There is no version of this draft that flatters cardnl1b, and the numbers confirm it sitting dead last in the Mario Party division and in the 4th percentile of the entire field. The reach on Ashton Jeanty at 1.10 is defensible in isolation, a fraction of a round before consensus, but the pattern that follows is not defensible at all. Jakobi Meyers, a WR45, came off the board two full rounds early at pick 8.03, and Dontayvion Wicks, a WR96, was grabbed 3.5 rounds ahead of his ADP in round 18. That is not opportunistic drafting, that is a manager chasing names on a board that had already moved on. The lone bright spot is Joe Burrow at QB4, a genuine asset in a positionless format where his ceiling matters enormously, but one elite passer cannot carry a roster built on chalk picks and aggressive misses. The Scott Fish Bowl rewards sharp drafting, and cardnl1b produced zero steals across the entire roster. Weary optimism would dress this up. This is not that.

Loafinit is a team built on the faith that correlation cashes, and the whole enterprise hinges on two stacks carrying the weight. Dak Prescott paired with George Pickens as a WR10 is the kind of bet that looks either brilliant or embarrassing in hindsight, with very little middle ground. The more interesting pairing, though, is Kyler Murray stacked with Justin Jefferson, because that one comes loaded with asterisks beyond the roster notation. Jefferson spent last season grinding through a miserable fit with JJ McCarthy, and the working theory here is that Murray's arrival in Minnesota restores him to something close to his WR6 projection. If that theory is wrong, the stack collapses and so does this roster's ceiling. Loafinit sits 11th in the Mario Party division and in the bottom 10 percent of the field, which tells you the tournament doesn't share the manager's optimism. The math isn't complicated: two stacks, two quarterbacks, one question about whether Murray and Jefferson find the chemistry that Jefferson and McCarthy never did. The answer decides everything.

Heading into 2026, christopherterry0 sits 10th in the Mario Party division and at just the 29th tournament percentile, and the draft didn't do much to change the trajectory. The roster foundation is genuinely impressive in places: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Derrick Henry at RB12 give this team a backfield that most managers would envy, and Tyler Warren at TE4 provides real upside at a position where elite production is scarce. But this is a positionless format, and when the time comes to fill out a starting lineup, christopherterry0 is handing the ball to Malik Willis as the projected QB24, a problem made worse by the fact that Willis was a minor reach, taken a round and a half before his ADP suggested he'd be available. The rest of the draft was almost entirely chalk, with no steals and five total reaches, including Mike Evans taken nearly two rounds early. Robinson and Warren are worth celebrating, but they can't carry a roster this top-heavy toward the bottom, and there is no obvious move left to fix it.

SplashOfCoke did almost everything right on draft day. Trey McBride at TE2 was sitting there at 2.01 when his ADP was late in the first round. Jeremiyah Love fell a round and a half into lap five. Even Cam Ward came at a discount. Thirteen chalk picks, three values, one steal, and yet the roster lands in the 35th percentile, ninth in the Mario Party division. That is the draft's cruelest trick: rewarding patience with a team that simply does not add up. The problem is not process, it is ceiling. Jonathan Taylor projects as RB4, McBride as TE2, and that sounds like a foundation, but the supporting cast never rises to meet them. Ladd McConkey checks in at WR20, and then the receiver group effectively ends. Meanwhile, Brock Purdy was taken almost two rounds before his ADP suggested anyone needed to move on him, and Dylan Sampson was grabbed three rounds early on a hunch that has not yet paid off in projection. Good values, wrong players, same result.

Babajoshuwa did almost everything right at the draft table. The ADP discipline was real: zero major reaches, and pickups like J.K. Dobbins at RB36 and Michael Wilson at WR39 both came after their average draft positions. The problem is that disciplined drafting rewarded this team with a receiver corps so top-heavy it crowds out every other conversation. Jaxon Smith-Njigba, Drake London, DeVonta Smith, and Emeka Egbuka all project as starters, and that collection is genuinely impressive, but the depth behind it trails off to WR94 Jack Bech, and the projected weakest starter is Jordan Addison at WR43. Meanwhile, Travis Kelce projects as TE10, which is fine, and the quarterback situation is Tyler Shough at QB20 with J.J. McCarthy sitting at QB37. That is a ceiling problem that no amount of receiver depth can paper over. A 41st-percentile projection and a division rank of eighth suggest the market priced this roster correctly even when Babajoshuwa was beating it pick by pick, which is the kind of irony that makes fantasy football genuinely cruel.

Star Stealers sits at 44th percentile after a rough 2026 campaign, and the roster reads exactly like that number feels: good enough to beat you on the right week, beatable enough to lose when it matters. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 is the clearest thing this team has going for it, a legitimate top-end piece that can carry a week. Around him, the floor holds reasonably well, with Zay Flowers at WR16 and the Lamar Jackson stack giving the lineup a ceiling spike when Baltimore is cooking. But the margins get uncomfortable fast. Wan'Dale Robinson projects as the WR47 and the weakest projected starter on this roster, and one bad week from a fringe piece has a way of deciding a close season. Isaiah Likely, now in New York following John Harbaugh and stepping into a light tight end room, is the kind of speculative upside that could quietly shift the calculus, or quietly disappear. Last year's 36 percent win rate is a warning. Nothing about this roster guarantees a different answer.

ajhayslip didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. This roster was built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 60th percentile with real upside baked in. The foundation is legitimately impressive: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the Mario Party division would envy. Then comes the quiet craftsmanship. Omarion Hampton fell a full round past his ADP and landed at pick 4.04, giving ajhayslip an RB9 projection at a discount. Jordan Love at QB17 came even cheaper, sliding more than two full rounds past his expected value. Neither pick required a reach or a gamble, just patience and a willingness to let the board come to them. The one legitimate question mark is Brian Thomas Jr., whose 2025 was derailed by injuries and a murky connection with Trevor Lawrence. But at WR31 projected, that is a concern, not a crisis. This team did not overpay anywhere, and that discipline tends to compound.

Dont Wake My Wiggler didn't build this roster on one splashy pick. They built it the way you actually win fantasy football leagues, by being right more often than wrong across 20-plus selections. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the anchor, a genuine top-of-the-market asset who sets the ceiling high from the jump. Layer in Tee Higgins at WR19, Jameson Williams at WR21, and Colston Loveland at TE3, and you have a core that most managers in the Mario Party division would gladly swap for. Caleb Williams, a minor reach at QB6, hooks up with Loveland in a stack that gives this team a weekly points-correlation bonus other rosters can't replicate. The draft itself was almost aggressively reasonable, 16 chalk picks against just one major reach, Skyler Bell taken nearly eight rounds ahead of consensus. That one stumble barely dents the balance sheet. Sitting 68th percentile across the field and fifth in division, Wiggler isn't in first place yet, but the foundation is sound enough that catching up feels less like hope and more like math.

Tight Ends & Tequila didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster, just a steady hand and a sharp eye for where the board was sleeping. The wide receiver group anchors everything, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and A.J. Brown (WR8) giving the lineup a ceiling most managers in the Mario Party division can only envy, and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Davante Adams (WR25) extending that quality deep enough that Michael Pittman (WR44) is the projected weakest starter. Three values drove the construction: Kyren Williams fell a full round and a half before this team grabbed him at RB15, Jordyn Tyson slid a round to land at WR34, and the Stafford-Adams stack adds a layer of upside to what was already a disciplined build. Justin Herbert brings a credible QB8 projection with Mike McDaniel now running the offense in Los Angeles, though the Chargers' ball-control tendencies keep his ceiling honest. Fourth in the division and 79th percentile tournament-wide, Tight Ends & Tequila earned that standing the quiet way, by simply winning more picks than they lost.

Baby Piranhas landed at 83rd percentile and third in the division not by swinging for the fences on one transcendent pick but by consistently drafting from a position of quiet advantage. The foundation is Jahmyr Gibbs, a projected RB1, paired with Drake Maye, a projected QB2 whom the manager pulled at pick 2.09 after the board let him slip nearly a full round past his ADP. That is the throughline of this draft: patience rewarded. Chase Brown came off the board a round late and slots in as a projected RB11 starter, and Quinshon Judkins fell a full round to fill out what is already a formidable group of backs. There are no lottery tickets here propping up the floor, just a manager who recognized when the market misevaluated a player and acted without flinching. The wide receiver group projects as the weakest link, but in a positionless format, the depth elsewhere buries that concern quickly. Baby Piranhas look like a team that read the room and quietly won it.

kingswish34 didn't try to be clever. They just kept winning the pick. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 falling half a round past his ADP in the second round is the kind of quiet fortune that compounds, and Travis Etienne slipping more than a full round to RB18 is the same story told twice. Add Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Brock Bowers at TE1, and the foundation of this roster wasn't assembled through ingenuity so much as discipline, showing up at every pick and taking the best available. The Malik Nabers situation is the one place where kingswish34 needs the football gods to cooperate. Nabers at WR12 is already discounted against where he stood before his ACL tear, and if his training camp form is any indication, that number is only going to climb back toward where his talent actually belongs. Stack him with Jaxson Dart and suddenly this team's ceiling gets genuinely uncomfortable to think about. An 85th percentile projection and second in the Mario Party division. Consistent does not have to mean boring.

Today Im Feeling - Bees! sits first in the Mario Party division and at the 87th percentile of the entire field, and the draft tells you exactly why. This roster was not built on luck, it was built on discipline. Josh Allen at QB1 anchors everything, and the ground game runs deep with James Cook (RB5), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), and Breece Hall (RB14) all projecting as starters. But the cleaner story is what this manager did in the middle and late rounds. Javonte Williams landed a full round after his ADP. Chris Olave slid nearly a round and landed as WR11. AJ Barner fell nearly three rounds and gives the team legitimate upside at tight end. Out of 21 drafted players, three were clear values and Barner qualifies as a steal. The one legitimate question is Parker Washington, whose role in Jacksonville feels more like a pleasant surprise than a locked-in reality, but as a flex-level contributor he does not need to be anything more. This is what a clean Scott Fish Bowl draft looks like.
