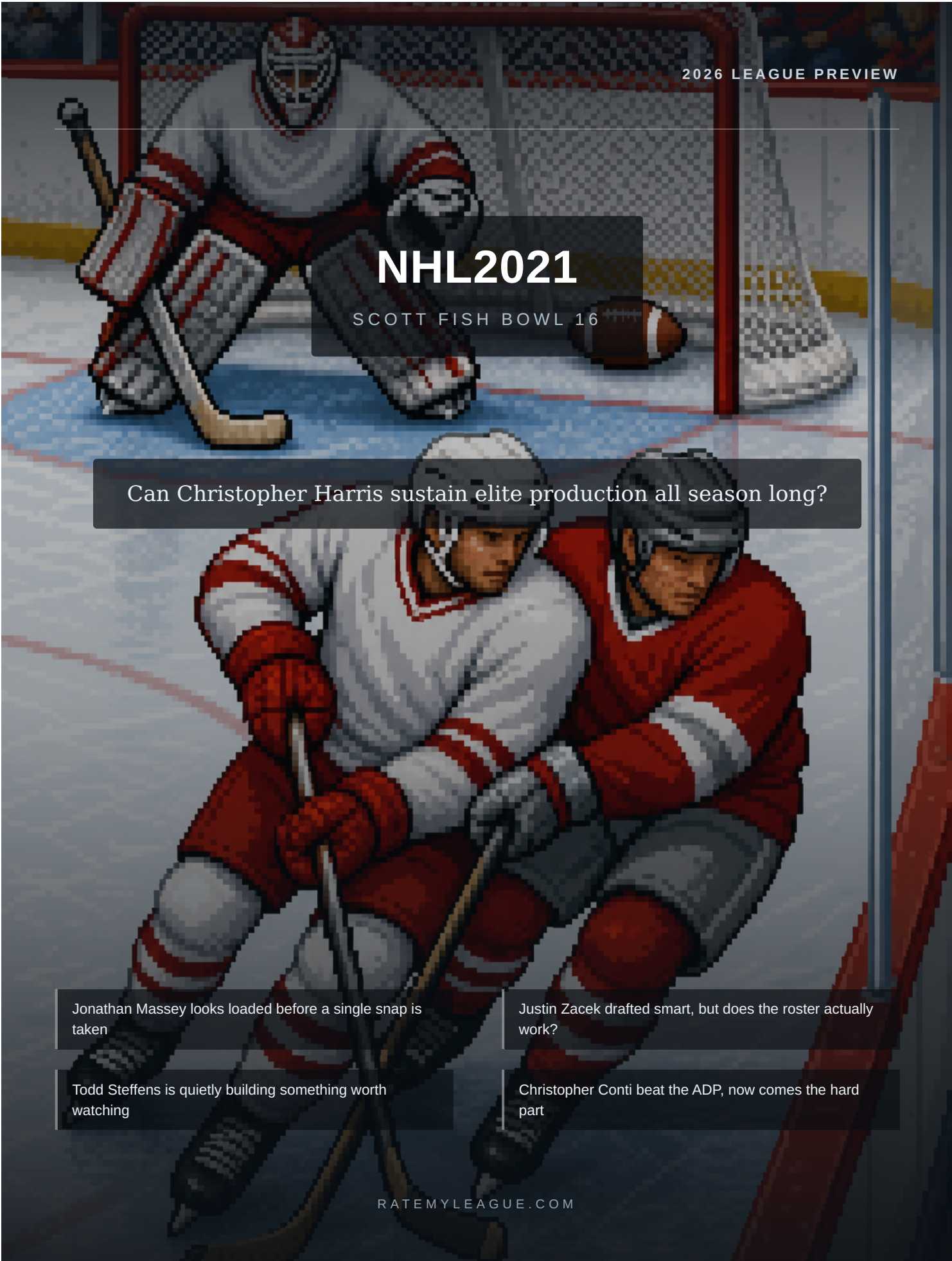

Michael Hughes sits at the bottom of the NHL2021 division standings and, looking at this roster, the math is not hard to follow. The running back group is legitimately strong, with Jonathan Taylor (RB4), Omarion Hampton (RB9), and Derrick Henry (RB12) all projected as starters, but the rest of the roster does not do those names any favors. The quarterback situation is a graveyard of mediocrity: Kyler Murray (QB19), C.J. Stroud (QB22), and Cam Ward (QB23) project as three of the weakest options a manager could field, and Hughes paid a steep price for Stroud specifically, reaching 3.2 rounds past his ADP to land a QB22. That is the kind of draft capital that should buy a difference-maker, and it did not. The tight end group offers nothing above TE23, the receiver depth fades fast after Malik Nabers (WR12), and with no obvious upgrade path on the horizon, Hughes looks like a manager hoping the floor holds rather than one with a ceiling to chase.

Greg Newman enters 2026 sitting 11th in his division and in just the 4th percentile of the field, and the roster offers very little reason for optimism. The foundation looks promising enough on the surface, with Kenneth Walker III projecting as RB10 and Brock Bowers locking in as TE1, but the supporting cast thins out quickly from there. The real problem is that Newman reached aggressively through the draft and came away with diminishing returns, pulling Kyren Williams nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP only to land a RB15, and taking Matthew Stafford almost two and a half rounds early for a QB14. Those are reaches that needed to hit big to justify themselves, and neither did. Meanwhile, the receiver group grades weak across the board, with Michael Pittman projecting as the WR44 in the starting lineup. Brock Purdy's situation compounds the anxiety, as the San Francisco weapons corps is a rotating injury report with no clear resolution. Newman is not without talent, but he is running out of angles, and the calendar is not waiting.

Justin Zacek did almost everything right on draft day. He waited on Joe Burrow, taking him at 1.08 when ADP said 2.05 was the going rate, and somehow parlayed that mild overpay into a QB4 anchor. He grabbed Caleb Williams at a discount, let Jayden Reed fall nearly two rounds before scooping him at WR48, and closed the draft with Jalen Nailor dropping more than three rounds into his lap. Thirteen chalk picks and a handful of genuine values, almost nothing paid above market. And yet here sits a team projected 10th in the division, hovering around the 5th percentile of the field, with Saquon Barkley as the jewel and DeVonta Smith as the best receiver at WR14. The math just refuses to cooperate. Barkley at RB8 is real, Burrow is real, but the supporting cast thins fast enough that by the time you reach Reed and Michael Wilson among the projected starters, the floor starts showing through. Getting value at each pick and still landing here is the specific kind of outcome that makes you question everything you thought you knew about draft strategy.

Jared Lewis sits ninth in NHL2021 and down in the 10th percentile of the field, and the draft board explains exactly why. The defining move was taking Josh Jacobs at 3.05, a full 2.6 rounds before his ADP, in a positionless format where burning premium capital on a RB16 projection is a choice that demands justification and offers none. Then came Zach Charbonnet at 9.05, nearly five rounds ahead of consensus, and Kayshon Boutte at 12.08, five rounds early, both moves that stripped Lewis of the mid-round flexibility where drafts are actually won. The receiver group that resulted, topped by Chris Godwin at WR38 and Khalil Shakir at WR51, is the direct tax on those reaches. Travis Kelce returned for 2026 hoping to reclaim a top-12 TE conversation, but at TE10 he is the headliner on a roster built around good intentions and bad timing, and Jared Lewis is projected to finish exactly where someone who burned four rounds of draft equity on guesswork deserves to finish.

Christopher Conti did almost everything right at the draft table. He grabbed Jordan Addison two full rounds after consensus, snagged Carnell Tate and Wan'Dale Robinson well past their ADPs, and finished the draft with four values against only one major reach. That is a genuinely disciplined approach, and it has produced a team sitting eighth in the division and in the 24th percentile of the field, which is the kind of result that makes a manager stare at his spreadsheets wondering what he missed. The answer is probably at the top. James Cook projects as RB5 and Drake Maye checks in as QB2, so the ceiling exists, but the projected starters after Cook fall off quickly, with Addison slotting in as WR43 and Brenton Strange at TE17 rounding out a lineup where depth was acquired at a discount because the market correctly sensed it was depth. Conti found value where value was available. The problem is that buying things cheaply only helps when the things themselves are worth buying.

Dan Machon sits seventh in NHL2021 and ranks in just the 34th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. Six major reaches litter the board, headlined by Aaron Rodgers at QB29 taken nearly four rounds early and Daniel Jones at QB25 burned three rounds before his market price. Those are not calculated gambles on upside, they are sunk costs at a position that grades out weak regardless. The rest of the roster is kept afloat largely by a strong group of tight ends, with Trey McBride at TE2, Kyle Pitts at TE7, and George Kittle at TE9 all projecting as starters, but the format is positionless and that depth only goes so far when the broader roster sits at average or below. J.K. Dobbins projects as the weakest starter at RB36, a reflection of a draft where Machon consistently outbid himself for players the market had already priced correctly. There is no obvious trade chip to flip, no late-round steal to dream on, and not much runway to climb.

Tyler Albers sits at 36th percentile and sixth in the division, which is exactly the kind of positioning that makes a season feel like it could tip either way. The most telling draft decisions cut in opposite directions: reaching 2.2 rounds early on Trevor Lawrence at QB10 is a bet that paid off in player quality but cost real draft capital, while Garrett Wilson falling nearly three full rounds to pick 7.04 is the kind of windfall that quietly props up a whole roster. Wilson projects as WR17, a genuine starter, and getting him at that discount is the margin that could matter come November. On the other side, Travis Etienne taken 1.8 rounds ahead of his ADP raises questions about whether the board got squeezed in the middle rounds where depth is built. Jahmyr Gibbs as the projected RB1 gives Albers a weekly anchor, but Tony Pollard projecting as RB30 as the weakest projected starter is a real ceiling on how much damage this roster can absorb when things go sideways.

Threat Level Midnight didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it the way good teams usually do, by being right more often than they were wrong. The foundation starts at the top: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 are both projected starters, and both came in ahead of where the market expected them to land. Lamb in particular fell 1.2 rounds past his ADP, which at that range of the draft is genuine found money. Add Colston Loveland at TE3 dropping all the way to 5.02 when consensus had him going in the second round, and you have a team whose best players cost less than they should have. The depth follows the same pattern. Luther Burden at WR22 and Breece Hall at RB14 fill out a starting group that sits at the 84th percentile of the field. The three major reaches are real and worth watching, but when your mistakes are Lamar Jackson and Chase Brown, the math still tends to work out in your favor.

Bob Wojton did not need a signature moment to build a contender. He just kept winning the small battles, and the result is a roster sitting at the 91st percentile of the field. The foundation is a receiver corps that would make most managers envious: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Nico Collins at WR9 are all projected starters, and that is before Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 even enter the conversation. Brown's move to New England is worth noting here, because pairing his talent with Drake Maye, coming off an MVP runner-up season, gives him a credible path to outperforming that WR8 projection. Then there is Mike Evans, the draft's clearest value on this roster, taken at pick 9.03 against an ADP of 6.09 and projecting as a WR27 starter. Wojton did not swing for the fences and miss. He drafted within himself, collected where the board gave him something, and quietly assembled one of the better rosters in the tournament.

Jonathan Massey is sitting at 94th percentile and third in the division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. Where most managers are paying full price and hoping for the best, Massey collected four outright steals and six additional values across his roster, building a lineup that projects to be genuinely difficult to beat on any given week. The wide receiver group anchors everything: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7 are both projected starters, and London came at a discount of more than a round past his ADP. Jaylen Waddle, snagged 2.3 rounds late, quietly may be the most interesting piece here, a WR23 who escaped Miami's dysfunction and lands in Denver behind Bo Nix, who led the league in pass attempts, with a real offense finally supporting him. Tucker Kraft is the one genuine reach at TE5, but when your floor is a top-five tight end and your ceiling includes Smith-Njigba and a stack of Jordan Love to Christian Watson, you can afford one concession. Massey drafted like someone who knew exactly what he was doing, because he did.

Todd Steffens didn't win his draft with one flashy move. He won it by consistently being in the right place. The centerpiece is a receiver group that reads like a fever dream: Puka Nacua at WR1, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, and Justin Jefferson at WR6, all projected starters, all acquired at or below their draft-day value. Nacua went sixth overall while St. Brown and Jefferson both slid well past their ADPs, the kind of patient accumulation that separates sharp drafters from lucky ones. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 adds a layer of intrigue, a former standout still working through questions about his connection with Trevor Lawrence after a rough 2025 campaign, but even if Thomas underdelivers, the cupboard behind him is stacked. The Jared Goff and St. Brown stack layers in another dimension of upside. There were reaches, Goff and Kirk Cousins both came early, but in a positionless format, the surplus at the top of this roster makes the bumps downstream easy to absorb. Second in the division, 99th percentile in the field. The draft earned that.

Christopher Harris didn't just build a good team in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl, he built a team where the argument starts and ends at the top. Josh Allen at QB1, De'Von Achane at RB6, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster a summit that most managers in the field simply cannot match, and the draft story behind it makes the whole thing more impressive. Harris landed Warren a full 1.7 rounds after his ADP and got Rashee Rice, a WR13, sliding nearly three rounds past his market price. That's not luck, that's a manager reading a room. The positionless format means all that elite talent gets deployed together, so the RB depth behind Achane and Jeanty only adds to a lineup that already projects as a problem for everyone else. Harris finished 13th percentile in scoring in 2025, which makes a division-leading, 99th-percentile projection feel like a correction rather than a fluke. The talent was always there. Now the roster has caught up to it.
