniels at QB5 gives this lineup a legitimate elite-tier option at the most important position on the field. The draft process reinforced the foundation rather than undermining it, with James Cook falling nearly a full round past his ADP at 3.01 and Josh Jacobs similarly slipping to 6.12, two of four values the manager recognized and capitalized on. The major reaches on Brandon Aiyuk and Chimere Dike are real concerns, players taken nearly four rounds before their respective ADPs, and those picks carry risk. But this roster now projects to the 86th percentile of the field and sits third in the division, and that is not a footnote. That is a resurrection. FFNemo was treading water in 2025. In 2026, there is finally something worth swimming toward.

There was no moment in bthayer19's draft where you pump your fist and say "there it is." There was just round after round of sound decisions that quietly added up to something real. De'Von Achane at RB6 slipped nearly a full round past his ADP, and Travis Kelce, still projected as TE10, fell more than a round at a position where top-end value is notoriously scarce. Neither pick was a heist, but both were the kind of edges that separate a good draft from a forgettable one. Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the overall RB1 and anchors the whole operation, while Tucker Kraft at TE5 gives this roster two projected starters at tight end who would headline most other teams. The draft chart confirms the discipline: four value picks, zero major reaches, and a Courtland Sutton reach of just 1.4 rounds that barely registers as a blemish. The 2025 season, a 94th-percentile scoring campaign, suggests this manager knows how to convert a well-built roster into wins. Sitting second in the NFL Blitz division at the 89th tournament percentile, bthayer19 did not force anything. The draft just kept coming out ahead.

yaboyTG sits first in the NFL Blitz division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: 17 chalk picks with zero reaches, two genuine steals, and a roster that looks like someone actually did their homework before draft day. The headliner is the receiver group, where A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Jameson Williams at WR21 form a projected-starter corps that most managers would trade their entire bench to acquire. Then there is the quiet work underneath. Matthew Stafford fell three full rounds past his ADP to land at WR14, and Bhayshul Tuten slipped 2.6 rounds to fill out the backfield alongside Bijan Robinson. Brian Thomas Jr. carries some uncertainty after a difficult 2025 with injuries and inconsistent chemistry with Trevor Lawrence, but at WR31 he projects as a starter, meaning yaboyTG gets that

upside essentially baked into a floor they have already secured elsewhere. Clean roster, clean process, clean record at the top of the division.
