ElvinRyan did not draft so much as panic-shop at full retail price. Five major reaches across the board tell the whole story: Lamar Jackson pulled at 1.07 when the board had him sitting comfortably past pick 2.03, Patrick Mahomes got grabbed at 3.07 despite an ADP closer to the fifth round, and Sam LaPorta and T.J. Hockenson were both yanked well ahead of schedule in a draft where patience costs nothing. The result is a roster that hemorrhaged draft capital reaching for players who would have been there anyway, leaving the receiving corps propped up by Xavier Worthy as the weakest projected starter and Brian Thomas Jr. as a supposed anchor whose 2025 campaign was derailed by injuries and a quietly deteriorating connection with Trevor Lawrence. Zero steals, zero values, twenty picks and nothing to show for the negotiation. ElvinRyan finished 94th percentile last season, which makes this rebuild-by-overpay even harder to explain. The Mario Division has them ranked last, and the draft sheet offers no compelling argument against that verdict.

There is no polite way to frame where kimberlyd1313 stands heading into 2026. Sitting 11th in the Mario Division and projecting at just the 19th percentile of the field, this roster is not a work in progress so much as a finished product that simply did not come together. The draft tells most of the story. Across 20 picks, the board returned zero steals and just one value, with the lone bright spot being Davante Adams sliding to WR25 a round and a half late. Against that, two major reaches loom: Rhamondre Stevenson, hauled in nearly three rounds early and projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB31, and Sean Tucker, a four-round overpay on a player projecting at RB65. The headliners, Drake Maye at QB2 and Jayden Daniels at QB5, are genuinely elite, but in a positionless format you need depth behind the top names to carry weeks when things go sideways, and the back of this roster is thin air. Last season's 9th-percentile scoring output was not a fluke, and nothing here argues convincingly that 2026 will read differently.

jma1271 played this draft almost exactly the way you are supposed to play it. Fifteen picks at chalk, two genuine values, a steal in C.J. Stroud falling more than two full rounds to the back of Round 11, and not a single major reach on the board. The process was sound. The roster is still sitting tenth in the Mario Division and projected at just the 29th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question everything you thought you knew about draft theory. The top of the receiver group is genuinely elite, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Malik Nabers at WR12 if that knee holds, which remains a real if. But the talent thins out quickly below that tier, and the quarterback situation built around Murray and Stroud offers little margin for error. jma1271 did not make bad decisions. The market just handed back an ugly receipt anyway, and there is almost nothing more demoralizing than that.

LacesOut13 sits ninth in the Mario Division and at the 35th tournament percentile, which is a polite way of saying the floor is visible and the ceiling is not much higher. The roster's best assets are real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Justin Jefferson at WR6, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team a genuine top tier. The problem is that everything behind those names gets thin in a hurry, and the draft did almost nothing to help. Of the team's two major reaches, Bo Nix at QB15 stands out as the most damaging, a second-round commitment to a quarterback that cost meaningful draft capital and left the position projecting weak regardless. The Bo Nix/Jaylen Waddle stack offers some theoretical upside, since Waddle moving to Denver's more functional offense is a real improvement over Miami's dysfunction, but you need Nix to hold up his end of that bargain. He went two rounds early precisely

because managers believe he will. LacesOut13 is betting the house on a quarterback who still has to prove he deserves the price.

Randyb1981 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Mario Division and projecting at just the 41st percentile of the field, and the draft log does not offer much hope that a hidden edge is buried somewhere in the roster. Of the 19 picks logged, 15 came in at chalk and two qualified as outright major reaches, including Dallas Goedert taken 2.2 rounds early and Jalen Hurts burned in the second round at a cost of a full round over his ADP. The Hurts-Goedert stack is a real thing, a connection that can pop off in any given week, but leaning on a QB9 and a TE15 as the tent poles of your tournament run is not exactly a power move. The receiver group is where this roster actually breathes: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Nico Collins sits at WR9, and Tee Higgins adds WR19 depth. That trio is legitimately good. The problem is that below those weapons the rest of the projected starters grade out as middling at best, and randyb1981 does not appear to have a lever left to pull to change that math.

Brentmartin sits at the 49th percentile, and that number tells the whole story: close enough to contend, far enough from the top to sweat every matchup. The foundation is genuinely strong, with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 giving this roster a ceiling that can beat anyone on a given week. But the margins that decide a season at this level are rarely found at the top of a depth chart, and that is where the concern lives. The draft leaned heavily on chalk with four major reaches, including Brian Robinson pulled nearly four rounds early and Mike Washington Jr. taken more than four rounds ahead of his ADP, bets that need to hit to keep the middle of the roster functional. A 39 percent win rate in 2025 says this roster has underperformed its talent before, and the wide receiver group, led by Zay Flowers at WR16, thins out quickly after that. Robinson and Jeanty can carry weeks, but in the Mario Division, seventh place is where rosters go when the top holds and the margins do not.

Popetastic isn't going to make headlines for any single blockbuster move, but this roster was assembled the way you win at chess: quietly, efficiently, and without ever really blinking. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 anchors the top of the lineup, and Chris Olave and Rashee Rice project as WR11 and WR13 respectively, a pairing that gives this team a genuine ceiling. Rice is the variable worth watching closely. Between a recent procedure to clean up his knee and the well-documented off-field situation that once again threatens his availability, Taylor's partner in Rice is as much a wildcard as he is a weapon, but if he suits up and stays healthy, that WR13 projection is the floor, not the ceiling. Trey McBride at TE2 quietly does the work of a top-shelf asset without demanding any of the drama. The draft itself was almost studiously undramatic, 19 chalk picks and one value in Fernando Mendoza, but the players popetastic landed with those chalk picks are exactly why this team sits comfortably in the 60th percentile and belongs in the conversation going forward.

cmoneymitz didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. The whole board just kept going right. The headliner is Harold Fannin, a TE6 who slipped more than two full rounds past his ADP before cmoneymitz quietly scooped him at 7.05, a steal by any measure. Pair that with Kyle Pitts at TE7, and the tight end room alone could carry weeks when other positions go cold. At quarterback, Josh Allen at QB1 is exactly the kind of foundation a manager builds around, and the Justin Herbert / Ladd McConkey stack gives cmoneymitz a built-in multiplier on big Herbert games. Drake London checking in at WR7 rounds out a starting core that is legitimately difficult to fade. The 2025 campaign already showed this manager knows how to translate a good roster into production, finishing in the 67th percentile in scoring on a 61 percent win rate. Sitting 69th percentile entering 2026, cmoneymitz isn't a dark horse so much as a team that was simply drafted well and knows it.

Shea84 lands at third in the division and the 75th percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: no lottery tickets, just a consistent ability to come out ahead on value. James Cook at RB5 slipped to pick 2.09 when his ADP was 2.04, a small gap but a win nonetheless. Tetairoa McMillan fell a full round past his ADP before Shea84 took him at WR15, and Jameson Williams tumbled nearly two rounds before getting scooped at WR21. Stack those three values together and you have a starting corps that was assembled below market rate, which is how good drafts actually get built. Brock Bowers at TE1 anchors the whole thing with the kind of positional advantage that makes every weekly decision a little easier. The two major reaches, Daniel Jones and Christian Kirk, leave some marks, but they come late enough in the draft that the damage is contained. This roster did not happen by accident.

longlivebobbar did not win the draft with one thunderbolt swing. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session: not by landing one massive pot, but by consistently getting out with more chips than they put in. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the entire enterprise, and a starting core that adds A.J. Brown at WR8 and George Pickens at WR10 means the top of this roster commands genuine respect. The draft craft showed up in the middle rounds, where Carnell Tate, Jordyn Tyson, and Michael Wilson all landed past their ADPs, quietly stacking value that other managers left on the board. The Jordan Love and Christian Watson stack gives the team a connected upside floor if San Francisco's offense keeps humming. The two major reaches on MarShawn Lloyd and Jaydon Blue are fair targets for skeptics, but those are late-round bets, not early-round mistakes. A team sitting at 75th percentile in the field, backed by last year's 94th-percentile scoring performance, is not asking anyone to trust a vision. It is showing receipts.

Scott Smith's 4for4 squad sits second in the Mario Division and clears the 85th tournament percentile, and the draft record explains exactly why: no flashy home runs, just a relentless pattern of getting good players slightly cheaper than the market demanded. Dak Prescott at QB7 slid nearly a full round past his ADP and lands squarely in the starting lineup. Dalton Kincaid fell almost two rounds before Smith grabbed him, and a TE11 projection at that kind of discount is the sort of quiet win that compounds over a season. Luther Burden drifting past his ADP by more than a round before getting scooped at WR22 is more of the same, a draft operating with patience rather than panic. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 anchors the whole group and needs no discount to justify his presence. The two major reaches on Brandon Aiyuk and Elic Ayomanor represent real costs, but they arrive late enough in the draft that they trim the ceiling without threatening the floor. This roster was built the quiet way, which tends to be the right way.

NickGevious didn't need a single lightning-bolt moment to build one of the Mario Division's best rosters. The process was quieter than that and more reliable. Six values against the board, twelve chalk picks, and just one major reach across the entire draft tells you something about how this team was assembled: pick after pick came out ahead or at worst broke even. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 fell four spots past his ADP before NickGevious took him at 1.06, and Colston Loveland dropped nearly a full round before landing at TE3, where he profiles as a genuine difference-maker. Caleb Williams at QB6 fell more than a round and anchors a stack with Loveland that gives this team a built-in scoring connection. Tuck in Isaiah Likely, now moving to a light tight end room under John Harbaugh in New York, as a savvy late addition, and the picture sharpens further. Division rank first, 98th percentile in the field, built pick by careful pick. That is not luck. That is process.
