There is no sugarcoating the situation in the Double Dragon: JeccDog69420 sits 12th in the division and in just the 12th percentile of the entire field, and the roster does not hide why. The single biggest problem is the draft capital spent at quarterback. Jaxson Dart, the projected QB11, was yanked off the board at pick 2.12, a full 2.5 rounds before his ADP, burning premium real estate on a player whose ceiling still feels more theoretical than proven. That decision compressed the rest of the build before it started. There are pieces worth rooting for, Luther Burden chief among them. After a quietly expanding role late in 2025 and a head coach now openly comparing him to Amon-Ra St. Brown, Burden enters 2026 as one of the more compelling boom candidates on any roster. But Burden is a gamble on liftoff, not a foundation, and five minor reaches scattered across the draft suggest a manager who was consistently chasing rather than waiting. When your floor depends on a hype train actually arriving on time, the schedule looks long.

Ja'Marr Chase is real, Nico Collins is real, and Garrett Wilson is real, and yet here bucksdrummer sits at 21st percentile, ranked 11th in the Double Dragon division, which tells you everything about what happens when the supporting cast collapses. The running back situation is the loudest alarm: RJ Harvey, buried in a Denver backfield that already had JK Dobbins last season and just added Jonah Coleman in the draft, is trending toward irrelevance as a projected RB28, while Kyle Monangai grades out as the weakest projected starter on the entire roster at RB33. That duo is the floor, and it is not a high one. The draft did not offer much relief either, with a major reach on Matthew Golden at WR52, taken nearly five rounds before consensus, as the most aggressive swing bucksdrummer took all draft. Chase can carry a lot, but he cannot carry everything. This roster has the look of a team that peaked on paper in round two and spent the rest of the draft hoping something miraculous would fill the gaps.

Last year, GridironGreek went 28-8, scored in the 91st percentile, and looked like a team that had figured something out. This year, the 23rd percentile projection and a last-place division ranking suggest the answer sheet has been lost. The quarterback situation is the clearest symptom of the fall: Jordan Love checks in at QB17, Sam Darnold at QB21, and Tua Tagovailoa at QB31, a group that would have been the punchline of a 91st-percentile team's draft recap, not the spine of one. George Pickens and Rashee Rice give the roster legitimate upside, and Trey McBride at TE2 is a genuine anchor, but the Love and Tucker Kraft stack has to carry more weight than a QB17 typically should. The draft did not help the cause, producing one value, seven chalk picks, and a Deebo Samuel reach so aggressive it consumed five rounds of capital for a WR70 projection. The gap between what GridironGreek was and what this roster projects to be is not a slump. It looks more like a different team wearing a familiar name.

There is no easy way to dress this up: johnz is looking at a 25th-percentile roster and a ninth-place division standing before a single snap has been played in 2026. The good news, such as it is, starts and ends at the top. Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are genuine difference-makers, and if this team has a path forward it runs entirely through those two. The problem is what surrounds them. The receiver group is the soft underbelly of the whole operation, with Ladd McConkey projecting as WR20 and Jordan Addison as the projected weakest starter at WR43, a player johnz actually had to reach for slightly after Addison slipped past his ADP. Nine chalk picks and zero steals in the draft suggest a manager who followed the board closely and came away with exactly what the board thought he deserved. After a middling 2025, 53 percent wins and 42nd-percentile scoring, there is no obvious lever left to pull here. Jackson and Taylor will have to carry an enormous amount of weight.

Moriega played a clean draft by the numbers, nine chalk picks, a handful of legitimate values, and only one move that qualifies as a genuine overpay, taking A.J. Brown at 2.01 when the market had him closer to 2.10. That is a minor sin. The problem is that when you tally everything up, the roster lands at 37th percentile and seventh in the Double Dragon division, which is the kind of outcome that makes a disciplined drafter stare at their laptop wondering what went wrong. The top of the roster is real: Drake Maye and Brown are stacked together, Jeremiyah Love projects as RB13, and Jameson Williams at WR21 was taken a full round late, a genuine bargain. But the floor drops fast. Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter, is now in Tennessee battling for targets after the Titans used the fourth overall pick on Carnell Tate. Moriega did almost everything right and still built a middle-of-the-pack team, which is less a draft failure than a reminder that value hunting cannot conjure talent that simply is not there.

AgentBuch is sitting at 36th percentile and eighth in the Double Dragon division, and the roster does not offer many reasons for optimism. The headliner is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, which is a genuine ace, but after Gibbs the projected starters grade out as a collection of mid-tier contributors, with DeVonta Smith at WR14 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 representing the next best options. The draft did not do much to improve the outlook: nine chalk picks, three minor reaches, and a major reach on Evan Engram at pick 14.07 when his ADP sat nearly three and a half rounds later at TE36. Spending late capital on a TE36 projection is the kind of decision that haunts you in a competitive field. The one flicker of competence was landing C.J. Stroud a round and a half after his ADP, but Stroud grades out at QB22 and that is not the kind of saving grace that moves the needle. Without a significant projection jump from someone in the middle of this roster, AgentBuch is likely watching the bracket from the outside.

naztea's case for a deep run in the Double Dragon comes down to one simple truth: when your best players are this good, the rest of the roster is almost a footnote. Josh Allen at QB1 is the kind of anchor that makes every week feel manageable, and pairing him with De'Von Achane (RB6) and Tyler Warren (TE4) means naztea has legitimate top-tier production locked in at three different spots. That's not luck, that's a roster built around a real philosophy. The draft did its part, too. Achane fell nearly a full round past his ADP and naztea was there to take him at 3.03, a quietly significant get at that range. Warren was a minor reach at half a round early, but when a TE4 projection is on the board, you don't wait around hoping. The honest caveat is that naztea currently sits sixth in the division at the 44th percentile, which means the rest of the field sees something to quibble with here. Whether the elite talent at the top translates into enough consistent scoring to climb is still very much an open question.

Moot Points did not try to win the draft in one pick. They just kept coming out ahead, and that quiet consistency is why they land at the 66th percentile heading into 2026. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the clearest example: a projected starter sitting at the top of his position, drafted without drama, exactly the kind of anchor that makes a roster feel stable before the season even starts. The Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack adds connective tissue, linking two projected starters whose production tends to travel together. The one real question mark is Josh Jacobs, projected RB16 and currently sitting in an off-field situation that has more unresolved threads than answers. If Jacobs is available and productive, this roster looks even cleaner. If not, Chuba Hubbard, the weakest projected starter at RB29, absorbs more responsibility than anyone here would prefer. But one cloudy projection does not undo a draft built on patience and repeat advantages. Moot Points belongs in the conversation in the Double Dragon division.

FFTechy finished 2025 at the 94th percentile and then came back to the 2026 draft and did something quietly admirable: built an even better roster without once getting cute about it, at least not successfully cute. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 form the kind of top-end receiving core that wins tournaments outright, and the Jefferson situation is worth watching closely, because if Kyler Murray actually unlocks what McCarthy buried, that WR6 projection starts to look conservative. Those two were taken at chalk prices, which is fine, but here is where the story gets interesting: Zach Charbonnet was pulled two full rounds early and De'Zhaun Stribling nearly three, conventional signs of a manager reaching into the void. And yet the overall roster landed at the 73rd percentile, sitting fourth in the Double Dragon division, with Jared Goff stacking neatly against both St. Brown and Sam LaPorta for weekly upside. FFTechy did not draft efficiently. They drafted correctly. The difference between those two things is exactly what draft grades always miss.

jakegrossman0 didn't build this roster with one audacious swing. He built it the way a good poker player builds a stack, one well-played hand at a time. The clearest example is Patrick Mahomes, a QB12 projection who fell two full rounds past his ADP and landed quietly at 7.08. That is the kind of patient opportunism that separates competent drafters from great ones. Pair Mahomes with Trevor Lawrence, who parlayed a quietly confusing 2025 season into genuine QB1 territory, and the position is covered from two directions. Then consider that Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3, Malik Nabers as WR12, and Colston Loveland as TE3, all projected starters, all acquired without a single major reach across the entire draft. Thirteen chalk picks and one genuine steal, and yet the roster landed in the 80th percentile of the field and third in the Double Dragon division. That is what sustained good judgment looks like: no single headline moment, just a draft that kept coming out ahead.

Last year, CoachEsser finished in the sixth percentile in scoring and went 8-28, which is not a rough patch so much as a crater. The 2026 roster reads like a direct and deliberate response to that suffering. The foundation is a backfield that would make any manager envious, anchored by Bijan Robinson (RB2), James Cook (RB5), and Saquon Barkley (RB8), three projected starters who collectively represent the kind of ground-level production that keeps a team in games even when the rest of the world conspires against it. The receiving corps gets a genuine lift from Jaylen Waddle (WR23), who escapes Miami's dysfunction and lands in Denver, where Bo Nix threw the ball at a historic rate last season and the offense is suddenly worth trusting. Add Justin Herbert (QB8) drafted at real value, and the picture is clear: CoachEsser did not tinker around the edges. This team now sits second in the Double Dragon division and in the 84th percentile of the field, and the distance between there and last year's basement is the whole story.

ELstuff did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on one transformative pick. They built it by winning small, over and over, until the wins added up to something impressive. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 was there for the taking, and they took him. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 fell to 2.04 despite an ADP of 1.11, and ELstuff was ready. Dak Prescott came off the board a full round after his ADP suggested he would, landing the Prescott-Lamb stack at a combined discount that quietly tilts the roster's ceiling upward. Behind those headline names, the depth is genuinely alarming for opponents: Omarion Hampton at RB9, Breece Hall at RB14, and Travis Etienne at RB18 give this team reserves that most managers would start without hesitation. The one honest question mark is Dalton Kincaid, whose knee has been a recurring concern and whose Bills GM has not yet cleared him for 2026. If Kincaid contributes, ELstuff looks even better. If not, this roster is strong enough to absorb it. Division-leading and sitting in the 90th percentile of the field, the case for ELstuff is not a leap of faith. It is arithmetic.
